#### **Ordinary Time?**

Do you, like me, feel a little frustrated that the vast majority of our public holidays are packed into the first 6 months of the year? From the Spring Bank Holiday (formerly Whit-Monday) through to Christmas, we have only the Late Summer Holiday to relieve the monotony of daily life and labour. The blame for this imbalance lies primarily with the Christian Church, whose most important Festivals relate to the Birth, Passion, Resurrection and Ascension of Jesus, and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. These dates, together with the periods

of preparation before them, are squeezed into the six months from Advent Sunday, at the beginning of December, to Trinity Sunday in early June.

election of our next Prime Minister and the ongoing drama of Brexit. Then there are the unprecedented threats to global peace and security, not to mention the worries about the impact of climate change on the very future of our planet. These are truly extraordinary times.

So what is the purpose of 'Ordinary Time'? For Christians, it is the ideal opportunity to reflect on all the high points in the Church's year and to apply what we have learnt or understood from the life and teaching of Jesus to our own lives and our day-to-day activities and relationships. That

But what of those of us who struggle to believe in, or understand, God, let alone have any sort of relationship with him? Surely we can all reflect on what each of us can do to make a difference – whether in our community, our national political life, or by changing aspects of our lifestyle in order to 'save the planet'.

However the Church might style this season, with God there is no such thing as 'ordinary time' or, indeed, ordinary people; to him and through him we are all extraordinary.

The Church labels the other half of the year 'Ordinary Time'. You know that we are in Ordinary Time when, in almost all Parish Churches in England, the altar is adorned with a green frontal. Green is the colour of nature and is seen in the trees and the fields all around us. It's also a very relaxing colour.

#### Sea Sunday

ea Sunday led by the Lay Team with speaker David Major (Reader) has been celebrated at Hemyock Parish Church. Sea Sunday is a global celebration of the enduring and vital work of the Mission to Seafarers which has taken place for over 160 years. It provides help and support to the 1.5 million men and women who face danger every day in bringing goods to this and other countries keeping our global economy afloat.

St Mary's had a display of artefacts, papers, photos, books etc for the congregation to see. These had been supplied by Brian Samuels and sisters Patricia Fuller and Janice Bawler who have all had family and friends involved in life at sea. One item belonging to the women was dated from 1904 and showed their grandfathers numerous voyages around the world from Argentina to China. It was also known that when the Titanic sank his ship would have been close enough to help in the rescue of those involved had the ship had a radio system. The crew were not aware of the tragedy until they returned to port.

Brian's father had served on Cunard's MV Georgic. This was shown in a photo display which included prints of the Royal group of docks area, London which included Brian's grandparents house, a large part of his childhood, which was bombed during WW2.

Mission to Seafarers provide a global network of chaplains, staff and volunteers to offer practical, emotional and spiritual support to seafarers through ship visits, drop in centre, and a range of welfare and emergency support. #### We Are The Champions!

hey say that in any sporting contest home advantage is a benefit not to be scorned. In football where the away supporters are often a relatively small percentage of the total crowd this is well known. But in bellringing??!!??

Well yes, apparently. The recent national striking competition for 12 bell ringing was held in our Diocesan Cathedral and the home team won!! Ringing very heavy bells is special skill within bellringing and there is only one other ring of bells with a heavier tenor bell than Exeter (Liverpool Cathedral at 82 cwt) and they were not in the final.

Over the early afternoon of June 22<sup>nd</sup> 10 teams rung a test piece of "Stedman Cinques" carefully listened to by team of Judges, as well as a large number of supporters for all the competing teams. People cheering on Leeds, Oxford, Bristol, Melbourne (in Derbyshire) amongst them, along with 3 members of the Hemyock band rooting for the home team.

Ringing over, there was a service of Evensong in the Cathedral, then we gathered for the results. These were given out in reverse order and tension grew each time we were not called out. Then it was down to 3, Exeter, hot favourites and current title holders Birmingham, and the Ancient Society of College Youths (a ringing group founded in the 1600s).

"Third place - ASCY" - Hold breath!...

"Second place..." - a pause that seem to go on for ages -

"...Birmingham "

Exeter had done it!!! By three points 85 to 82 they took the Taylor Trophy for the first time. The sunshine of the day took on an extra glow. Who knows, perhaps one day the young ringers currently starting out on their ringing journey ringing in Hemyock might be a member of another winning Exeter team. Who knows...

