# THE BLACKDOWN H LLS TRUST

The Blackdown Hills Trust is looking for local volunteers to help check stock fencing around the grazing units in the Neroche Forest area. These sites are managed by the Blackdown Hills Trust in the Blackdown Forest for grazing conservation: they are a magnet for rare butterflies such as Wood White and Duke of Burgundy and an array of plants, insects, birds and mammals. The areas are part of a Higher Level Stewardship and are grazed by English Longhorn cattle in the summer months.

#### What will the volunteer role involve?

The role will involve walking the stock fence twice a year during the spring and autumn in the grazing compartments to check for any rotten posts or damage to the wire, and reporting back to the Trust. There may also be opportunities to get involved in practical conservation work, for example clearing conifer re-growth to allow native flora to thrive.

Full training will be provided for the role, including maps of the sites, appropriate contact information and information on what to look out for.





#### **Comfort and Joy**

'O, tidings of comfort and joy': these words, recognisable from
the refrain of the carol 'God rest you merry, Gentlemen', have
been adopted by the Church of England as its theme for
Christmas and the weeks that precede it. Christmas should be a
time when we are able to experience joy as we spend time with
family or friends, or just chilling out without the pressure of
going to work, and the comfort of warm homes and good food.

But for many – particularly those who have been bereaved or
are living alone - Christmas can be a time
when joy feels in short supply, precisely

"The word comfort derives from

when joy feels in short supply, precisely because of the memories of happier times spent with family who are no longer there. While still others, especially the homeless and refugees, can expect little in the way of comfort.

This year, Christmas will feel different for many more of us because of the restrictions imposed in response to Coronavirus, not to mention the gloom associated with news of so many people suffering illness, dying, or losing their livelihoods.

Victims of domestic abuse might well feel that their cage has turned into a prison. So where, you might ask, is the comfort and joy to be found?

The Christmas story has some pretty uncomfortable moments.

For example, no room for an exhausted young couple at the Inn; a paranoid king murdering innocent children; and the aged

Simeon prophesying that Mary's child would bring her grief.

The word comfort derives from the concept of strengthening, and means 'consoling, or trying to make someone better after feeling sad or worried'. And there is comfort in the reason why a helpless baby was born to a young Jewish woman in an obscure backwater of the Roman empire over 2000 years ago. Christians believe that child was how the all-powerful God was able to enter our world, to experience human life with all its highs and lows, and to make it possible for us to draw closer to him.

As we pass through these difficult times, the knowledge that God understands our hopes and fears because his Son Jesus has shared our human existence can be a source of comfort and joy.

# **Annual Meeting of Churches**

ue to the unprecedented times we are living in the annual meeting of churches was delayed from Spring to Autumn and St Mary's with Culm Davy Chapel, Hemyock held theirs following a morning service.

After 10 years' service as a Churchwarden Jenny Doble had decided to resign. Being warmly thanked for all she had done Jenny was presented with a bird feeding station and bouquet by fellow Warden David Bawler and church treasurer Hazel Partridge.

The Vestry meeting where Wardens are elected saw David Bawler, church, and Mark Fitzgerald chapel re-elected with Sarah Folland replacing Jenny Doble.

Rev Canon Becky Totterdell chaired the annual meeting looking back over the year since she had appointed. The first few months had followed the usual pattern but lockdown had changed things with services and other church activities stopped or altered. Zoom services had become the way of worship with regular congregation numbering between 40-50 but she expressed sadness that not everyone had this facility. It was hoped that the weekly, and much improved Link sheet, along with service sheets and phone calls meant everyone felt cared for. Even if no congregational singing was allowed and face masks had to be worn the Rector felt it was good to be back worshipping together mentioning that the lockdown had caused the first closure of churches for over 800 years.

Thanks we're expressed to all the Wardens for their unflagging care of the church and chapel, to the retired clergy and Readers for their support and to all who in any way contribute to the life and ministry of the parish.

The Rector expressed the need to focus on sustaining worship of God and for caring for the local community which she felt St Mary's had interconnected very well with. She ended with the thought that "We can go into the unknown without anxiety, but with trust instead in Gods goodness".

