### No Words Will Often Do

Some years ago I stumbled upon an exhibition of work by the photographer Simon Norfolk entitled "For most of it I have no words". It consisted of several series of square-format black and white photographs depicting scenes in various places throughout the world which have undergone various forms of genocide and mass killing: Rwanda, Cambodia, Vietnam, Auschwitz. Also included are scenes of Dresden and lesser known places of death: Ukraine, Armenia and Namibia.

I was so moved by this that I returned to the gallery and bought the book.

These stark, often beautiful compositions and landscapes as well as, for example, images of Rwandan classrooms full of decaying human corpses or a Cambodian monastery with rooms piled with bones evoke strong reactions. Often the stillness and emptiness of these killing fields photographed many years after the carnage instill a sense of deep emotion and the resolve that we must never let this happen again – but of course it does – and the sense of despair may overwhelm us.

Many of us are familiar with images of Auschwitz, the gas chambers, piles of human hair or as in another photograph, an ash pond.

We are less familiar with the entirely avoidable famine of 1932/3 in Ukraine where Stalin allowed close to 6 million to perish from starvation over a period of 9 months. One of the illustrations in this section is of a wooden crucifix with a woodpecker's nest in the hollow body of the crucified Christ.

Another section of photographs depicts a snowy cold empty country where in 1915 the Turkish government killed about 1 million members of the Armenian minority. The Turkish government deny this episode and it was largely covered up to the extent that Hitler, in justifying his 'Final Solution' said "After all, who remembers the Armenians?".

The photograph in this section that especially moves me is of a single telegraph pole in an empty wintery and windswept emptiness. The top is caked in wind-blown snow in the shape, which at first glance, appears to be a crucifix. Christ hanging and dying on the cross. For me, as a Christian, I could perceive, the crucified and dying Christ in all the places depicted in such a moving series of photographic images.

And still that pain; that suffering, in our world goes on. Ukraine is still on the front line, but we see the pain of Yemen, of Syria; the homeless of Myanmar and also in many countries in central Africa and tomorrow it will be somewhere else.

And for us: for most of it we have no words.

We live in a world dominated by the noise of words. Everyone, it seems, has something to say about everything. We are flooded with words: on TV, social media, in newspapers, in video, online, at work, at the pub, at home – even, for those who come: in church. It can seem like a constant barrage. Even here as you read this – it's words.

Sometimes we need to enable a word-free environment and allow ourselves to be open to respond on another level. For some this means being quiet, being silent, letting our souls be still. We can all do it. No special equipment is required – just some time, and a place to be – and a willingness to be in that empty space. Sometimes it can be quite challenging or even intimidating – but something worth giving a try.

It can be easier when you can share a time of stillness and quiet with other people.

An initiative sponsored by the Quakers, which you may wish to take up under the title 'Drop in to Silence', allows you to, just as it says, drop in and spend as little or as much time as you wish sitting with others in silence. This will be from 5.30 to 6.30pm on the fourth Wednesday in the month in the small meeting room at the Healthy Living Centre in Hemyock. There is no agenda and no expectations, except to respect the silence. You will find further details elsewhere.

We are fast approaching Lent – and maybe we can take this as an opportunity to find silence and maybe also to reflect on the cross, and where we see it in today's world.

St Mary' Church will finally have toilets after about 20 years of discussion - don't ask why it has taken so long, I would need several pages to explain.

BK Construction will start work w/c 19th February to demolish the existing boiler house to make way for the erection of the new toilets and boiler house. The toilets will be accessed from the interior of the Church but so this will also entail some internal reordering to ensure that we comply to disabled access criteria and to provide a much-needed social area. 

### **Hemyock History Report**

The talk on December 14th was given by Reg Howe of the worshipful company of Farriers. Reg lives locally after spending his career in London working with IBM.

The City of London has some 100 Livery Companies many with their own dining halls and are among the wealthiest groups of merchants who have operated since early middle ages. The rights of these merchant organisations are protected and are on display during the Lord Mayor's Show where the original Great Twelve Livery Companies are always present. Members of the other Livery Companies are invited from time to time. The Lord Mayor is always from one of these Companies and member rights are on display during the show as this last year when sheep formed part of the procession.

The historic wealth of the various companies accumulated over some 800 years is on display in the various Dining Halls where official functions are held. The Livery Companies support various charities selected by the Master for the year.

New members are invited from time to time to introduce innovative practises to ensure the merchant organisations maintain their relevance in today's business world.

These organisations have successfully survived throughout all the changes enforced on the Country over the years and no doubt will continue to do so in modern times.

The talk on January 12th was by our local Historian, David Pugsley on the case brought at Taunton Assizes of Jane Austen's Aunt for shoplifting in 1799. Mrs Jane Lee Perrott, was happily married with the beneficial estate to the value of £5k pa. The proceedings at the assizes is now recorded on the web site of the Jane Austen Centre at Bath. The manager of the shop at which the case centres used his two assistants to swear that Mrs Jane Lee Perrott was in fact in possession of some lace that had not been paid for in the shop. The oaths sworn by the assistants were sufficient to send Mrs Perrott to prison awaiting the next Taunton Assizes in March 1800. The Assizes resulted in several unfortunates being sentenced to death while Mrs Perrott was released upon the jury verdict of Not Guilty.

The next meeting on Thursday 8th February will be given by Will Partridge, the Finds Officer for the SW Heritage Trust followed by the March talk on March 8th by Mary Siraut of the Victorian Society at the SW Heritage Trust.



- We also offer short-term wheelchair loans and a disabled access vehicle.

