PARISH PUMP - No. 257 October - November 2016

Carpe Diem

"Season of mists and mellow fruitfulness..."

We are all familiar with the poet Keats' description of Autumn. And we, too, are able, still, to look out on a misty October morning and see the fruitfulness of nature at this harvest time.

As well as the vegetables and fruit from our farms and gardens, we are aware of hedgerows with berries red and berries black, of the feasting of birds and beasts with the instinctive knowledge that all this all this bounty, in a few weeks, will be gone. It is the case, that for them at least, they should seize the moment – for if they don't they will starve through the dark coldness of winter.

And this, maybe, is something that Keats infers in this poem, that it is the case of carpe diem – of seizing the moment –literally 'seizing the day' – for in an age beyond that of Keats, filled with prospects of global warming and the consequent potential catastrophic effects, not to mention continuing arms escalation and threats of terrorism and nuclear war – we are only too aware of the possibility that this wonderful and glorious creation, that we both enjoy and on which we depend, may come to a premature end.

Heritage Sunday

To celebrate Heritage Weekend the Friends of St Mary's at Hemyock organised an exhibition on Sunday afternoon entitled **Transport in Hemyock through the Ages**. Another apt title could have been From the Cradle to the Grave with items on display going from a pram to a bier which was used in the past to take coffins from the church to the cemetery.

Thanks to the landlord of the Catherine Wheel a pony and trap was in the car park with an Austin 7, Austin Cambridge and Ford Escort Mk1 alongside. The church itself was full of memorabilia with numerous photos, paintings, books, model vehicles, and a DVD of The Culm Valley Railway as well as bicycles, wheelbarrow, scooter, roller boots and skates. The Tower Room was also open.

One item attracting attention was a folding parachute bike from WW2. British paratroopers carried the bikes in gliders and other aircraft to be dropped with them in France. Although they helped personnel to quickly leave the drop site they were unpopular as uncomfortable and it is believed many were simply discarded.

Local travel company Redwoods first began trading in 1932 with a 14 seater 1927 Cheverolet. Their display included photos of the various vehicles used since then and explained how the company had expanded from regular trips to local towns to holidays both in UK and abroad and of course many young people have travelled on Redwoods coaches to and from schools and continue to do so.

The Friends are well known for the delicious refreshments served at their fund raising events and Sunday's teas were no exception. Live music was supplied throughout the afternoon with the event raising £268 towards the upkeep and special projects at the parish church.

A number of people also took the opportunity during the afternoon to visit Hemyock Castle kindly opened by the Sheppard family.

Thursday October 6th in All Saints is the next meeting at 2pm with a talk by one of our members about her visit to the Holy Land.


Thursday 3rd November we have our Christmas lunch. We are not sure where we are going yet.



Hemyock Parish Council held meetings in August & September. A brief summary of the business conducted at those meetings is as follows:-

Finance

Income - included cemetery payments, interest, defibrillator fund monies and sale proceeds from Old Station Yard. Expenditure - included room hire, clerk's pay and expenses, grass cutting, village maintenance, water at cemetery, audit fee, insurance

Highways

Devon County Council's telephone number for members of the public to report any lights that are not working, pot holes, blocked drains/gulleys and any other road maintenance issues is 0345 155 1004. Lines are open 8am to 8pm Monday to Friday and 9am to 1pm Saturday.

Old Station Yard

The sale of the council-owned land at the Old Station Yard site has now been completed. The council sold the land for £40,000 and after legal and other costs £28,000 has been earmarked for future land purchases (allotments, community orchard etc.).



New BMX Track

Have you seen it? The village has a new BMX track located at Longmead, designed and built by professional BMX rider Kye Forte and his team. The track will be officially opened by the council on Saturday 22nd October at 11am – so tell your children to come along then and try it out.

Defibrillator

Following overwhelming support from the community, the parish council has ordered 3 defibrillators from South Western Ambulance Service NHS Foundation Trust. They will be located at the Parish Hall, the Garages and Longmead. Once installed, training will be available to interested parishioners. Details to follow.

By now you should have all received a Housing Needs Survey through your letter box. Please complete the form and return it to Devon Communities Together by 5th October. The results of this survey will help the parish council to formulate a Parish Plan and assist the council when considering planning applications.

These task range from repairing a wall, repainting and refurbishing benches, making noticeboards, improving and repairing footpaths, gates and bridges and other general maintenance works. Dear Residents

Hope the summer was good for you, although sometimes the weather was not reliable.

