#### A Catalyst for God

I am sure it is the writer's nightmare – sitting down with a blank sheet of paper, knowing that you must write something, but having no idea what.

Over very many years as vicar or rector in a number of parishes I have been faced with this problem either every month – or as here every other month. Sometimes it feels like I have written a load of rubbish, sometimes, hopefully it may be of some help or interest to somebody. It seems like a particular challenge on this occasion, when this will be my last piece for the Parish Pump.



I am beginning to understand more the meaning of Jesus' parable of the sower, where seed is scattered liberally everywhere by the sower as he throws handfuls in every direction around him. Much lands in places not ideally suited to germination and growth, though some begins to grow where it has a

difficult time with weeds, rocky or infertile soil, and the stone-hard path. However, some falls on the fertile soil producing, in the end, an enormous harvest.

As the sower sows he does not fully understand the outcome of where every seed falls – he just dutifully casts the seed to all quarters – and his experience tells him that if conditions are good then there will be a harvest despite the fact that some seed has failed.

I think that in writing these short pieces for the Parish Pump and in preparing sermons each week, it is a little like casting seeds in every direction – sometimes it will hit fertile soil, often not.

For the preacher there may be the odd comment like "Lovely sermon vicar" or usually no comment at all.

Sometimes people may take me up on something I have said, or been specifically complementary. This is good – I am not seeking agreement, but hopefully enabling some thought and reflection about important things. It is about being, as all of us within the Church might be, a catalyst for God - enabling him to be active in people's lives.

I have to say that after having been here for six years, I shall miss everyone enormously, but will hope to keep in touch with many of you. There will be a significant gap in my life for some time – though I hope to keep my hand in elsewhere. I may even miss the monthly blank page that needs filling!

Jill and I shall be around until mid September and hopefully have a chance to say goodbye then.

Nicci, a paediatrician spoke of the time she had spent at Potters and how she was looking forward to returning with the Church Mission Society in August.



She spoke of Rev Jenny Green who had founded the centre but was now based in the UK, the sadness when children and mothers died and the great joy in those the centre had, and continue, to help whether it was teaching good health, ensuring healthy births, returning orphans to extended family or finding foster families. Her slide show showed the beauty of the area as well as the day to day living conditions of the local community. Nicci spoke of the importance of prayer and of the financial support received from various churches, St Mary's being one of those who had supported the project for many years. A number of years ago 6 members of the church had visited Uganda and two had spent considerable time over the years working at Potters. An opportunity to donate towards the continuing work at the centre amounted to over £450.

#### Sea Sunday

At the Sea Sunday service in July we recalled that there were 1.5 million seafarers worldwide. Despite all the modern technology it is still a dangerous job with 1000 sailors losing their lives each year. We also noted that 90% of what we eat, wear, drive use etc. has at some point in its journey to us, been on a ship. Whilst we still have ferries, cruise ships and fishing vessels, the vast amount of freight carried today is mainly in containers. So whilst you're stuck behind a foreign lorry with a container lost in the back lanes of Clayhidon you might like to consider that at any one time there are 20 million containers in transit on the world's oceans. The newest containerships can carry 15000 of them.

You might also like to know that on a run from say China to the USA you might not see land for up to two weeks, and it is not uncommon for sailors to be on their boats for 8, 9 even 14months without getting off the vessels. Such is the demand placed on the crews and dock staff for ships to be tied up in port for as short a time as possible. Consequently the major problems today for seafarers are those around mental health. Bigger ships with smaller crews mean less time "off duty", fewer people to share problems with, feelings of isolation from families (not all ships have internet connections) and increased work related stress. You'll find lots more about this on the "Mission to Seafarers" website, as well as those of other organisations like the "Mission to Deep Sea Fishermen" and the RNLI.