The Taylor Trophy is given by the firm of John Taylors of Loughborough, who have been casting bells since the 1500s and are probably the oldest continuously trading firm in the UK. They rehung Hemyock bells in 1983. If you want to know more about ringing contact the Tower Captain in any of our three Benefice churches.

## Hemyock Parish Hall Management Committee (HPHMC)

ince the last 'Pump' entry, HPHMC has been very active. The AGM has taken place, and the officers were re elected. (See below for details). At the meeting following the AGM, Heather Stallard announced that she would like to step down as one of the trustees of the committee. Heather has been involved with the HPHMC for almost 50 years, serving as both secretary and chair at various times. Recently her involvement has been as representative of the Saturday market. The committee and everyone involved with the HPHMC would like to thank Heather for her significant and valuable service and contribution over the many years.

Over the past few weeks, the hall and Forbes Lounge has been painted and decorated. When choosing new colours, the committee recognised that it's always difficult to please everybody, but they tried to put a fresh look to what is after all a 1920's building. I hope that users appreciate the clean lines that the work has brought to the hall.

Our thanks also to Phil Oaten for working around regular users to minimise the impact that the work had on hall revenue. In addition to routine maintenance of the hall and recreation field, there are always projects of one sort or another for the committee to consider. Three particular issues at present are replacing the moulded plastic chairs with something a little more comfortable, the recreation field fence, (either replacement or extensive repair), and the children's play area. The first two are relatively straight forward. However, play areas are now rarely looked after by local authorities, and whilst the committee could take their begging bowl to the Parish Council, the reality is that like so many fringe community amenities, there is enormous pressure through local authority funding. The committee has acquired some funds to help with refurbishment, and must shortly decide the best way forward. We are always keen to know what local residents thinks about such projects, so if you have ideas or thoughts about the play park, please let a committee member know.

As well as events such as private parties and functions, dances, and dinners, the hall is used for activities such as badminton, short mat bowls, drama rehearsals and performances, and toddlers sessions. Of course, there is also the snooker club and (during the season) the cricketers make use of the recreation field. There is a well appointed kitchen, a bar area, and for a small charge, an alcohol licence. There is also good car park facilities, although these can be at a premium at peak times.

#### **Devon Historic Churches Day**

aturday 14th September is Devon Historic Churches Day.

It's a day when there is the opportunity to take a moment to appreciate the amazing variety of church buildings that cover our county. Many people take the opportunity to visit several in the day and get sponsored for the Devon Historic Churches Trust, a group which offers financial assistance to churches requiring repairs.

There are many ways of putting a trail together. Walking round all the churches in central Exeter contrasts the majesty of the Cathedral with the tiny medieval churches almost in its shadow. Cycling down the Tarka trail offers a whole variety, as would trying to visit the range of churches considered "chapels of ease", like Culm Davy. You could visit all the churches in one of the Deaneries of the Church of England. Or maybe some of the post Reformation buildings of our "Nonconformist" friends.

You could aim for some of the more isolated ones, like my favourite Brent Tor, proudly sitting atop its hill defying the Dartmoor weather. Brides there arrive in 4 x 4s!

Details can be found on the DHCT website, and will also be available in St Mary's in August. One nice touch about this sponsor scheme is that you get to choose where 50% of any money you raise goes to. One could suggest one of the three ex-cruciform Norman churches not too far away.

#### **Ballroom Dancing**

Ballroom Dancing is a great deal of fun! But a recent survey suggests that there are physical, and mental benefits to this form of gentle exercise. Dancing requires both mental and physical agility. Remembering the steps learned and following them to music increases mental capacity and physical ability. 

#### **History Group Report**

he talk in May was from Derek Gore of Exeter University on the Vikings in Devon, a fascinating period in west country history. The origin and formation of the Viking raiding parties were explained and specific points of attack detailed. Exeter, Countisbury Head and the River Parrot became targets. The book on the Vikings written by Derek Gore is available should any member wish to borrow it.

The June talk was on the History of Hemyock with the Saxon words Ham, and enclosure and ock, an oak tree forming the derivation of the name.

The Domesday Book recorded the settlement as Hamock. A number of historical figures were connected to the Hemyock area through ownership of the Hemyock Castle Estate and through this connection major historical events are connected to the area. Throughout history the Church was at the centre of the community with the Manor House built by the de Hydon family alongside the Church. Margaret de Hydon married into other established wealthy families in the South West increasing the size of the family estates. One of the families she married into was the Dynehams who supported Edward IV who may have sheltered at Hemyock Castle during the wars of the Roses. Sir John Popham bought the Castle in the 16th century and General Simcoe in the 18th Century both of whom added an International flavour to Hemyock. With the industrialisation of the 19th and 20th century the arrival of trains resulted in the expansion of the Milk Factory taking Devon milk up to London the same day it left the cow. The growth of the farming community in the area and the technical approach fostered by the young farmers resulted in the formation of the official Association of Young Farmers in Hemyock which grew into a National organisation. The centenary of the formation of the Young Farmers will be celebrated next year in Hemyock.

