





### THE BLACKDOWN H LLS TRUST

The Blackdown Hills Trust is looking for local volunteers to help check stock fencing around the grazing units in the Neroche Forest area. These sites are managed by the Blackdown Hills Trust in the Blackdown Forest for grazing conservation: they are a magnet for rare butterflies such as Wood White and Duke of Burgundy and an array of plants, insects, birds and mammals. The areas are part of a Higher Level Stewardship and are grazed by English Longhorn cattle in the summer months.











uke of Burgundy and Wood White butterflies, just some of the species your work would help conserve.

### What will the volunteer role involve?

The role will involve walking the stock fence twice a year during the spring and autumn in the grazing compartments to check for any rotten posts or damage to the wire, and reporting back to the Trust. There may also be opportunities to get involved in practical conservation work, for example clearing conifer re-growth to allow native flora to thrive.

Full training will be provided for the role, including maps of the sites, appropriate contact information and information on what to look out for.

### Our return to the Churches!

am writing to let you know that we hope to return soon to meeting in our Church buildings for Sunday worship.

For some of you that will be very welcome news and not a moment too soon! Others I know will be much more cautious and not wish to return just yet to meeting with others. So we plan to have two streams of worship running after Easter Sunday: we will continue with our weekly zoom worship at 10.30am on Sundays, but add to that a 4.00pm service in one of our Benefice churches each Sunday. We will rotate around the three largest churches – Culmstock, Hemyock and Clayhidon. The one exception is Pentecost Sunday when we will hold a Benefice communion at St Andrew's Clayhidon in the morning, and a zoom Songs of Praise in the evening at 6.30pm.

If the weather is kind, we might hold some of the 4.00pm services outdoors in our churchyards rather than inside. If so, seating will be available outdoors.

The afternoon, 4.00pm service, will be a Communion service, but it will include the same readings, sermon and musical items as the morning service. Those receiving communion will, if they wish, be able to receive the wine of communion as well as the bread, by receiving a wafer which has been dipped in the wine.

At the afternoon services we will still need to wear face masks and keep socially distanced, and avoid mingling afterwards. Sadly, congregational singing is not allowed, and that is not likely to change for many months, even if we are meeting outside. However, we will include hymns and worship songs in our services, though only one person among those leading the music may sing on behalf of the whole congregation.

We will also continue to hold the short, Tuesday evening service of Night Prayer at 8.00pm, via zoom. Overleaf is the schedule for services for Holy Week, Easter, and





then from Easter Sunday to the end of June. You might like to have it pinned up in your kitchen or stuck to the fridge so that you don't lose it!

It will be lovely to see you in person if you feel able to attend a service, or virtually if you prefer to continue worshipping via zoom. It is important you do what you feel is right for you.

### The Next Job....continued

The news about the work on the bells in the last issue led to a few questions being asked, so we will try to answer them.

### Do bells really last 400 years?

Yes. Obviously it depends on how often they are rung to some extent and how they are looked after. You will find a few bells from the 1200s still being rung and bells from the 14th/15th centuries are relatively common.

One problem is that continued striking of the clapper in one spot wears a dent in the bell, which is treated by turning the bell so that the clapper hits a different spot. IF you don't the bell may crack. The first Exeter cathedral had 7 bells in 1050, and given that Bellfounders were in the habit of melting old bells down and casting a new bell from the metal, some of that metal could well be swinging in a tower near by. Mind you bells not rung last longer. You'll find some in China about 3000 years old.

### Why is only the treble being looked at, not bells 2-6?

The back 5 bells have a frame all to themselves which is not attached to the church in any way. The oak beams seen in the clock chamber and at floor level in the belfry take the weight of the bells down to the top of the Norman walls seen in the ringing room. The tower walls are like a sleeve not a support.