The month of August is always quiet for Council business, now it will be picking up towards the end of the year, and we have to start looking at next year's budgets, it will be tough.

From next April, things will look different from the highway's point of view. We will not see South West Highways doing County work as they have lost the contract with County. A Swedish company will be taking over. Whether this will be better is debatable, we will have to see.

The more up to date figure needed to keep all the roads and infrastructure (and we have 8000 miles of roads, the longest highway network in the Country, 3500 bridges, 3000 miles of public rights of way and 2000 retaining walls) from deteriorating any further is £102m per year. The total funding for the current year is £46.5m. The difference we have been allocated to spend and the money we have been allocated to spend has resulted in an increasing backlog. Every year that we are unable to spend what we need means that the highway network condition will deteriorate, this will be really noticeable on minor roads.

Therefore we are having to develop a Needs Based Budgeting approach, where we maintain A & B class roads to a high standard at the expense of minor roads.

Councillors who represent rural wards do not like this approach, because our communities are suffering, and we are setting up a task group to look into this and make our representations to the Cabinet in time for the budget.

County already support apprenticeships and the Government is introducing a Apprenticeship Levy for large employers, of which County would be, from April 2017. This introduction will cost County c£1.31m per year. There is then a scheme, do not know the detail yet, that the employers can claim back from the scheme, depending upon the level of apprenticeship they support.

Phase 2 of the £39.5m broadband funding package will target areas with high business density to deliver broadband speeds in excess of 100Mbps. The CDS team are also working with DCLG to finalise the full application for £4.6m European Regional Development Funding and this has been submitted in September.

Anyone within the CDS area that currently has a broadband speed of less than 2Mbps can qualify for a voucher for £500 to go towards the installation cost of a new broadband connection.

I am allocated a budget for any local organisations for their community, I still have some unspent funds, if there is someone that could make use of small amounts, please email me, I can then send you an application form.

Sadly some people have lost a loved one and we very especially remember the family of **Paul Cross**, **Joan Spalding**, **Keith Root** and Sheila Salter. Love and condolence are sent to all.

Keith Root will be remembered by many both here and further afield as a friendly and generous past publican of the Catherine

Keith and his wife Jane were both London Eastenders who met in 1966 marrying 2 years later. They moved to Rainham, Kent where their three children, Martin, Stuart and Suzanne, who Keith adored were born. He was a great dad. During 1978 Keith decided on a career change and the couple took their first public house -The Globe, Chulmleigh where they stayed for 4 years, Keith at 31 being the youngest landlord in the area.

Keith and Jane first came to Hemyock in 1982 to view a very pink and blue public house which by then was quite uncared for as the then landlord, Don Chidgey and his wife Joyce wanted to retire after 29 years as hosts.

Jane says when they came to view Don didn't want to let them in but did so begrudgingly and on entering a dark room a figure stood up frightening them – it was Joyce. Jane continues - we soon learnt from customers that the lights were mainly kept off in fact as a customer left Don would turn a light out! However she says they could see the potential of the lovely public house and could see their family being very happy there.

The family loved their new home and village life at one time winning a cup at the carnival. Keith sponsored the local men's football club, the school team and arranged outings to his beloved West Ham United. Keith also played cricket for Hemyock and loved watching matches at Taunton.

The pub became well used bringing people together with Sunday lunches being very popular and Christmas raffles great successes. The family made great friends and when they left the Catherine Wheel they decided to stay in the village as they felt it was a truly great place to live and bring up a family.

It was well known that Keith had been ill for some years following a knee operation. Serious complications came from this and after 25 years of many ups and downs with his health he lost his fight on 24th July 2016 in Derrisford Hospital, Plymouth surrounded by his loving family.

The family would like to thank Rev Tony Grosse who took the service and spoke so fondly of Keith. They would also like to thank all the family and friends who attended the funeral, sent cards full of such kind words which have been such a comfort at a very difficult time and donated money in Keith's memory – an astounding £766.26 has been sent to the British Liver Trust.

Sheila Salter passed away peacefully, but unexpectedly on 16th August. She will be sadly missed by her family and her many friends in and around Hemyock.

Originally a Spiller from Chapelhayes Farm, Upottery, Sheila spent 60 years living in Hemyock, after marrying the late Perce in 1956. They set up home in the house nearest the river at Lower Westown, which they purchased for the princely sum of £950! As well as raising their three sons, Trevor, Keith and Andrew, Sheila was tasked with looking after the smallholding's flocks of hens, ducks, geese, turkeys, and also the pigs and commercial rabbits.

