Looking to the Future

I thought Easter was early last year – and it's even earlier this year – 27th March. This means that the season of Lent, which is the six weeks leading up to Easter – which is traditionally a time of reflection and abstinence in preparation for the celebration of Christ's Resurrection - begins very soon on Ash Wednesday, 10th. February.

It is also a time for study and learning in the Church, and this year, we will again have a series of Lent Study Groups open to all, focussing our thoughts on the Ten Commandments. (Please find details of the course and groups in our churches).

Jesus' summary of the Ten Commandments, was that we should First love God with all our being, and secondly, love our neighbours as ourselves. We will have a chance to explore more about what this means in our groups.

But this summary of Jesus is a sound basis for our Christian living, and representatives from all our parishes have used this as the basis of our Mission Action Plan which will be presented to our churches at the end of January.

In the Anglican Diocese of Exeter all parishes have been grouped into Mission Communities. Our Mission Community is comprised of the three parishes of Hemyock with Culm Davy, Clayhidon and Culmstock. And we are called to work and co-operate in the best interests of the mission of the Church in our area. Each Mission Community is called to produce a Mission Action Plan to outline how this co-operation might be worked out in the local context. This comprises of a Mission Statement (see right) together with a plan of how we might implement our aims. Copies of these will be available in each of our churches.

The Church of England, like most other churches, is facing many challenges today. You may have read of falling numbers, fewer clergy and diminishing resources - financial and human. This is not the same across the country – and I think our churches, in some respects, do not reflect the degree of crisis elsewhere – but life does not get easier, and we need to plan and prepare for the future, seeking to find ways which draw us more closely into the will of God and respond with a deep desire to see his Church grow and flourish.

Our Mission Action Plan (MAP) is designed to help us do that – and our Mission Statement focuses us first on God – so we need to attend to that which builds us up as his disciples – prayer, worship and fellowship, in order that we are better able to do what we are called to do - serve others as Christ calls us to do

This is an on-going work, and members of our churches will need, with prayer and reflection, constantly to review, change and update our plan as things move forward and develop.

May God bless us all as we venture into this New Year, and enable us to be open to all that he might teach us.

Dear Residents

This month we have to produce a budget, and budgets are getting more difficult every year, Central Government keep cutting our grant, 40% of our funding comes from Government and the 60% comes mainly from our Council Tax and business rates. There was a time when Government used to give us 70%, how things have changed.

To set a balance budget for 2016/17 Devon will need to make savings of over £34million, this is on top of the savings we have made in the last 5 years. The National Living Wage will cost Devon in the region of £7 million in 2016/17 rising to £ 19million by 2019/20. The changes to Nation Insurance have added over £2 million to our costs. This has not been a good settlement for Devon County Council specifically or Shire Counties in general. The scale of the reductions is unprecedented.

For Devon County Council this means that in 2016/17 Government funding will reduce from £179.8 million in 2015/16 to £151.6 million in 2016/17. This is a reduction of £28.2 million, nearly 15.7%. In 2016/17 some specific grants have been included in the funding base of £151.6 million. If these are excluded to give a more accurate, like for like comparison, then the reduction is 17.4% for Devon compared with an average of 16.6% for the Shire Counties.

The Rural Services for sparse authorities will help Devon cover the service in rural areas. The grant is £18million in 2016/17. The 2% Social Care Precept is also very welcome and could raise in the region of £6.5million for Devon Social Care Service. Devon's reserves are very low compared to some other Authorities. In a recent comparison of County Councils Devon ranked 22nd out of 27 authorities.

Devon County Council tough choices consultation end of last year showed the three top community priorities were; Supporting vulnerable individuals and families to prevent neglect and harm; Appropriate community support and care for older people; Maintaining major road network. The three lowest were Supporting home to school transport; Supporting healthy life styles; and Supporting Devon's cultural heritage. Not altogether a healthy situation, because I think we may have to increase the Council tax by 2% to make ends meet, the next month will become more clearer.

Elmes at Culm Davy showed the degrees of frost between 27th Jan – 1st Feb varied between 12 and 21. The river Culm at Hemyock Station froze over from bank to bank a distance of approx. 14 yards. On Friday station staff watched an otter for several minutes searching the river for fish which recently would have been hard to find".

Thankfully my parents, sister and I were still living in Cornwall at the time but a number of relatives were in the village. Hopefully we will not see weather like this during 2016!

History Group Report

We were entertained by two very good speakers at the Church Rooms in December and January. Denis Dodd who was part of the team involved locally in renovating the Grand Western Canal boat lift, presented the history of the Canal during a period of great industrial advances. The proposed route from Bridgwater to Exeter would have saved cargo ships the hazardous route round Lands End. The completed section did allow welsh coal unloaded at Bridgwater to fuel the factories in Taunton, Wellington and Tiverton. The added complication of having to lift boats up and over the illustrious tree lined carriageway to the front door of the Sanfords estate at Nynhead did not help the budget.