Hazel Partridge, PCC treasurer, reported that the two major fundraisers, summer fete and Christmas Fair, would see a loss of income but a gift day had proved to be successful. Financially things would be tight and spending would need to be carefully monitored.



# Christian Response to Eastern Europe (cr2ee) **Christmas Appeal**

Tow! What a tremendous response to cr2ee this year – thanks in no small part to lockdown as we all sorted through our cupboards, wardrobes, toys and equipment.

Your generosity sees us making a couple of trips to the charity depot in Exmouth every year - during 2020 we have made 6. All have seen our car filled to the brim but there have been two exceptions when the trailer has also been piled high with clothing, bedding, walking aids and other donations. One was quite soon after the first lockdown and the other as we entered the second when Christmas boxes filled the car with a tarpaulin holding down all the bags piled high on the trailer. At the depot it took 1hr 20minutes to unload as the boxes, usually around 6-8, have to be placed in large clear polythene bags for transportation.

We are aware that some local people have made private financial donations, and that of clothes, which cr2ee are most grateful for but we thought the following may be of interest and are things we received and delivered on 4th November.

- 110 Christmas boxes of all sizes including 4 very large ones for families.
- Culmstock kindly took their collection of 27 boxes to Exmouth which we were grateful for as we could not have fitted them into the car. Things were so tight we had one of Father Christmas' cuddly elves sat on the passenger's lap! He certainly caused some amusement as we drove along the motorway.
- 3 boxes of food
- 9 bags and a large storage box of knitted garments
- 53 bags of clothing etc.
- £405 donated from those unable to fill a box this year
- Thanks to the local press, social media and the Parish Pump, donations have flooded in coming from as far apart as Morchard Bishop to Crewkerne and many places in between.
- Tiverton Youth Centre held an event to raise the cash needed to buy the goods to fill their boxes
- A 90 year old Cullompton lady knitted 45 childrens cardigans and jumpers.
- A Wellington shoe shop donated a number of pairs of new slippers and other goods including the Elf! Whilst a ladies group in the town put together a number of boxes and knitted numerous items.
- A couple from Taunton donated 6 almost new thick winter coats.

Whilst in Yeovil on hearing of the charity on local radio a couple donated some walking aids and towels as well as filling 9 boxes with gifts... and finally, this year Culmstock joined the residents of Hemyock and Clayhidon and others in the surrounding area who have supported cr2ee for many years.

Moldova is, as many will know, Europe's poorest country. The country has seen a bad harvest this year, soup kitchens are needed, whilst Covid 19 has been globally devastating and seen many families lose much needed income as relatives working abroad have had to return home. Your support will help make a real difference to their lives. On behalf of the many people in Moldova who cr2ee support, visit and at times live with an enormous "THANK YOU".





Volunteering can be hugely rewarding and is a great way of gaining work experience or new skills whilst "giving something back". You get to know people in your local community who will appreciate your help and reward you with their humour, wisdom and often their friendship. Many people have enjoyed volunteering for their community during the Covid-19 pandemic and evidence shows that helping others can also improve our own health and well-being.

The Blackdown Support Group is a local charity, established in 1991, and linked to the Blackdown GP Practice. We offer practical and social Volunteer-led support to anyone in need in the Blackdown Hills area - this includes community transport, social clubs, befriending and mentoring, bereavement and carer support, help with form filling, footcare, wheelchair loans and advice about other services.

Our aims are to reduce social isolation, facilitate access to services and improve quality of life for people suffering the effects of loneliness, social isolation, financial difficulty, old age or ill health. Often by improving access to social activities and services, people are able to improve their health and well-being. The Blackdown Support Group enables them to get around more easily, to meet and make friends and to feel they are cared for.

We are currently recruiting for new volunteers in the following areas:

#### MEDICAL TRANSPORT DRIVERS

Our Volunteer drivers provide a critical service transporting people to important medical appointments either at local surgeries or to hospitals in Somerset and Devon. If you have a little spare time, your own vehicle, and would like to support your community in a flexible and fulfilling way please get in touch. Full safety guidance and PPE will be provided, expenses are paid and we are happy to work around any other commitments you may have.