### What jobs need doing besides the treble frame?

Quite a bit of attention to the walls. Some years back a silicone spray was used on the outside of the walls because the interior was getting very wet. This proved effective, in fact too effective as the walls dried out and the damp areas turned to dust with no water to bind them together. Stresses and vibrations can then loosen the dust, so we need a major repointing exercise as well as getting the walls "solid" again. Dust is not a good thing to have around the bells' bearings. These fortunately are self aligning sealed units and have given no problems at all since being put in in 1983

There is also all the woodwork needing a refresh of preservative treatment, all the metal of the frame needs rubbing down and then re-painting (3 times), the bells' head stocks need painting and a non slip surface put on the top of the frame. (For this we use our "patented" budgie grit method). The roller boxes which guide the ropes need a little attention and then there's quite a bit of wall to paint. And a window to replace in the clock room.

### How much do the bells weigh?

Bells traditionally are measured in Hundredweights (1cwt =112pounds) So Treble 5.cwt, 2nd 7.25cwt, 3rd 7.75cwt, 4th 10.5cwt, 5th 14cwt and tenor 17 cwt, 3 quarters and 12lb. So, approximately 3 tons. And that is just the bells. It does not include the clappers, the head-stocks and all the other bits or the frame. Just goes to show that the Normans didn't do a bad job. Bet they'd be a bit surprised though!

If you wish to know more please ask. We cannot at present do "tours of the tower" but hopefully by summer we may be.

Last word! Did you note that one radio station has had in advertising their programme recordings had an intro on the "sounds we've missed during lockdown". The second sound was children playing and laughing, the first was bells ringing!



### Neroche Grazing Project Vandalism

s part of what is in fact a rewilding project, conifers were removed on over 500 acres of forest to allow the broad leafed trees underneath to flourish and to encourage the shrubs, wild flowers, gorse and bramble to establish itself.

Longhorn cattle were introduced to graze the areas in the summer and the two farmers who look after the cattle overwinter them on their farms.

We have recently introduced ponies to continue the suppression of species such as bramble, during the winter. One of the objectives is to improve the habitat for wildlife particularly butterflies, and in fact there are some SSSI areas within the project.

Recently we have experienced some vandalism at Culm Davy, where someone has been repeatedly cutting the fence wire. We have had to remove the ponies, as a result, because we cannot have loose ponies on the road. I would ask anyone who walks up at Culm Davy to keep an eye out for anyone acting suspiciously and report it to the police on 101. If we cannot stop this vandalism, the whole project will be effected.

Are those old tools just cluttering up your shed or garage? Do somebody a good turn! I can collect and forward these on to find a new home and be used to improve lives of others.

Following a recent appeal for tools via the weekly link sheet of the local Churches and also via their website www. culmkirks.co.uk, I received nine different offers of tools! These included tools for woodwork, brickwork, gardening, household repairs, hinges and 2 sewing machines (and 2 more promised). Some of the tools have already been given new handles. The tools are now in a barn awaiting collection, hopefully in April.

So, if you want to have a clear out, then I am very happy to collect and forward these tools on for use by others in poorer countries where tools of almost any kind can be, literally, a Godsend. There are many such charitable groups sending aid but the group we are particularly in touch with is Kira Farm, Uganda run by Amigos. This is a training college where students are giving training to set up in business. Tools for gardening, woodwork, mechanics, building, hairdressing and needlework all help students to learn their trade. Sewing machines are particularly precious. When students complete their training, they are sent home with the necessary tools to carry on their work.

As well as training at the College, another project overseen by Kira Farm is the Sustainable Community Development Programme. ### The Violet Chapman Trust

The Violet Chapman Charity (Charity registration number 299996) was established in 1986 after Mrs Violet Chapman, who was a patient of the Blackdown Practice, gave a substantial gift to the doctors, which was intended to provide patients with services and help that were not available under the NHS.

The original Trustees were Dr Jonathan Meads, Mrs Chapman and Sir Christopher who, at that time, was senior partner with Ashfords Solicitors and one time president of the Law Society. The Trustees were, at this time, all volunteers not drawing any salary or expenses, and this remains the case to date.

The Trust has discretion to give grants for medical equipment and treatments as well as giving financial assistance to patients of the Blackdown Practice for numerous purposes.

All grants are given for the physical and mental wellbeing of the patients, and many will gain support by the help the Trust gives in supplying counselling where the NHS is unable to supply.