James Bradnock, an English and Theology teacher gave a fascinating discourse on the creation of one of the greatest books in the English language, the King James Bible. Created by a team of learned men over a period of 7 years when Shakespeare was the popular entertainment of the day, it has given us many memorable phrases.

The language of the previous Bishop's Bible translated in 1602 includes the following verses with the King James version for comparison:

God is my shepherd therefore I can lack nothing.

The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want.

He will cause me to repose myself in pasture full of grass and he will lead me unto calm waters.

He maketh me to lie down in green pastures; He leadeth me beside the still waters.

Truly felicitie and mercie shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the house of God for a long time.

Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life; and I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever.

The next two speakers on February 11th and March 10th will be Peter Fisher on a Hemyock man who served in the Great War and Colin Spackman on the visit of the Duke of Wellington to this area in 1919.

A busy programme of live gigs and film nights is lined up for Clayhidon Parish Hall in February, March and April.

By popular demand the Thunderbridge Bluegrass Band returns to Clayhidon on Friday 5 February, bringing the rip-roaring sounds of bluegrass music to the wilds of the Culm valley.

Back in business again after a long break, the band uses one microphone, four instruments and four voices which blend to make a highly traditional yet thoroughly original sound. They promise "honest all-acoustic music featuring fiddle, banjo, guitar and double bass. Some classics, some covers, and some self-penned, there is something for everyone."

Monthly Film Nights in Clayhidon have proved a great success since their introduction in October. There have been three so far and another three corkers are lined up for 2016, starting on Friday 12 February with The Martian (certificate 12A).

Matt Damon plays a NASA botanist stranded on Mars, providing terrific entertainment in Ridley Scott's best film in years. One reviewer said it was "an enthralling and rigorously realistic outer-space survival story", more like speculative fiction and science fact than science fiction.

Other events in the Clayhidon programme include:

Wednesday 9 March – Jim Causley, a brilliant Devonborn folk singer, who has been nominated five times in the BBC2 Folk awards. He is passionate about traditional West Country song.

A reviewer in Mojo magazine called him the finest male folk singer of his generation. Another called him "a rising star possessed of a resonant and evocative voice". His show is a mixture of traditional West Country music, some of his own songs and others based on the poems of his famous relative, the Cornish poet Charles Causley. This is a Villages in Action event.

Friday 11 March – Everest (certificate 12A) A starstudded cast recreates the 1996 Everest disaster in a tense drama with awesome cinematography. The Daily Mail said it was "heart stopping. Everest's majesty – and cruelty – is superbly evoked." With Keira Knightley, Sam Worthington and Jake Gyllenhaal.

Friday 8 April - The Dressmaker (certificate 12A). Kate Winslet, hell bent on revenge and armed with only a sewing machine, excels in this sizzling black comedy. The Times called it "idiosyncratically brilliant".

Wednesday 13 April – Dallahan. An Irish folk band like no other. Mark Radcliffe, of BBC Radio 2 has called them "some of the most exciting trad musicians to emerge in recent years."

Since launching the band in December 2013, these award winning individuals have exploded onto the traditional music scene. Their unique arrangements of original music and traditional Irish tunes and songs have secured their presence at such prestigious international events as Milwaukee Irish Festival in the USA, Copenhagen Irish Festival and Celtic Connections. This is a Villages in Action event.

Horrible Histories: What Life in Clayhidon was Really Like

Clayhidon, now seen as a rural idyll, was once a place of extreme poverty, of great inequality and cruel injustice.

Pamela Reynolds' new book, Clayhidon – a Devon Parish in the Nineteenth Century is an everyday story of country folk. But forget Ambridge, this is more shocking than East Enders. These were absolutely not the good old days.

This is human interest history, not about kings and queens but about farmers and pub landlords and starving labourers and tramps, their struggling wives

and illiterate children, of magistrates and murderers, of clergymen and drunken peasants.

One census showed 845 people living here – 30 farmers, many of them called Blackmore, it seems, 89 agricultural labourers, 82 servants – and only one "gentleman". There were four blacksmiths and carpenters, two thatchers, seven shoemakers, three butchers, two shopkeepers, a charcoal burner and although there must have been numerous innkeepers only one admitted it to the census takers.

This book is crammed with detail. Local readers will recognise many of the names – the Redwoods and Hutchings and Sparks are here, and the houses and farms and lanes where occasionally dramatic and sometimes terrible things happened are still recognisable.

This is the product of four years' research not only in the parish and county records, but in personal diaries and books about transport, farming and emigration. And all this reading has enabled her to put the local stories into a wider context. Much of the highly colourful and readable material, by the way, has come from local newspapers.

There aren't many dates in this book, but there are countless stories of ordinary people, told with an acute eye for the kind of details that make a reader sit up and say "wow!". The News of the World used to boast that, "all human life is here". We can apply the slogan to this book, much of which is heart-rending.

Here we find Betty, starved to death in bed with the only food in the house a tiny piece of hard bread. We read of gory accidents involving overturned wagons, runaway carts and, women and boys catching their clothes in machinery. You can see why we need Health and Safety regulations. Some things haven't changed. They were complaining about the state of Clayhidon's roads 130 years ago and they are still a source of aggro between the county council and the parish.