#### **Hemyock Bells**



Hemyock's bells have been ringing out the news about the church for about 500 years. In 1553 there were 5 bells, a lot for a small village. Since 1858 that number has been 6, ranging in weight from 5cwt to just under 18cwt (280 to 907kg). They ring to announce services in the church, weddings, funerals and to mark many special personal, local and national events.

Standing next to a pillar erected by the Normans about 1120, ringing a bell nearly 400 years old in the style that was started in the early 1500s, one has a glimpse of the traditions of ringing, just one of the many facets which make this form of service for the church so fascinating.

Hemyock ringers meet for practice most Thursday evenings, and ring for 45 minutes before the morning service on Sundays. They will link up with their fellow ringers from Culmstock and Clayhidon when needed.

The parish council has received a request to turn off the lights on the High Street. The council supports this request but wishes to hear from anyone who may object to this proposal. If you have any comments, please contact the clerk before the end of August.

There has been a noticeable increase in the amount of litter left in this area.

The Autumn Show is in the Parish Hall on 8 September at 2.00 p.m. Schedules have just been delivered and, as usual, from 1.00 p.m. on the day of the show, you can enjoy a delicious ploughman's lunch in the hall before it opens to the public at 2.00 p.m.

There are several classes open to non-members - the following are for the children. Class 59 - up to 8 years - A Vegetable Dinosaur. Class 60 - 8 years and over - A Decorated Pot - any size. Class 20 is for a selection of home grown produce arranged in a trug - maximum longest length 20". Class 58 is a vase of flowers arranged for effect - a minimum of five varieties and up to 12 stems. Class 67 is also open to non-members - a Blackdown Apple Cake to following recipe:-

225g self raising flour 1 large egg (beaten)
2 teaspoons ground cinnamon 6-8 tablespoons milk
115g unsalted butter 100g sultanas
(diced and chilled) 115g light brown sugar
225g Bramley or Granny Smith apples (peeled, cored and diced)
2 tablespoons demerara sugar (for crunchy topping)
Extra butter for greasing tin

Grease and line 20cm tin with baking parchment. Mix together the 225g flour and cinnamon in large bowl. Add butter and rub into flour until resembles breadcrumbs. Stir in 115g light brown sugar Beat in the egg followed by milk to achieve a smooth, thick batter.

Add the apples and sultanas and mix to combine. Scrape the batter into the prepared tin and level out. Sprinkle the demerara sugar over the prepared batter. Bake for 30-40 minutes at 160c fan or 180c until golden and a skewer inserted comes out clean.



#### Hemyock History – WWII POWs Working on Local Farms Heritage Open Days 2018 – Free to Explore – Hemyock

### In answer to David Berkley's article in June / July 2018 Parish

Yes, there are records and memories of Hemyock's role in World War Two. In 1995, Margaret Sheppard interviewed many Hemyock residents about their experiences of living through WWII, both serving overseas and on the "Home Front." Margaret and Mr Norman Lowman staged a major exhibition in 1995 of these stories, photos, and artefacts. Margaret published those stories and photos as a booklet to mark the 50th anniversary of VE and VI-Days. Hundreds of copies were printed and sold, all in aid of the Royal British Legion.

I have extensively corrected, re-edited, and republished these rare eyewitness stories as a series of Kindle eBooks, culminating in a "Kindle Box Set" which contains all five volumes. These Kindle eBooks about Hemyock people sell around the World, including in Japan, but oddly rarely in Hemyock. These eBooks can be read on Kindle devices and on most other PCs, tablets & smartphones, using the free Kindle reading apps. All proceeds go to the Blackdown Support Group charity. #### **WWII Prisoners of War Camps and Working on Local Farms**

Nearby Prisoner of War camps included one for Italians at Waterloo Cross near Uffculme; and one at Wellington near Pyles Thorne Close, for Germans & some Italians, Temporary camps such as the ones built near Bradninch Cricket Ground and on Tiverton's Old Racecourse (now Tiverton High School) to house US troops preparing for D-Day, were later used to house POWs and / or had POW compounds.