Our drivers are often the only social contact an isolated person might have and the chat on the way to an appointment can be as important as the journey itself.

## BEFRIENDERS

Our volunteer befrienders and mentors offer face to face and/ or telephone support of a social or practical nature to people who may be housebound, lonely, isolated or experiencing difficulties because of medical conditions, caring commitments, low mood or financial insecurity. Often the support required is as simple as having a chat, making the person you are supporting feel that they are listened to and that they are not



alone. You will be an important link to their local community, making them feel connected and included. You may be asked to support someone to achieve small practical goals which can be hugely beneficial in improving feelings of anxiety or loneliness.

We also offer support with navigating care options or filling in forms to ensure people can stay in their own homes safely and have access to financial support where applicable.

#### DIGITAL SUPPORTERS

Could you help someone to navigate basic online tools such as Skype, Zoom or Facetime to help them connect with others digitally? Or support them to access important information which is often only available online? Support would be offered over the phone or in person when restrictions allow and could be a lifeline for someone whose normal social activities have been significantly reduced due to the pandemic.



# Point of Light Award for Devon Clinical Psychologist

Devon based Clinical Psychologist has been awarded the Prime Minister's Point of Light award in recognition of his work in founding and leading www.Project5.org, a professional volunteer service offering wellbeing support to the national NHS team.

Dr Craig Newman, a Devon based Clinical Psychologist and leadership coach, predicted the potential for NHS staff burnout and struggles in the wake of COVID-19 in March, when the threat of the pandemic was starting to be recognised. He comments, "it was clear at the start of COVID-19 that there were risks to NHS staff of being exhausted, traumatised and highly anxious in response to the crisis. Even before COVID-19, mental health issues and burnout were seen as a significant issue for NHS staff, with almost half of the workforce (40%) already reporting feeling unwell as a result of work-related stress in the last 12 months (NHS Staff Survey, 2019)"

In response to this, in March, Dr Newman promoted a call to action to the professional coaching and therapy sectors to ask who would support NHS staff. Over 5,000 professionals volunteered. This was a much larger number than expected and presented significant challenges— how to select who was appropriately qualified,

how to ensure they use the correct support approach, how to supervise them and how to link NHS staff who need help to the best suited volunteer.

In response to these challenges, in April, Dr Newman and Dr Cordet Smart (also a Chartered Psychologist) – both local to Clayhidon formed the not for profit company, Project High 5. The name of the company represented the desire to celebrate the work of the staff, to offer a 'High 5', this being the values he hoped to install – to celebrate and support the team as they support the nation. A national campaign was also started, at https://www.highfiveourcarers.org/ to raise awareness and funds to support this ambition.

In the space of a few months, a team of skilled clinicians, researchers and software engineers was formed who created an amazing solution at record pace. A national service was created in under 2 months (www.project5.org) which now offers thousands of wellbeing appointments every month, free to NHS staff. The Project5 team screened and selected over 1,000 best qualified volunteers, trained them in an approach developed for the NHS team and identified and provided training to supervisors to support this volunteer pool. A new digital booking system was developed, making it easy for NHS staff to find a supporter who is best suited to their needs – providing access to support sessions often in less than 24 hours.

The service has provided a 3-session course of solution / wellbeing support to over 700 NHS staff members since it launched officially in May, with a steady flow of about 10 NHS staff a day booking into the system to get help. Their work has been endorsed by most leading coaching organisations and sector charities, and works alongside the NHS wellbeing

taskforce. The service has been built out of donated time and skill, costing nothing to the NHS and remains free.

Project5 has a lot more capacity available than is being used, which will be invaluable as the current threats to the NHS system and team are increasing as winter arrives. Increasing burnout and stress are being reported nationally in the NHS, with exhaustion remaining from COVID wave 1 as the work to meet COVID wave 2 begins.

