replaced. However, he is not prepared to make a contribution towards them as no rent is being paid on the	
premises and he has already contributed towards village amenities through 106 payments on a recent	
development. He suggested an alternative to aluminium doors might be to cover the existing doors with steel.	
Mr Povah reported that he has received various quotations for steel doors, aluminium doors and composite	
doors. He felt that covering the doors in steel would not be a long term solution. Mr Calcraft has obtained a	LP/RC
verbal quotation for oak doors, fitted for around half the price of the aluminium doors. Mr Calcraft & Mr	
Povah will liaise, obtain a firm quotation and report back at next meeting.