There were also the Internment Camps for "enemy aliens" (mostly German nationals), such as the one near Paignton where Mr Bill Granger was stationed while serving in the Territorial Army.

Some WWII POWs were determined never to help "their enemy," but as during WWI, many POWs did accept the offer of paid work on local farms. Their help was welcomed at a time when labour was short because so many local men were away, serving Britain's in war effort. Many POWs were from rural areas, so were used to farm work.

Although "prisoners of war," they were usually considered as lowrisk for absconding. Some were delivered daily by transport; some even lived on local farms. It is unlikely that many POWs working on local farms were closely guarded by troops while they worked.

Some prisoners were very creative and ingenious: eg. Making toy models of a cockerel picking-up corn, out of a flat piece of wood, a block, some string, and paint. The swinging movement of the block would cause "the bird" to pick-up "the corn." Other POWs made rings or bracelets out of thrup'ny pieces and bits of scrap metal.

As during previous conflicts, these prisoners would tell residents that they had been conscripted into the war and knew very little of its implications.

One of Hemyock's "Extraordinary Women" featured, will be Mrs Joanne Illery: She successfully petitioned the courts and Parliament for years to obtain compensation because her husband was hanged when the Royalists besieged and captured Hemyock Castle during the English Civil War in 1643/44.

Another special display will use artefacts found at Hemyock Castle to demonstrate centuries of close links with continental Europe, for trade, people, and ideas.

Hemyock Castle will be open on Sunday 9th September 2018, 2 to 5pm. Free entry for Heritage Open Days; free parking. No booking required. All welcome. (Note. We will NOT be open on Sunday 16th September.)

Nearby St. Mary's Church usually opens for Heritage Open Days, and usually also offers teas.



#### The Violet Chapman Trust

The Violet Chapman Charity (Charity registration number 299996) was established in 1986 after Mrs Violet Chapman, who was a patient of the Blackdown Practice, gave a substantial gift to the doctors, which was intended to provide patients with services and help that were not available under the NHS.

The original Trustees were Dr Jonathan Meads, Mrs Chapman and Sir Christopher Palmer who, at that time, was senior partner with Ashfords Solicitors and one time president of the Law Society. The Trustees were, at this time, all volunteers not drawing any salary or expenses, and this remains the case to date.

The Trust has discretion to give grants for medical equipment and treatments as well as giving financial assistance to patients of the Blackdown Practice for numerous purposes.

All grants are given for the physical and mental wellbeing of the patients, and many will gain support by the help the Trust gives in supplying counselling where the NHS is unable to supply.

There are many examples that we could give of the patients we have helped recently and would cite one that required their bathroom to be modernised to enable them to continue to live at home; another patient who needed a chair that would help them in getting in and out without assistance. Another example is a patient who had severe back pain and a grant was given for them to have remedial massage.

If you feel the Trust can help you we would suggest you talk to your GP or any person who gives you support and submit an Application form which can be found online or pick one up from any of the Blackdown Practice surgeries. The Trustees are only too happy to consider any applications. Alternatively for more details please contact the secretary, Mrs Judy Barton on 01823 680975 or j.h.barton@hotmail.co.uk.

The Trustees are proud of the speed with which they are able to help patients and in many cases are able to provide financial assistance within two weeks.

  programme for those who are struggling to re-integrate back
  into the community, perhaps after bereavement, an accident
  or long period of ill health
- Advocacy providing support with filling in forms and paperwork to ensure people have access to the services or financial support they need
- We also offer short-term wheelchair loans and a disabled access vehicle.

#### **Dear Residents**

What a contrast in the weather, last winter we had gritters out salting to clear the snow and ice, now this summer we have had three gritters out spreading sand to stop the roads from melting, road temperatures have reached 6oc, that is hot. What this weather does is stops the erosion of the potholes, in April we had 7400 waiting for repairs and now in July that is down to 720, hopefully we can get down to nearer zero before the winter sets in and we see potholes re-appearing. The Slapton Road is now being done.