Project5 remains a volunteer led organisation, for which the award from the Prime Minister recognises. Boris wrote directly to Dr Newman, stating, "From the initial inspiration of your #highfiveourcarers campaign to the fantastic breadth of your brilliant Project 5, you have brought together an army of more than 1,000 researchers, coaches and therapists to support those working in every part of our NHS." Boris added, "Your endeavours are only more important at this time when our

amazing NHS staff have faced such pressures and when we owe so much to them for all that they have done to save lives."

Dr Newman was thankful for the award and commented, "Project5 is a critical service to NHS staff in the coming winter, as it focuses on supporting

their success during crisis and helps them to maintain balance in life and work – rather than waiting for longer-term mental health issues that may cripple the ability to work. Getting the message to staff that we are here is essential and we ask the public to tell their NHS working neighbours about our offer".

Feedback from NHS staff members is very positive, with one clinician writing how "it felt like you were holding my hand" whilst many refer to the benefits at work and at home, reflecting how the challenges for staff are felt through all of their lives.

Project5.org is a free service to enable NHS staff to succeed at work, built on evidence and independent from the NHS. Providing a confidential place for NHS staff to get the support early, to be successful. Sharing the awareness of this service is the main ask of Dr Newman, so please tell anyone you know in the NHS to visit the site if they feel stressed or out of balance, as the winter progresses.

The service is free and is also collecting public donations, on the same website, to cover delivery costs.

# The Violet Chapman Trust

The Violet Chapman Charity (Charity registration number 299996) was established in 1986 after Mrs Violet Chapman, who was a patient of the Blackdown Practice, gave a substantial gift to the doctors, which was intended to provide patients with services and help that were not available under the NHS.

The original Trustees were Dr Jonathan Meads, Mrs Chapman and Sir Christopher who, at that time, was senior partner with Ashfords Solicitors and one time president of the Law Society. The Trustees were, at this time, all volunteers not drawing any salary or expenses, and this remains the case to date.

The Trust has discretion to give grants for medical equipment and treatments as well as giving financial assistance to patients of the Blackdown Practice for numerous purposes.

All grants are given for the physical and mental wellbeing of the patients, and many will gain support by the help the Trust gives in supplying counselling where the NHS is unable to supply.

There are many examples that we could give of the patients we have helped recently and would cite one that required

their bathroom to be modernised to enable them to continue to live at home; another patient who needed a chair that would help them in getting in and out without assistance. Another example is a patient who had severe back pain and a grant was given for them to have remedial massage.

If you feel the Trust can help you we would suggest you talk to your GP or any person who gives you support and submit an Application form which can be found online or pick one up from any of the Blackdown Practice surgeries. 

# **Wellington Monument Repair Update**

Te're pleased to be able to update you on the continued progress at Wellington monument. We are delighted that we now have just under £380,000 to raise. The project was one of a handful that the National Trust were able to continue despite the impact of the first wave of Covid-19. It is still on track to finish at the end of May 2021 and we are working to understand the impact of the latest restrictions though are hopeful that construction can continue.

Throughout these difficult days, Wellington Monument has continued to bring a sense of hope to us all. Seeing the works continue has been a lifeline for some. One local woman, who has been told to self-isolate, told us how she watches the works from her bedroom window with binoculars. Around 1,500 stones have now been replaced. The new pyramidion blocks are much larger than the original to reduce water ingress. Some weigh as much as 1,800kg. The only piece of stone that could be re-used was the capstone at the very top of the monument. On 21st October, on a grey drizzling day, a crane had to lift this stone to a height of 73 metres. It was then lowered to 53 metres and back into place with cheers from the onlookers. Coincidentally this was the anniversary of 203 years of the foundation stone being placed. A real moment in history for the monument.

The scaffolding continues to impress; by some it is affectionally called the "Monument launch pad". There are roughly 250 steps and one stonemason calculated that he had climbed the equivalent of Everest; he is now on the way down! The stone masons are all very proud to be working on this project. A few are local and see the work as their legacy.