There are many examples that we could give of the patients we have helped recently and would cite one that required

their bathroom to be modernised to enable them to continue to live at home; another patient who needed a chair that would help them in getting in and out without assistance. Another example is a patient who had severe back pain and a grant was given for them to have remedial massage.

### **Colonising the Culm**

Greg Chuter, previously the County archaeologist for E Sussex and now a member of Halberton History Group gave an interesting talk on prehistory in the Culm Valley. Based on discoveries of artefacts as a result of field walking, Lidor, geophys, crop marks and the National Mapping Programs from Historic England a detailed understanding of life through the Pliocene, Paleolithic, Mesolithic and

Neolithic eras has been documented. The Culm was formed when sea level was 30m below OD. The most interesting finding was that sea level in the Peleolithic era was 22.5m below OD when the first humans were active with flint tools and cave paintings being found. In the Mesolithic era sea level was 9m below OD when the impact of humans could be detected and the forming of Britain. The growing of crops could be detected in the Neolithic era with sites such as the Hembury Iron Age Fort. Causeways have been documented across the Culm Valley marking the cross country routes taken by early humans. Cullompton would appear to have been a favourite location for Human activity at this time with sea levels in the bronze age being 3m below OD. During this period axe heads and sites of enclosures with post holes have been found and ritual burial mounds at Ballbarrow and Craze Lowman. Greg Chuter would be available should any of our members wish to research this era in more detail.

### **Romans in Devon**

Bill Horner, the Devon County Archaeologist, gave a fascinating talk over zoom to History Group members throughout Devon on Friday 12th March.

Bill started by mentioning Belerion, which is the term for the SW peninsula of Britain included in the first century BC testimony of Caesar and Diodorus as having a civilised way of life and welcoming to strangers so that trade could take place with important items such as tin, copper and iron ingots and precious metals of gold and silver also available. Timber of every kind was available and there was evidence of many enclosures, farmsteads and hill forts.

After Caesar came Cladius who used the further invasion of Britain as the prestige required to maintain his position in Rome. Significant evidence of Roman buildings have been found in the SW with military layouts of forts for legions of up to 5,000 soldiers from across Europe who could claim Roman citizenship after 25 years of service. Exeter has significant evidence of Roman building with a Legionary Bath House heated in the usual way, found under Exeter Cathedral Close and garrisons maintained within the Exeter City walls. Chains of such fortresses have been found along the path of the movement of the legions up country

from Oakhampton, Cudmore Farm, Bampton and St Andrews Hill, Cullompton and Bolham Roman Fort at Tiverton. Initially these would have been built of Turf and Timber and after several years of occupation rebuilt in stone. Various artefacts have been found at these locations including amphorae, used for the transport of Olive Oil, Wine and Spices, and Samian ware, and courseware similar to those found in Dorset and further up country. Of course eventually these forts can be found all the way up to Hadrians Wall and by 150ad the extremity of the Roman Empire represented by the Antonine Wall from the Clyde to the Forth. Found at all these sites are roof tiles with curved joining

tile and Faience beads. The site of the Oakhampton Roman Fort is close to the local primary school serving the area who have become very involved in organising exhibitions for the community imagining the type of food stalls surrounding the fort, including the Greggsius concession.

The Legions also travelled East from Exeter following the route of what is now the A35, where during the building of this

road the foundations of the Roman road was excavated showing a road 30m wide with chalk drainage and a metal surface and modern camber to Straightway Head, the Yarty, and Axe, and Pomery Wood and Clyst Honiton and Craze Lowman. Aller Cross has been excavated as has Kings Kerswell. At these sites were found exotic glassware, pewter plate due to the proliferation of tin and lead at Mount Folly, Bigbury. A stone corndrier was found at Sherford. A bronze age mirror was found at Crediton and in the Quantocks a villa with a mosaic floor adopting the trippings of Romano British houseware. A current site close to Halberton and Sampford Peverill is being excavated with the help of Tiverton archaeology Society where many Roman items have been found. This was a time in the 3rd Century when Britain was stable with an expanding economy while the rest of Europe was riven by wars.