Scomis, which is a Company owned by DCC have increased their business and are now supporting 734 Schools across 24 Authorities. Scomis have been invited to be a representative in the 2018/19 Parliament Review, sharing best practice with Public and Private Sector. More Authorities are now getting involved in running an arm's length business, this has come about because of the austerity we have had to endure over the last 8 to 9 years. Social Care procurement has a very full work programme, highlights include; Refreshed and Re-issued 330 Care Homes Contracts to the new Adult Social Care Residential Fee Model. Evaluating Homeless Prevention Tender, and supporting independence contracts. Supporting ongoing arrangements to assist with a wide programme of residential care.

You may recall how Norse, a jointly owned company, was creating revenue for DCC, Devon Norse have been successful in securing a further 8 new catering and cleaning contracts since the start of this year and was the winner of the `Corporate Responsivity Award` in the Cost Sector Catering Awards 2018 for their work, relating to ethically sourced and Fairtrade Food in Schools, their support of the foodbank charity and their efforts towards recycling and raising awareness of the effects of sugar consumption.

Devon Norse's recent economic impact assessment highlighted that for every £1 spent with suppliers, 67p is spent within the South West. The Company employ over 1000 staff predominately living in Devon and the local suppliers used employ a further 31 people. With an organisation the size of DCC, we will always get complaints, but there has been an overall reduction of 10% in stage 1 complaints in the last quarter. Stage 2 has remained static, mainly highway related issues. We have received 14 Local Government and Social Care Ombudsman notifications, mainly related to Adult Social Care. 197 MP enquires have been received since April and across the Authority we have received 260 Compliments. We are always working to improving our services.

Around 700 Children are in Care, although this goes up and down from time to time. The update of the Care First System that is used to record all information about a Child in Care and Care Leavers is called Eclipse, it is more user friendly. Schools are performing well, considering the financial pressures they are under. The Schools that are good or outstanding have dipped a bit to 88%, this is still good compared to the rest of the Country. Devon is at the heart of the School Funding campaign, who need more funding, it will not be easy with the NHS being guaranteed an extra £20 Billion over the next 5 years.

#### **BATS IN THE BELFRY**



Bats and swifts have brought a temporary halt to work on renewing the roof of Clayhidon Parish Hall. Wellington roofers Courtney Bowden & Son were already planning a two month pause so as not to disturb the swifts that had flown 3,000 miles from beyond the Sahara to raise their young under the old Welsh slates.

But when they started prising off old slates near the 125 year old schoolhouse bell they found a small family of brown long eared bats. This meant an immediate stop, as bats are heavily protected by law and disturbing them intentionally is illegal. The hall committee consulted Dunkeswell-based Blackdown Environmental, who have carried out a bat survey of the entire roof and have applied to Natural England for a licence that would allow the work to carry on.

"The roofers have been brilliant," said hall chairman Gareth Weekes. "They informed us as soon they found the bats, which was absolutely the right thing to do. The delay is inconvenient, but no-one wants to harm the bats and we want to be sure they have a home when the new roof goes on. "The ecologists were very quick off the mark and we are keeping our fingers crossed that the delay is minimal." The work is being paid for by a grant of £25,856 from Viridor Credits.

#### 150 JOIN CLAYHIDON'S BIG PARTY



Perfect weather, a lovely location, a good band and 150 people in the mood to party – it all added up to a brilliant Midsummer Party and Barn Dance on 30 June, the first big fundraising event for Clayhidon Parish Hall's planned extension.



#### **MURDER MARKER RESTORED**



Clayhidon's famous murder marker – which for more than a century has reminded passers-by of a brutal robbery - has been restored to pristine condition.

Alex Hill, of Bollhayes, has cleared the undergrowth and repainted the unusual memorial in the hedge beside the spot in Battle Street where George Sparks beat William Blackmore to death with a pair of blacksmith's tongs in 1853.