As for fundraising, we are collecting donations in return for pieces of monument stone that cannot be reused. A brilliant c£2,000 has been raised so far. People can either pick up their

stone from the Monument volunteers on Sundays by the car park or from Odette's tea-room in Wellington. One person has built a piece into his new fireplace. One fragment has been taken to Wellington, New Zealand whilst another is being sent to someone whose Grandmother was born and bred in Wellington. The Grandmother calls Wellington Monument her 'birthstone'. Still the stories pour in.

We are about to launch another fundraiser, called Memories in the Monument. All through the project people have told us their memories and their reasons why the monument means so much to them. We wanted to find a safe Covid secure way of letting people place these memories, stories or messages into the structure itself. Hence, we are asking people to send us a small letter on A5 paper with a suggested donation of £50. Their stories will be in the heart of the monument; placed behind the stones in the plinth.

So, enthusiasm is infectious as we know. Maybe it is because we need a glimmer of hope, maybe it is because the project is coming to an end? Maybe it is because people are remembering their times at the monument? Maybe it is because new memories are being created. Whatever it is, Wellington Monument is that place not just for the community but for anyone who has been part of it.

# **Hemyock History Group**

History Groups for a November zoom talk from Amyas Crump on the Culm Valley Railway. There is little evidence today of either the Railway or the Culm Valley Dairy Factory that for about 100 years collected milk from farms in the Culm Valley, processed and filled railway tankers with milk so that London would have its morning doorstep deliveries. The history of these activities in Hemyock's industrial past can be seen on the blackdownarchives.org.uk web site where many other historic images are available to view. #### **LEAP News**

The pond at Longmead has long been in need of a clear out.

Over the last few years, it has become overgrown with invasive reedmace. This sucks out all the water in the Summer, and leaves the pond almost dry and uninviting for wildlife.


Our AONB grant has paid for renovation of the pond and the removal of the reedmace using an excavator.

In late October, a small band of socially-distanced volunteers, made short work of coppicing and pruning the goat willow growing alongside the pond. Nick Thompson then got to work with his brush cutter to clear a path through the undergrowth, to allow the excavator access.

Phase one of work is now completed. Phillip Palfrey arrived with all the kit, got skilfully to work, and the pond is already looking much better. Debris removed from the pond has been left alongside it, to allow any creatures in the mud to slither back into the water. Phase two- the renovation of the second half of the pond, will take place in January. By the Spring it will be wildlife ready.







# **Hemyock Wildflower Verges**

grant from The Blackdown Hills Transition Group has enabled a small group of volunteers to plant patches of wildflowers alongside the road verges on the entrance to the village on the Culmstock and Culmbridge roads. They were only small patches of colour, but what a picture they were in August and September when they eventually flowered.

The wildflower seed, chosen for pollinators, to support our birds, bees and other wildlife included yellow rattle, betony, wild carrot, cornflower, poppy and cat's ear. It was sourced locally, and selected to include native wildflowers which will thrive in this area.

Lockdown prevented the seed being sown until early May, when small areas of turf and perennial weeds were removed to give the seed the best start. Unfortunately, we then had one of the driest Mays on record and despite watering the seeds every few days, all seemed lost and not a seed germinated. However, nature is very resilient, and when the rain eventually came in June, so the seed germinated and to great delight and some relief, the wildflowers flowered in August and September.

Thanks to Hemyock Parish Council, the council grass contractors know which areas to avoid strimming, and seed from this year's flowers will germinate early next year. We are hoping to enlarge the areas, year on year, and given the catastrophic demise of insect life worldwide over the last fifty years, it's the least we can do.

# Our Thatching Life, featuring Ferrari the Thatcher, Daisy, her dog, some cattle and the piglets...and a helpless kitten...

ime is a funny thing. We talk about 'dog years' where they live perhaps one year for seven of ours, but piglets live at L break neck speed it seems to me. Having said they were time wasters, easy to watch as they grew in confidence exploring their world, all of a sudden 6 weeks had passed and now they are weaned, enjoying the apples left over from Daisy's cider making at Bollhayes and eating me out of house and home. 12 cute little piglets are fast becoming 12 little pigs.