The family moved to The Gables, Station Road in 1970, but in 1983 the lure of Westown took them back to Culm View until Perce passed away in 2002.

Sheila worked in Marlpits Hospital for 23 years, mainly as an auxiliary midwife. She was involved with many village activities, including Keep Fit and the Blackdown Support Group.

The family would like to thank everyone for their kind words of condolence, and to thank all those who attended Sheila's funeral service with us. We are grateful for your generous donations, and the sum of £638 will be shared between the Blackdown Support Group and Musgrove ITU.

History Group Report

The new committee met in June to agree the series of talks for the year and the membership procedure. Our first meeting of the year was in Wellington when Colin Spackman led a group of 12 around significant building sites of historic importance. The long gardens of high street properties originate from Saxon times when the layout of the original Burghal Hidage was created. The site of the Wellington Poor House and the many passageways off the main streets were viewed.

The talk in September was given by Mrs Elizabeth Stonex, a descendant of the original owner of Otterhead House and Royston House, large Victorian Mansions which have subsequently been destroyed. However the gas acetylene equipment used for lighting, and the ram pump used to supply water to the house automatically from the reservoir are still extant. The estate is now owned by Wessex Water who manage the water supplies while the gardens are leased and looked after by the Otterhead Estate Trust.

As with so many other large country estates providing sport for the Victorians, the man power required to maintain these estates did not return in 1919 and the financial situation on the estate farms was also failing due to the large scale importation of food from the Empire.



Apples and Somerset

The Romans cultivated apple orchards throughout the occupied country and after the Norman conquests, new varieties of apple from France were introduced and new varieties cross-pollinated in the grounds of Monasteries.

There are now over 7500 apple varieties throughout the world and apple production exceeds 80 million tons annually. Whilst the UK only produces 5% of this volume, it is home to many interesting apple that are used for cooking, food production and making ciders and other beverages.

The Blackdown Hills Transition Group are helping to run a number of Apple Pressing Days in Buckland St Mary Village Hall car park (Sunday 9th October 1230-1630), Upottery Glebe Park Ex14 9RH (Sunday 16th October 1200-1700) and Stentwood Farm at Dunkeswell (29th & 30th October 1100-1700). In Hemyock, for the latter, although the numbers were down on last year a good time was had including drama and games as they entered into the challenge of the 'Guardians of Ancora' led by pastor Steve Williams (HBC) and pastor Jonathan Hillman (RML) ably assisted by Revd. John Stone (St. Mary's) and a team including some enthusiastic youngsters – see the two pics. We trust that this will help to bring encouragement as the autumn youth work gets under way in our various churches.





A number of our folk attended what is known as the Bush Conference for families across the south west. This had its beginnings in a barn on a farm near Churchinford in the early 1980s and has grown significantly, moving on eventually to near Tiverton and now regularly at Bow near Crediton where some 200 gathered this year over the weekend 2nd-5th September.

Writing this article early this time means that we are not able to report on the Barn Praise at Kerswell on 11th.September (for which we close our evening service at the chapel), our Harvest Thanksgiving Service on Sunday morning 18th September followed by a Sing-along Tea in the afternoon (including folk from the RML Lunch and Tea Clubs) or the Ploughman's Praise supper on the following Tuesday when we expect Mike Britton as our speaker.

Other plans for the future include a new Winter Bible Study series entitled "Changed from Inside Out" based on Ephesians Chapter 4. The first two this year will be on Tuesday evenings at 7.3 opm on 18th.October (Walking in the way of Christ) and 15th.November (What are we Becoming?) – a warm welcome is extended to all who are able to join us. Then our Bonfire Night Celebration with the traditional soup and bangers will be on Friday evening 4th November.

One matter of particular note is that our chapel has been approached with the view to have a defibrillator attached to the outside wall for the help of anyone in the vicinity experiencing a cardiac arrest – this is in conjunction with the South West Ambulance Service.

Although the Blackdown Hills Churches have not had a Fun Day this year some of you may remember three years ago when the Anglican priest and clown, Roly Bain, entertained and challenged us – sadly he has recently passed on following a battle with cancer. A quote for our October/November article in 2013 says "Apart from many other balancing acts and tricks he walked on a 'slack rope' focusing his eyes on the opposite pole which had a cross on top –signifying the importance in the Christian life of keeping our eyes on Jesus."

We trust that we all will have an encouraging autumn doing just that.