The History Group will be spending more time on research and archiving activities next year and members are requested to suggest suitable subjects of interest. Please contact the web site www.blackdownarchives.org.uk.

#### to Eastern Europe. Whether or not you are someone who supports **Thy Kingdom Come 30th May – 9th June**

**T**ith the leadership of David Major, all the denominations within our villages decided to embrace the concept of "Thy Kingdom Come" between Ascension Day and Pentecost this year. It was initiated by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York as a time to show the "Power of Prayer" in people's lives, and has been followed by Christians all over the world.



The period started here with a 24-hour prayer vigil in St. Mary's Church, Hemyock with many people from the area each coming to pray for an hour at a time for everyone in our communities and especially those in any kind of need. This was followed the next morning by "Prayer from on High", in which groups met at the highest accessible point of each village, again to pray for our communities.

All of the churches stayed open during the period as long as possible and provided prayer stations and also prayer boxes for private prayer requests; prayer requests were also available in the "Half Moon" and local shops. On the 2nd Saturday morning, Clayhidon held a "Crafty Church" event for the younger members of the congregation on a theme of "Daniel in the Lion's Den".

We know that there were a number of members of our communities who engaged with these opportunities for prayer and we are confident that they found them helpful. All requests were treated confidentially. On Pentecost Sunday a mass celebration from across the Diocese took place at Exeter Cathedral: the "Beacon" event. This was a big service of thanksgiving and prayers, with various groups (including schools as well as churches) placing prayer stations in the side chapels.

#### The Violet Chapman Trust

The Violet Chapman Charity (Charity registration number 299996) was established in 1986 after Mrs Violet Chapman, who was a patient of the Blackdown Practice, gave a substantial gift to the doctors, which was intended to provide patients with services and help that were not available under the NHS.

The original Trustees were Dr Jonathan Meads, Mrs Chapman and Sir Christopher who, at that time, was senior partner with Ashfords Solicitors and one time president of the Law Society. The Trustees were, at this time, all volunteers not drawing any salary or expenses, and this remains the case to date.

The Trust has discretion to give grants for medical equipment and treatments as well as giving financial assistance to patients of the Blackdown Practice for numerous purposes.

All grants are given for the physical and mental wellbeing of the patients, and many will gain support by the help the Trust gives in supplying counselling where the NHS is unable to supply.

There are many examples that we could give of the patients we have helped recently and would cite one that required

their bathroom to be modernised to enable them to continue to live at home; another patient who needed a chair that would help them in getting in and out without assistance. Another example is a patient who had severe back pain and a grant was given for them to have remedial

If you feel the Trust can help you we would suggest you talk to your GP or any person who gives you support and submit an Application form which can be found online or pick one up from any of the Blackdown Practice surgeries. 

#### Dear Residents

Vou may have picked up from the media, concerns about closing 8 fire stations, this has hit the public attention for fear of a reduction in fire and rescue service. Although there are no planned fire station closures in our area, there might be reductions in fire stations of a number of fire appliances that will cover our area. I am a member of the fire authority. This exercise is all about creating a better service that will attract more fire and rescue staff, and to pay them better renumerations, because employees and self-employed are under paid for their services to the fire service, compared to what they can earn doing their day job.

The Fire Authority needs to make savings of £8m in the coming years. Some of the savings that will be made will go to increased inspections and home visits to make homes and business premises safer. This is only a public consultation document, not a done deal, the Fire Authority want the public to put forward their comments/views, this will then be analysed, depending on the outcome, this will then be put to the Authority later this year.

A media release last week from f40 shows £12.6bn in extra funding is needed by 2022/23. Several schools now close early on Fridays to save money and resulting in rising class sizes. James McInnes, our man at County and chairman of the f40 says; "Headteachers are telling us that they simply can't operate within the budgets they are given and that means cuts are being made to both staff and the curriculum. Nobody wants to see education of our children suffering, so we need to do something now before we get long term damage. We also want to see fairer distribution of school budgets. We here in Devon see £274 per child less than the national average, which amounts to approx. £20 million, just think what we could do with that. All children deserve an excellent education, regardless of where they live. We will keep up the fight.