The cattle are slower of course, ambling through life at a much more peaceful pace...unless you've a sack of cow cake in hand in which case 'Bossy' the lead cow does a great impression of a Thelwell pony galloping across the field. Even so the 30 months seems to have rolled around quick enough for Daisy's first bullock to go off to the abattoir. She and her daughter were out at first light to get him in to the trailer all calm and kindness, while I slipped on the gate and fair threw myself over behind him. Luckily he took no notice of me, and just walked untroubled into the trailer. Meanwhile the heifers are in calf we hope, so we can look forward to new life in the spring.

The thatching work is much the same with time seeming to stretch out forever on a large roof, and then to collapse to the density of a black hole as the pressure mounts to keep people from leaking under all the rain. Of late we've worked every day except the weekends we have with our children, with Daisy working into the dark on one job, and me up and away early to another. Prices of materials are volatile at the moment, with a lacklustre wheat reed harvest at home and concerns for the costs of shipping water reed mounting as we move toward Brexit. I imagine the growers are praying for stable weather next year in these most unstable of times.

Halfway thru thatching this big roof we are on a mewling, yowling sound punctuated our day, and again the next, and the next. Off the scaffold and out to find the source of it: a tiny black kitten under a hedge at the edge of a rabbit warren. No mother in sight; neither the customer nor the farmer knew it or anything about it, other than it had been there for 3 days howling. It took some catching; several days of leaving food for it and waiting nearby, still no sign of the mother, before tempting it into a crate. I turned the cattle trailer into a kitten nursery, with branches to climb and toys to play with, and now it's in the dairy growing well and winding itself around my boots purring louder than you'd think such a little thing could. Hopefully she will stay about the yard and help guard the reed for us.

Then there was the white tailed sea eagle I saw on the way to work, two days in a row; absolutely massive. It's things like this, saving the kitten, seeing the eagle, taking part in all the cycles of the year that give me a feeling of wonder and hope, hope for new life, the next season whatever it brings. Certainly there will be challenges, but there will be magic too. Wherever you find your wonder or your magic, I hope you do this Christmas.

# Residents Give Their Views on Hall's Future

ocal people have given a clear view on how they would like to see Clayhidon Parish Hall develop. More than 100 responded to a questionnaire that asked whether the hall committee should stick to its plans to improve and extend the existing hall or build a brand-new hall if sufficient funds became available.

Their verdict was a resounding yes to the existing plan. The question had been prompted by a suggestion that the parish council might spend an inheritance from Johnny Griss on building a modern hall. Before making any request to the council the committee wanted to check which option was favoured by locals.

Among parishioners the split was 61% for the old hall and 39% for a new building, and it was roughly the same when hall users from outside the parish were included.

The Covid crisis has halted all activity at the hall and prevented builders from starting work on the extension before planning permission expired this autumn.

In a Zoom meeting on November 11 the committee agreed to:

- review its plans in the light of Covid
- seek a renewal of planning permission
- get advice from an energy consultant on improving the insulation and heating
- invite builders to submit new quotes for the extension and old hall improvements


The hall already has £28,000 in the bank, but much more will be needed to complete the improvements and extension. Before seeking grants the committee must reconstitute itself as a modern charitable incorporated organisation (CIO) and it will be asking the Charity Commission to approve this soon.

Thank you to everyone who took the trouble to respond to the survey and especially to the many respondents who added interesting and thoughtful suggestions.

# **News From Rosemary Lane Chapel**

ncertain, unprecedented, unexpected... never before have these words been heard, read or spoken with such frequency. They are indicative of the impact that the Covid-19 pandemic has had on us as a nation and as a community here on the Blackdown Hills. Whilst we may not have felt the full force of the pandemic in the South West, very few have escaped the impact of isolation or the spread of fear. And yet, so often, when things appear at their darkest, we realise that we are not without hope... we rediscover the things that are of greatest value and, maybe for the first time, we discover that there is a light that shines in the darkness.