The judge wept with grief as he donned his black cap and sentenced Sparks. A crowd of thousands, including children, watched him hang in Exeter. The story is told in all its dramatic detail in Pamela Reynolds' book, *Clayhidon, A Devon Parish in the Nineteenth Century*.

The passion, the pride, the integrity and togetherness of this team allowed us as a nation to feel a connectedness to the spirit of this squad. Moreover, people came together and experienced a connectedness with one another in a way that has otherwise seemed lost. This connectedness, a sense of togetherness with another, is something of great value.

In many ways this sense of connectedness has formed a common theme of celebration at Rosemary Lane Chapel over the last few months. At the beginning of June many members of Rosemary Lane Chapel came together with churches across the Blackdown Hills to welcome Jonathan Woodhouse, former Chaplain General of the British Army. Jonathan provided an evening of insight into the work of our army chaplains. Later on in the month we, as a church, were welcomed up to join St. Andrew's, Clayhidon, for a combined service. It continues to be a wonderful opportunity to meet together, and though our traditions and practices may differ, we come together as a community acknowledging the commonality of our shared love for this place in which we live and, moreover, the love of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.



The month of June concluded with our now annual community 'Fun Day' which took place on the chapel field. The weather and setting provided the perfect backdrop for a day of great fun enjoyed by members of the chapel and members of the wider community in and around Rosemary Lane. The inflatable assault course and gladiator joust proved to be the cause of much excitement whilst the afternoon tea followed by BBQ provided the opportunity to sit down and chill out as the temperatures climbed. I personally enjoyed the occasion from my perch, a showroom toilet, upon which I was sat whilst having



soaked sponges thrown at me by many of our youngsters. They paid for the privilege and their incredible efforts, alongside other activities, helped to raise over the £120 target set in order to pay for the construction of two toilets in a developing country where proper sanitation is scarce. It was great to be mindful of the many blessings we share in as a community, whilst remaining conscious of the connection we had with other communities many miles away, whose needs for sanitation have been recognised now that we are twinned

with their toilets. We at the chapel would like to thank all the members of the community who came along to share in this special day, and to Honiton Tiles for providing the showroom toilet that served as the focal point of our fundraising efforts. Honiton Homebase provided several parasols to ensure that those sitting on the toilet were preserved.

The celebrations continued into July – First, our anniversary Sunday service in which we as a church celebrated our young people and the many steps that they have taken in learning more about Jesus throughout the year. It is a wonderful blessing to spend time giving thanks for our young people and the many gifts and talents God has poured into their lives. On the 8th July we were joined by Luc Van Damme, an area representative for Mission Aviation Fellowship (MAF), who told us about the incredible work of this missional organisation as they support many NGOs, charities and development agencies in reaching some of the world's most inaccessible communities - bringing with them vital care, support and the love Jesus. On the 15th July, another occasion of great celebration, we baptised a young member of our church, who in taking this step was declaring something of his commitment to following Jesus, and in going down into the water and coming back up, acknowledged his connectedness to Christ in his death and resurrection which, by faith, brings us into newness of life. The month of July will end with one last celebration as we hold a dedication service for one of our youngest members within the church. It is a time to remember the value of our connectedness within family, and through Christ, the acknowledgement that this connectedness is something all can participate in through the sacrificial love of God – each one of us is invited into His family to experience an unbreakable connectedness to He who is Love.



#### **Tiverton Town Band**

The history of present day Tiverton Town Band goes back well over 100 hundred years to probably about 1890. Its precise origins are lost in the mist of time, but it was no doubt a community band as were many of the others formed around that time. There is said to be mention of a band (of sorts) in Tiverton in the Domesday Book with a group of musicians playing and leading a parade. And before the thought crosses the mind – NO we don't still have any of those original players in the band today- although you could be forgiven for thinking it!