The parish was viewed from outside as a wild and lawless place. It had its own policeman, who was variously shot at, attacked with a hand saw and punched by drunks. There was an infamous murder - William Blackmore beaten and robbed by George Sparks, described in the book in fascinating detail, including the fact that the judge wept with grief as he sentenced Sparks to be hanged.

There was another suspicious death, written off as manslaughter at the time but which some jurymen

thought should have been murder. The victim was a wandering umbrella repairer, fatally beaten in front of his young daughter at the Merry Harriers by two youths, who convinced the court it was self-defence.

It wasn't all robbery and violence. Clayhidon's policeman spent much of his time investigating petty thefts committed by the desperately poor – a pair of scissors, food and fence posts for firewood. The punishments were wildly inconsistent – sometimes lenient, sometimes extremely cruel.

For stealing four fowls Henry Webber was sentenced to 15 years transportation. That was in 1847. In the same year James Baker got 14 years transportation for a similar offence. Could he have been any relation to the late Mike Baker, to whom the book is dedicated and whose family roots are not far from Clayhidon?

Mike, a former BBC Education Correspondent, died three years ago. Three pounds from every copy sold – the surplus after the printer's costs have been paid – will go to the Mike Baker Memorial Fund at the Villiers Park Educational Trust in Cambridge. Its mission is to inspire under-achieving children from underprivileged backgrounds to succeed.

Famous Namesake Takes Over Merry Harriers

A famous footballer's namesake is bringing EX appeal to an ancient Devon pub. Wesley Sniejder, new landlord of the Merry Harriers, Clayhidon can't match the £2m a year Dutch superstar for riches or footballing genius, but he is almost certainly a better cook. Wesley – usually known as Wayne to avoid confusion – is buying as much of his produce as possible from the EX postcode area and other parts of Devon.

Since buying the lease from Reg and Lesley Payne, he has replaced St. Austell ales and other imports with locally brewed Otter ales and Bollhayes cider. His game meat comes from local farms, much of his other meat from Wallace's, just down the road, and fish arrives daily from Brixham.

Born and bred in Kent, Wayne, now 43, started cooking when he was ten because it was the only way he could be sure of a good meal, with his Dutch mum wheelchair-bound and his dad away working.

He started his catering business when he was 15, while still learning his cooking skills with Trusthouse Forte. When he moved to the West Country he renamed the business On the Level, but continued to develop his skills in places like the Headland Hotel, Newquay, the Farmers Arms, West Hatch and the Bell Inn, Curry Mallet.

Since arriving at the Merry Harriers he has introduced The Great British Lunch, with traditional British dishes, and given the evening menu a more international flavour. Gluten free and vegetarian dishes have become an important part of the inn's offer.

"We are trying to bring the pub back to its glory days," he said, "We are listening to the customers and they are saying they want it to be more of a pub again and less of a restaurant."

Wayne is now running On The Level as a successful weddings and events caterer from the Merry Harriers. He also has another business, which is attracting fleets of new customers in exotic vehicles. His ownership of the Brake Horsepower Club enables him to welcome vintage car rallies from all over the south of England. The newly extended car park has been filling with lovingly maintained old Jaguars, Ferraris and Saabs. Wayne admits his love of vintage vehicles has got out of hand. He owns 14 cars – including a Lotus 503 and "an absolutely evil Escort Cosworth". You can bet the other Wesley Sniejder doesn't have one of those.

Way back in the early 1970's the Rev Tony Grosse produced the first copies of our Parish Pump, then as now 6 copies a year.

Each person was faced with a double stack of 500 sheets of foolscap. The Rector sat at the end of the table and for around 2.5 – 3hours put each issue together with a long armed stapler. Prior to Tony's retirement in 1996 the late Tim Goodman took on the role of assembling the Pump as well as delivering and collecting from Malthouse and then distributing to the folk who delivered to their neighbours.

So the years roll on. The village population increases, the Parish Pump changes from the original A5 to A4 as more and more news items and adverts are received. Throughout this, and for around the last 15 years or so, our magazine has been under the editorial control of Hilary Clements ably assisted by her husband Matthew. Hilary has worked incredibly

hard to ensure that the information sent to her of past and future events, details of church services, council meetings and other organisations are collated and included in the appropriate issue – any errors have very seldom been hers!

A few years ago the Parish Pump was entered in a national competition for parish magazines from churches and councils (some with paid staff) and thanks to Hilary's expertise it come 21st out of over 700 entries! She has worked exceptionally hard to ensure we all receive our copy of the Pump, and in her and Matt's personal life as well as having full time jobs two beautiful daughters have become part of their family... and never a deadline for the magazine missed!

Due to work commitments Hilary now feels the time has come to relinquish the role of Editor and this will be taken over by James Winrow whom we are pleased to welcome.

The words 'Thank you' hardly seems sufficient to express the gratitude Hemyock, Clayhidon and latterly Culmstock owe Hilary but this is what we most warmly and gratefully say and send her and her family all good wishes and much happiness and success for the future.