Grass cutting is always contentious. Devon's policy is to cut the grass at junctions, laybys and the inside of bends to ensure road users have adequate visibility. The frequency of cutting is on an 'as needed' basis. Skanska are the main contractors and have 9 teams, they have invested in new machinery while covering 405 parishes. 38 Parishes have taken up the option to cut their own grass and get compensated by County.

Devon is responsible for 90,000 street lights across the County. Since 2008 we have converted approx.. 55,000 lanterns to 'part night' and replaced 27,000 lanterns with LED units. By the end of 2018 part night lighting will have reduced our consumption by approx. 41%. In addition we are embarking on a programme to replace a further 45,000 street lights with LED units over the next 3 years, and when completed we will be fully LED, reducing energy and Co2.

Any road repairs/potholes that you feel needs attention, it is much better to go on line and report, that triggers an inspection of the whole road. The definition of a pothole is 40mm by 300mm.

As always, I am here to help if anyone has any issues they need to take up with me.

Her name is Rev Canon Becky Totterdell from Exeter


Cathedral. We are so looking forward to meeting her.

Usually it's just me and Daisy on the roof debating this matter or that following whatever has just aired on Radio 4, but with the carpenter's radio set to 'Heart' and plenty of banter between all of us, we're about 5 weeks adrift of any current affairs. Except the cricket, about which the builder is passionate, so we are more up to date than perhaps we thought we needed to be on that one! There are other differences from working for a private client: Health and Safety is more of a challenge with so many more people on site, and more coming and going on the scaffold, and although part of this means keeping everything tidy, it's not the same as trying to keep a customer's garden from the worst ravages of feet, tools and waste reed that seems to weave it's way through every delicate plant. We can work whatever hours we like with no fear of interrupting a weekend's peace, although conversely that means we've not had a full weekend off for some while. All in all it feels good to be part of a bigger team working to a common goal, and most days have in them much laughter and plenty of tea.

The wheat reed that we were lucky enough to find in April, has been very good to work with, with very little waste..so now we watch the weather with fingers crossed for a decent harvest and the opportunity to buy in some more. Daisy also her fingers crossed for Jelly, who she has just entered into the Lurcher and Whippet race at the upcoming Yarcombe Terrier Races. Having just chased every living thing from one end of Saunton Sands to the other, Daisy is optimistic, but for my money, it'll be a miracle if Jelly can hold a straight line to the finish. Thanks to Yarcombe young farmers and the Meyrick family for continuing with this firm favourite in our country calendar, and we shall hope to see you all there.

#### Otterhead Update

#### Friends of Otterhead

This autumn we will be launching the Friends of Otterhead. This will enable people who know and love Otterhead to play a role in its future, to share information with each other, and to support the work of the Trust in maintaining and restoring this lovely nature reserve. For a small annual fee, members will receive newsletters keeping them in touch with what's going on at Otterhead, receive invitations to Friends' events, join work parties and to be represented at the annual Advisory Group. We'll update you all further when the group is up & running!

#### **AONB Biodiversity Forum**

On 5 June 2019, the Blackdown Hills AONB Biodiversity Forum met at Otterhead Lakes to have their 6-monthly catch-up on biodiversity related projects and site visit to see the beaver activity (led by Jake Chant of Devon Wildlife Trust). The group of biodiversity enthusiasts enjoyed the hospitality of the

Otterhead Lakes Trust and Forest School at the coach house and were bowled over by the site visit, where the group saw first-hand the impressive dams and bunds that the beavers have been constructing, in order to create shallow pools to encourage their willow tree food. Incredibly, this is the only wild colony of beavers in England.

#### Otterhead Foliage Report May-June

The first Heritage Rhododendron survey of this year was carried out in May and found that the 'Baroness Henry Schroeder' – a Rhododendron hybrid plant – returned from the Mallet Court Nursery is blossoming with beautiful trusses of pink flowers. Cherry Laurel (Prunus laurocerasus) is arguably the most invasive alien plant found on the Otterhead Estate where it was planted as hedges, probably game cover, and individual shrubs in the ornamental grounds surrounding Otterhead House (demolished in 1952) now in the parishes of Churchstanton and Otterford. Historic references to Portugal or Portuguese Laurel could be the result of misidentification as the only laurel now present is Cherry Laurel where jungles of this shrub have formed since the grounds ceased to be tended just prior to the Second World War. The present management policy is to restore overgrown laurel hedges as heritage features and to cut back other laurel to leave the original plants.