Only four organisations are permitted to use the Tiverton town crest in their logo and the band is one of them. The band maintains very

close links with the town council and takes part in many of the civic and ceremonial events held in the town, in particular the Mayor's Banquet which takes place in early May and the Remembrance day parade in the town which the band leads and is proud so to do, with the subsequent wreath laying ceremony and sounding of the last post. It can also be seen and heard over the Christmas period entertaining shoppers in Fore street, Market Walk and in Tesco and Morrisons. Across the year the band plays at many local events and concerts, including Holcombe Rogus fete, Cullompton Festival and the Mid-Devon Show. It also plays in places all over Devon and Somerset: eg, Dawlish, Teignmouth, Exmouth, Minehead, Ilfracombe, Chard, and Ashburton. Tiverton is twinned with the French town of Chinon in the Loire valley, and the band has enjoyed several trips to support this, performing there as part of the cultural and social exchange. The furthest the band has ever travelled was to Texas in 2006 where they played 7 concerts in just 10 days. Fund raising for charity and giving back to the community are a large part of what banding is all about. A major highlight for the band has been the 25 concerts over 17 years raising over £20,000 for Children in Need.

Our Band Master is Graham Pillivant, whose family have been closely involved and playing with the band over four generations. The Conductor/Musical Director (MD) is the key person in any musical ensemble, and we are very lucky to have John Fitton, a local extremely well respected musician, as our MD. And what of the future? Well the future of any organisation, musical or otherwise, lies in the youth of today. Having said that, the age range of the band is from 12 to 74 and we have a thriving training band with the age range from 10 to 71!! This training band is progressing very well and already players are beginning to feed into the main band. They have performed at events in the past year and will perform at several this year also, where they will be offering tryouts on various instruments for anyone wishing to 'have a go'. The training band is keen to expand and to this end we will be looking at developing relationships with local schools to see if we can offer something to further develop the skills of up and coming or aspiring brass players.

As with all brass bands Tiverton Town Band has vacancies from time to time. If you or someone you know is a brass player or a drummer/percussionist – however rusty – then come along and try us out. #### 100 Years Since the Signing of Armistice

November 2018 is a very special year for the Royal British Legion as it is 100 years since the signing of the Armistice at 11.00 on the 11th of November 1918 that put an end to the first world war. That is why the Remembrance services have always been at 11 o'clock on the 11th day of the 11th month each year since. This war took the lives of a vast number of men who were the flower of England's Youth in what was supposed to be the war to end all wars.

The men who fought and survived were treated appallingly by the Government of the time. They were sent home to try and pick up their lives where they left off, but as we know now nothing was ever going to be the same again. Many of the great houses had gone, farms had fell into disrepair and returned to the landlords, therefore many of the returning soldiers had nowhere to go or to live

Field Marshal Earl Haig was appalled by the situation his Ex soldiers found themselves in and that the government was doing very little to rectify the situation.

On the 30th June 1921 Mr Tom Lister (later Sir Frederick Lister), together with Field Marshal Earl Haig, formed the British Legion to help the destitute soldiers.

In 1923 the Sampford Peverell and Uplowman British Legion was formed, which is still going today helping the ex-service personnel and their dependants but sadly it now only has about 8 active members out of a membership of 23. We have lost many of the second world war veterans who were the mainstay of the Branch and now those of us who saw National Service are now in our Eighties. I, Keith Astbury as Chairman of the Sampford Peverell and Uplowman Branch, appeal to the People of all the surrounding villages to join the RBL. We are the last village branch in the area to remain open.

There is no requirement to be Ex Service and it is open to all, The RBL is no longer restricted to Ex Service personnel as it is now a registered charity whose purpose is to serve Ex Service personnel and their dependents.

The RBL has been appointed the Custodian of the Country's Remembrance services, which is very important of our village life.

If we have to close the Branch, which is very possible unless we get more members, we will lose the RBL Standards and the connection with our schools at remembrancetide which will be another part of our history gone forever.