Tacitus records the Invasion of Britain and the setting up of the Civil Administration including the achievements of his father Agricola as Governor of Britain. The design of the Civil Basilica in Exeter with the town houses, now known as the St Catherine Almshouses. Topsham was Exeter's port where Roman beakers with chariot decoration were found as well as evidence of what had been a fish sauce factory, very popular with the Romans.

The Blackdown Hills of course was rich in iron smelting and Britain produced a plentiful supply of cereals that were shipped to feed the Continent. The Seaton Down coin hoard of 22,000 roman coins together with 3 billets of iron bars buried around 340AD were found in 2013 as a result of a metal detectorist.

Soon after this period the sons of Emperor Constantine fought against each other resulting in a troubled period and a slump in the economy of the Empire and its eventual collapse. Of course in 1450 the Ottoman Empire invaded Constantinople as the centre of Islam and solved this problem by allowing each ruler to murder all his brothers on his accession.



### **Around Hemyock**

ay back in February Chris and Shirley Dracott celebrated their 65th wedding anniversary and it was omitted from the last Pump. Although very belated we send them warmest congratulations and apologies. With so little local news for this copy I have been looking through the Cullompton Deanery Book dated 1901 -1910 to see what had been reported about St Marys church and Culm Davy Chapel. With this issue of the Pump covering April and May I've picked out the following from the year 1910 some of which may sound similar to present times.

**April** - The measles epidemic appears to be at an end with no new cases reported since March 1st. The Three Towns Church Extension Scheme (what was that I wonder) saw the Rector hoping the parish would be able to give some support to the scheme but he said for several years it had been a struggle to raise sufficient funds for its own very pressing needs. He also expressed thanks to all those who had contributed to the cost of moving a patient to the Exeter Infirmary.

18 names had been nominated for the Parish Council and for the first time in many years a poll was to be held to decide who would form the Council.

The marriage of Edwin Morrele and Jane Lowman had been celebrated and the funeral of Emma Hart (39) had taken place.

May – saw reports from the church Vestry and annual meetings with the Church and Chapel Wardens along with Sidesman all re-elected.

St Mary's church expenses for the year amounted to over £17 and the Chapel over £4. The forthcoming year will see the church clockface renovated those attending the meeting were told.

A donation of £3.3s had been made to both Wellington Cottage Hospital and Exeter Eye Infirmary with almost £5 going to Taunton Infirmary. £9 went to the Foreign Mission Fund with a total of £7 sent to various Home Missions including Dr Barnardo Homes.

The Rector, **Rev John B de Forbes**, said that a Flower and Egg service held on the second Sunday after Easter had seen some of the most beautiful flowers and over 35 dozen eggs donated and these had been distributed to the aforementioned hospitals. Taking eggs to a St Marys Eastertide service for local hospital continued until the early 1960s I believe, whilst bunches of primroses were sent by train to London for Mothering Sunday. No one thought that in the 21st century we would need to be making donations to food banks.

There had been no marriages or deaths recorded but a John Browning had been baptised.

April and May also remind me of a poem I learnt for a public speaking competition whilst at school which I'm sure many will know when the poet speaks of the joys of nature during the Spring months—

Home-thoughts, from Abroad by Robert Browning
O to be in England, Now that April's there...
With the second verse beginning...
And after April when May follows...

At the same time I also learnt the humorous Sir Smashum Uppe by E.V.Rieu and read a passage from The Small Woman. This book was turned into the film Inn of the Sixth Happiness telling the story of Gladys Aylward and her evangelical church missionary work in China and the children she saved. (The team I was in won the competition!). Perhaps there are others here who remember the same competition.

Bringing things up to date - life seems to very slowly returning to a kind of normality with students returning to school and other restrictions being eased. Once again thanks go to all those who have worked so hard and supported our community in so many ways through the pandemic including all those working in our local shops, supermarkets and chemists. A year none of us will forget.

In the Scout Group report of the previous Pump, it was mentioned that **Andy Batten** had relinquished the role of Group Scout Leader and had been awarded a Medal of Merit from Scout HQ for his work both here and in the Tiverton District. As someone who has experienced Andy's work with young people this was well deserved. The new GSL is **Rob Walster** and we wish him good luck as he takes over an enormously successful group. No doubt **Old Rikki** (aka John Northam) will continue to keep us all up to date with the group activities especially as their 50th year anniversary camp approaches. Our daughter, a past Venture Scout and later a leader has always maintained "Once a Scout always a Scout" and I'm sure there are many who would agree including Old Rikki and Andy who remains as assistant Scout leader.

