# Recent Achievements – in the Past Year

- Repairs to the well-used BMX track
- Providing an Air Ambulance night landing site (with grateful thanks to all those providing financial support)
- Free First Aid course; Demonstration of the defibrillator at July Village Fete
- Clearing St Margaret's Brook
- Two Parish Councillors joining the Blackdown Healthy Living & Activity Centre trustees
- Appointing a maintenance person, getting spraying qualifications and spraying footpaths, cleaning road signs, cutting back vegetation, tidying shrubs in the car park, keeping War Memorial tidy, clearing river bank, clearing drains, clearing snow & ice, spreading salt, weeding public areas, cleaning the floodbridge, removing ivy from bridges
- Installing a sign at Hemyock Turbary
- Finalising purchase of the village car park in order to secure its future
- Making a new pedestrian entrance at the corner of the car park
- Two Parish Newsletters distributed throughout the parish
- Providing the Tennis Club with a lease, enabling them to seek a grant for new floodlights

### Longmead

The Parish Council owns the Longmead Pavilion and sports facilities. The facilities are managed by the Longmead Management Group which has representatives from all the clubs and groups who use the sports, play and leisure facilities, and representatives of Longmead's neighbours. In addition to its state-of-the-art pavilion where a personal trainer provides coaching sessions Longmead includes two football pitches, three floodlit tennis courts (leased by Hemyock Tennis Club), a boules pitch and a floodlit multi-use games area used for netball, five-a-side soccer and other sports. There is also a children's play area, the BMX track and the perimeter of the field provides an interesting wildlife walk.

The tennis club has three club sessions per week, three teams playing in local leagues and regular coaching for juniors. Courts are also available for hire by non-members, booking at the SPAR shop.

Bants Ladies Netball Club training sessions are held at Hemyock Longmead MUGA on Wednesday evenings from 7.30pm to 8:30pm. All ages and abilities are very welcome

All the facilities are available for private parties.

This excellent and well-used facility is celebrating its tenth anniversary on the evening of Friday 15th June 2018 — everyone is welcome to join in the celebrations. BBQ and bar will be available.