At Rosemary Lane Chapel, we rediscovered the gift and unquantifiable value of community. Prior to lockdown 2.0, we felt so very grateful to have been able to open the chapel from August until early November. Whilst maintaining compliance with social distancing and our detailed risk assessment, we were able to enjoy a good harvest celebration led by Richard Coles (Somerton) and were appreciative of the opportunity to partner

with others within our community at this time. Alongside supporting the work of CHAT's foodbank, we were thankful for provisions made available to continue our annual support of Mullers and Send a Cow.

In October, as we continued in our series in the book of Acts, we were reminded of how the early Church, though under intense pressure, grew in number and gave growth to relationships within and across communities. At RML, we were delighted to welcome Andrew Barnett of London City Mission in early November who joined us digitally to inform us of his work in Kensington. He spoke about how the first period of lockdown only increased his intent and passion to draw alongside people, supporting them where possible and sharing the good news of Jesus. Despite the distance, as he shared his update from his home in North London, Andrew's warmth was felt by all at RML. The same technology that made possible Andrew's visit, has been well used within the fellowship as we have continued midweek meetings with the use of Zoom. Although some of us need reminding that the power to 'mute' someone or put them back in the 'waiting room' doesn't necessarily mean that we should! In new, wonderful and creative ways, we have rediscovered the power of being present.

So, what next? Is Christmas cancelled? No! Now is exactly the time we need the message and meaning of Christmas. At this time of writing, while in lockdown, we are putting together plans for Christmas and what our celebrations and meetings might look like in this present climate of a pandemic. The one thing we can assure you of at this point is this: Whether we are meeting in person, or online, we will still be giving thanks for the One whom the Apostle Paul describes as the 'indescribable gift' (2 Corinthians 9:15).

You see, amidst the isolation, the loneliness, the apparent

hopelessness we have found ourselves in and the darkness of these days, we discover that there is a brilliant, radiant and glorious light that shines in the darkness. And this light, as the carol 'O little town of Bethlehem' reminds us, is the *everlasting light*. A light that casts out fear and gives enduring hope. It seems unlikely that we will be able to sing in our churches this Christmas, but the words of this much-loved carol touch not only our lips, but alight our hearts to the true source of hope and peace:

O little town of Bethlehem
How still we see thee lie
Above thy deep and dreamless sleep
The silent stars go by
Yet in thy dark streets shineth
The everlasting Light
The hopes and fears of all the years
Are met in thee tonight

God the Son, the Holy Child born of a virgin, came to give everlasting light and enduring hope. But how does this help us today? How does the message and meaning of Christmas give us hope in the midst of a pandemic? Well, the final verse of 'O little town of Bethlehem' reminds us of a name given to Jesus – Emmanuel – which means 'God with us.' Here and now! The everlasting light of

Jesus Christ, Emmanuel, means that Christmas is not just a past event remembered, not just the cause of a hoped-for future... but also peace today in the knowledge of His abiding presence and love! As one writer puts it, 'The object of hope is future. The experience of hope is present.'¹ This Christmas, my prayer for each of you, as it is for my family, is that we would rediscover the things of value. And that we would, maybe of the first time, rediscover the everlasting light of Jesus. May His presence and light in your life be the cause of peace today and bright hope for tomorrow.

# Blackdown Hills Repair Café continues through lockdown

Blackdown Hills Repair Café continues through lockdown. Throughout the lockdown period Stephan Lehner and the Blackdown Hills Repair Café repairers have been hard at work repairing a wide variety of items from televisions to toasters, shears to spades and radios to wristwatches. Stephan has been travelling the Blackdown Hills picking up items for repair and dropping them off to repairers in the area to save as many items from landfill as possible.

The total repairs carried out is 184 items, with over 85% of these successfully repaired and saved from Landfill. Working on approximate weights of items, this means the repair café have saved between 230 and 240 kilograms of items from going to landfill.

The results speak for themselves and demonstrate how the repair café can help the local community and also prevent further contamination of the environment.

This is open to people from Wellington too! Stephan uses his home as a hub for delivery and collection of items to be repaired and then distributes them to and from the Volunteer Repairers, who mend them at home in their own workshops.