Its also good to hear a football coach has offered to train 3-6 years old with a view to setting up a football club for them. Whilst the Blackdown Community Shed prepares for it opening.

A recent bone of contention here seems to be the amount of dog mess, which is known to be a health hazard, being left on playing grounds. The request to owners is please bag it up and dispose of.

All good wishes and prayers are sent to those who are unwell including **Joan**, **Tony**, **Brian** and the **Revd Margaret Cameron**. Whilst we remember all those in care homes who have been without visitors for so long.

There will be people who remember **John Browning** who recently passed away at the age of 93years. We send our love and condolences to his wife Pam and her family and to others known to us who have recently suffered the loss of a loved one

A very warm welcome to those who have moved here recently. If you would like to know more about the history of Hemyock and have the opportunity do read **The History of Hemyock** written by Brian Clist and Chris Dracott (pub. Halsgrove) and Brian's book **Make Hay While the Sun Shines**. Both give fascinating insights to life here.

### **Wellington Monument News**

wanted to share some positive news with you about the Wellington Monument project. It is still on track to finish at the end of May. This is incredible considering what difficult times we are going through. We're planning how to open the monument when the project finishes and restrictions are lifted. Anyone who has been inside knows the top viewing platform will safely fit only two people so we need to plan carefully. We've loved hearing the hilarious stories that you have told us from the days when dozens would climb up at a time. Those were the days of candles in jars and getting the key from the local farm!

A lot has happened since our last newsletter: -

The scaffold to the obelisk is now down and our contractors are concentrating on repairs to the curtain wall around the base of the monument. As with the rest of the monument, the replacement stone is Chicksgrove limestone. They are replacing a total of 250 of the limestone facing stones estimated to weigh approximately 80 tonnes. The team will then be re-grouting, re-pointing and using mechanical ties to improve structural integrity. The curtain wall is 6m high with a 1m cornice on top. It was one of the last areas to originally be built and the quality suffered as they ran out of funds during the nineteenth century.

- We are replacing stones on the cornice at the top of the curtain wall. There are 13 replacements to this course, with the largest being 600kg prior to cutting and shaping. These replacements will be made from a Bath stone named Park Lane.
- Work continues to complete the repairs inside the spiral staircase so that people can once again climb to the top. This consists of 5 replacement treads and 30 newel replacements. We will be pinning the cracks and stainless supports to 6 upper treads. The stone is Ham Hill stone.
- The window guards at the top have now been replaced to prevent birds from getting in and nesting inside the pyramidion. We are awaiting the arrival of a new door for the bottom of the staircase of the main tower to stop them getting in that way too. This will be an

- oak door with steel lattice panels. Nesting birds cause a range of health and safety issues, so better for all concerned for them to nest in woodland at the site.
- Replacement capping stones will be fitted to the top of all 3 buttress heads to prevent water ingress to the stonework below.
- The entrance step needs replacing. It is a grey Pennant sandstone from the Forest of Dean, approximately 1.2m long x 0.6m wide. It will be placed at the doorway in the next few weeks.

We have been overwhelmed with the incredible feelings people have for the monument. Funds have come from the Wellington Monument volunteers who have raised a whopping £4,000 collecting donations for unusable stone that has been removed from the monument. This fundraiser has been put on hold due to current restrictions, but don't panic, there will be more available!

I also want to thank the fabulous volunteers for the litter picking they do. Their invaluable help keeps the meadow, avenue and car park clean for all of us. We are still doing presentations though they are on zoom. If there any groups out there that would like an update, just get in contact and we can work out a suitable time to do a "virtual talk".

There is a lot of good news when talking about Wellington Monument. So, even though these are tricky times, I just wanted to let you know that all is good with the project.



### **Dear Residents**

the budget product of the end of another term for me, it runs out in May. I have enjoyed working for this community and hope I have been able to help in various ways, working with Parish Councils and so on, can't always please everybody, but I try to do what I can. I do thank everyone for your support.