She was an excellent teacher, I don't recall exactly what she did that was so amazing but I just know she was. Mrs Reynolds had us in costume for the celebration of the Monmouth Rebellion, she had us adding to the BBC Doomsday Project on the BBC Micro Computer we shared with the year 5 class and made us appreciate the joys of music on a trip to a Gamelan Workshop. Learning was experiential but along with that immersive experience came high expectations when it came to presentation of work and commitment to learning. Along with her full time teaching role, she was also the deputy head and had the "voice" and presence that went with that role – I didn't want to get on the wrong side of her! One lasting image I have of her is hymn practice assemblies when she played the piano standing up so she could peer at us all singing (or not!) over her spectacles which were attached via a cord to her neck (for fear of losing them) and shouting loudly at us over the music to sing up!





The engineers seem to be ahead of schedule as the work in Battle Street has been brought forward from February to late January. The Bolham Valley remains outside the network.

### **Clayhidon Friends**

### January 11th 2018 Meeting

What better way to welcome the New Year than to gather together and share experiences and memories whilst imbibing of some Mulled Wine and superb sausage rolls and chocolate brownies provided by Sarah and Tina.

Sarah started the "Bring and Tell" Evening by showing us one of the tools of her trade in Midwifery. This was a Pinnard's Foetal Stethoscope. First used as far back as 1650, but used for general heart monitoring and then to listen to the baby's heartbeat. An unprepossessing trumpet like instrument, so simple, but so effective.

Angela told us of a young boy who used to pass with his seven siblings each day on his way to school. Angela and her husband gave them chocolates one year at Christmas and gathered things throughout the year. By the next Christmas there was an eighth child. Leading up to the next Chritmas there were several knocks on the door by the eldest boy with various questions. Just before Christmas he presented her with two pompoms for her and her husband. Angela was so struck with how simple they were, but had been made with warmth of spirit. She was very impressed by how whole family were united, how well-mannered and, how well turned out they were.

Carol showed us two wooden dolls which had been given to her when she lived in Boston and had joined in with a Quilting Group. They thought that as she was English she would know what they were, but she was equally mystified. We all examined the armless, period dressed ladies and came up with various thoughts from lace making bobbins, Amish woodworking or simply just beautifully lathed, tactile ornaments.

Linda had recently been on a fantastic holiday to China and visited the Three Gorge Dam. The peasant locals living simple lives had all been forcibly rehoused in very high rise flats to make way for the Dam that had taken 10 years of 24 hour pouring of concrete. It has successfully provided energy for the area and paid for itself. She had some humorous anecdotes to relate as to how the Chinese did not understand our manners and frequently came out with not quite accurate statements.

Anne had brought a very small girl's shoe which was discovered in her chimney twenty two years ago, hanging on a hook, with a piece of paper from previous owners explaining they had found it in the rafters. The house has been added onto throughout time, but the chimney was made with stone taken from Dunkeswell Abbey. Anne had researched the custom of putting either a shoe or item of clothing within the makings of buildings. It is thought that it was often a child's shoe, the

child being pure of spirit, to ward off the Devil. There is a Museum in Norfolk which has undertaken to record findings. Shoes are especially used as a lucky talisman and a sign of wealth. This is also why shoes are traditionally tied to the back of a wedding car.

Margaret told us of her strict Victorian Grandmother who had worked in large country estates and in her words 'seen it all', at the weekend Shooting Parties. The Grandmother was very strict with Margaret and used to tie a strip of wood to her back and head to encourage a straight back. Her Grandmother maintained that if you had to shop more than once a week, you were not a good Manager and to demonstrate how they did it in those days Margaret displayed a wooden board with essential items printed on it and a tiny flick peg by each item. When the time came to replenish an item the flick peg would be turned over to display the red side.

Another Grandmother story was shared by Lynda. She produced four crystal balls of equal small size. Lynda explained these sat on her Grandmother's narrow 1930's tiled fireplace. When her friends came round, she would tell their fortunes by the aid of the balls three stuck together side by side and the fourth on top. Being a typical curious girl, whilst her Grandmother was out room, Lynda picked them up. To her horror she dropped them and they separated. To her everlasting regret Lynda never owned up, just quietly putting them back on the mantelpiece. So much did her dishonesty trouble her that when her Grandmother died she asked if she could have them and still to this day they remind her to be honest.

Hemyock Castle was then brought into the discussion by Ruth, who lives nearby. She has seen various occupants live there. Firstly Farmers, then University folk, who tried to farm and shared two teats each whilst milking the cow to the present owners Captain Shepherd and family. They had a Filipino lady work for them, who Ruth got to know well. When her Visa run out she had to return to the Philippines but often returned on holiday with gifts of pineapples and rice. She lost everything in the Tsunami and the Hemyock villagers all clubbed together to send money towards replacing her son's boat. He named it Hemyock Castle.

Continuing with a Chinese theme Helen showed us a two inch high statue of a green horse with dark mane. She explained the set of eight horses, all with different stances had been sent to her Mother by her brother who was away with the Royal Engineers. A complete collection is thought to be very valuable. Unfortunately, although well packed each of the eight horses was damaged in one way or another. As the family rarely saw Helen's brother, a gift was very precious, despite the disappointment of the damage.

Car Boots can indeed produce treasure and Mickey bought along two small prints from one such outing. Not thinking much of them she displayed them because she liked them. Then on a whim she thought she would find out more about them and was thrilled to learn they were original drawings by Arthur Packham the Illustrator of Wind in the Willows and Alice in Wonderland. Now beautifully framed they take pride of place on her wall.

As you can see from the above The Clayhidon Friends Group have many enjoyable evenings either making our own entertainment at the Parish Hall or jaunts out, or welcoming some very interesting Speakers.