As I have said I have enjoyed what I have done, to the extent, that I will be standing for another 4 year term.

As you know, we have announced our budget for 2021/22 and there has been unavoidable increases, the increase will be 4.99%, 3% for the adult services which is agreed by Government and 1.99% which is the maximum increase level set by Government.

Over and above the figures stated below, there will be an additional £600k going into road maintenance. We will be putting £300k into Climate Change over the next two years, to help, together with District Councils to help bring about zero carbon by 2030.

There looks to be light at the end of the tunnel on COVID, This tremendous effort to fight coronavirus, support Devon's communities and keep the county operating has cost the authority significantly.

The increased number of people eligible for help with Council Tax, coupled with more firms being forced to go out of business and leaving properties empty, is contributing to a financial shortfall for authorities at a time when spending demands are increasing.

The increase in Government funding for the authority is £3.7 millions or 2.2%. The Government has also announced Devon's share of national Covid funding for 2021/22 is £14.823 millions. In total, our spending in 2021/22 is due to rise by 6.6%, an overall increase of just under £35.7 millions from 2020/21. We will continue to do all we can to support all those affected by the Covid-19 pandemic. In the knowledge that we will come out of this pandemic with new and innovative ways of working to ensure we continue on our journey as a learning organisation.

It was hard to imagine that a return to normal would happen quickly. The rapidly changing circumstances led to a review of the Targets. Some savings previously identified did not seem feasible and the other areas needed bolstering to increase the resilience of the authority. The detailed budget targets were set by Cabinet on 13th January which total £578.5 millions. The total includes funding for budget pressures of £47.3 millions that mainly relates to additional expenditure to allow for service growth to cater for demographic changes such as increased children and adult service users and unavoidable cost pressures. Savings and income initiatives of £11.6 millions are required to set a balanced budget. The targets set for each service area have been subject to different pressures and influences. We have achieved this budget, without dipping into any reserves.

The figures below shows the 2021/22 Budget Targets by service area, of course there are masses of figures to support

the budget process, these are just heading figures and departments.

And by raising his Son from the dead on Easter, he promised to work all things, including the hardest and most painful things in your life, for the good of all his sons and daughters.

### THE ROTARY CLUB OF WELLINGTON

You may have heard just recently that with the help of Rotary around the world, the World Health Organisation have reported that Africa has now been officially certified free from wild poliovirus after four years without a case, which of course signifies a major milestone in the battle to eradicate

the disease worldwide. Only two countries worldwide continue to see wild poliovirus transmission: Pakistan and Afghanistan, but the aim of Rotary is to see the virus eradicated completely.

Wellington Rotary Club was formed in 1954 and during the last 76 years has continued in its role of care and concern for the needs of the young and old in Wellington and the surrounding villages. Members of the Club live not only in Wellington but also in many of the town's nearby villages

Among many of the things Wellington Rotary Club has engaged with in the past has been to support the education of young people, locally and Internationally through the arts and music, and through travel. ### **Building Works**

Building works on site are progressing well (at least when the weather has been on our side). We are working to replace guttering and re-point the Grist Mill – with some additional internal decorating and security installation.

The path leading along the front of the Mill building has now been dug out and widened, and will soon be re-laid with a new self-binding surface. This is to make the entrance more accessible and allow for wheelchairs and buggies to cross paths with no problem. It will also allow for distanced outside queuing as required for social distancing when the Mill reopens to the public. We are also taking the opportunity to redo the pathway leading from the shop up to the chimney, which we hope will give a great first impression to our visitors entering this area.

### **Media Guides**

I would like to say a huge thank you to the volunteers and trustees who have been involved with helping to produce the Media Guides which we are having commissioned for use by visitors in the Museum in the future.

### Visitor Route Signage & Interpretation

We are currently working on additional signage for visitors to point out all of the outbuildings and additional interpretation for the outside areas so that visitors are made aware of the history of the whole site rather than just the collections inside the factory. The addition interpretation will highlight the buildings in the Mill yard.

We have also had the Economiser House re-floored which means this will be a new space for visitors to view when we re-open.






