



#### THE BLACKDOWN H LLS TRUST

The Blackdown Hills Trust is looking for local volunteers to help check stock fencing around the grazing units in the Neroche Forest area. These sites are managed by the Blackdown Hills Trust in the Blackdown Forest for grazing conservation : they are a magnet for rare butterflies such as Wood White and Duke of Burgundy and an array of plants, insects, birds and mammals. The areas are part of a Higher Level Stewardship and are grazed by English











#### What will the volunteer role involve?

The role will involve walking the stock fence twice a year during the spring and autumn in the grazing compartments to check for any rotten posts or damage to the wire, and reporting back to the Trust. There may also be opportunities to get involved in practical conservation







#### **Reflections on starting the FICM**

#### What is it?

It is the foundational year course for Lay ministry in the Church of England.

#### So what?

Having moved to Hemyock a year ago and being welcomed so warmly at St Mary's church, my husband and I considered learning more about the bible, Christian spirituality and doctrine.

We had come from a chapel evangelical background for most of our married life and have always enjoyed leading worship so we were pleased to be recommended and accepted onto the course. The study days are in Exeter every other month and have been a welcome challenge after the restrictions of COVID. We've met up with 30 others from all over Devon and have received high quality teaching. We are in small tutor groups which are supportive and meet on zoom.

#### What if?

Yes, what if this expands my thoughts on the bible and builds upon how our forefathers have taught us in our various traditions of worship? I'd never realised there was so much to learn! For example, I'd never heard of the Desert Fathers and Mother's who were part of the early Christian church who 'fled' to the desert areas in Egypt to live as hermits and devote themselves to a very harsh life. They had fled from a church community which, after persecution in the early years AD , had become complacent. I have been struck by how some of the 'sayings of the desert fathers' can be a message for all of us now.

For example, Abba Moses said "go and sit in your cell and your cell will teach you everything". Ha ha! Yes, charity does begin at home! If we consider the cell as our life, where you are at present, then we all know how difficult it can be sometimes to be grateful for those circumstances. Yes, learning from our own situations and how we accept and deal with everyday pressures is as valid today as then.

#### Now what?

A book, not on our course reading list (but should be!) lent to me recently describes the Strength of the Hills and I have been fascinated by the Christian legacy we have in our beautiful Blackdown Hills. The men and women of simple faith who met in many small chapels in harsh countryside and set the scene and faith journeys of many families who live here now. Lastly I have learnt that we are all on a journey of faith and the more we are neighbourly about this the better!

Behind the scenes it was a tricky thing to do. # DEVONEE The Voice for Devon's Countryside

#### Devon CPRE objects to 'flawed proposals' for a 174-acre solar farm on sensitive lowland plains in East Devon

he campaigning local environmental charity Devon CPRE has submitted a comprehensive 16-page objection to East Devon District Council, spelling out why a large solar development at Clyst Hydon should be refused (planning application 21-3120-MFUL).

The charity's latest objection to a solar farm in open countryside comes just weeks after it launched a Crowdfunder campaign to fight such applications across Devon - donations to the growing 'battle chest' already total more than £7,500. www.crowdfunder.co.uk/devon-cpre

The Clyst Hydon proposal comes hot on the heels of an application for a 69-acre solar farm over five fields at Axminster (Beavor Grange Solar Farm, planning application 21/2992/MFUL). It's expected an application will soon be made for another large solar farm near Whimple (Horton Solar Farm).

In mid-December, Lightrock submitted plans for a 49MW solar power plant in open countryside next to Peradon Farm at Clyst Hydon. Devon CPRE says the scale of the solar array and its infrastructure would harm the landscape and environment for the whole of its 40-year lifespan, while also removing seventeen pasture and arable fields from food production.

In its detailed objection to EDDC, Devon CPRE says the Planning Statement and documents submitted in support of the application contain many unsubstantiated assertions and inconsistencies. For example, there's no evidence to support the claim that the solar farm would power approximately 15,000 homes and offset approximately 21,000 te of CO2 emissions per year, nor is there a proper ecological impact assessment.

The proposed solar farm at Clyst Hydon would include:

- 76,032 solar panels the total length of the arrays is about 43 km / 26 miles
- 21 inverters in large industrial containers
- 1 substation measuring 50m x 70m
- 12.2km / over 10 miles of two-metre-high security fencing
- more than 130 CCTV cameras
- about 3.7km / 2.3 miles of tracks made of nearly 4,000m3 of stone.

Devon CPRE energy spokesperson Dr Phillip Bratby says, "This proposal would result in the industrialisation of 174 acres of farmland extending about one mile from north to south and 1.3 miles from east to west. Robust information must be

provided before such an important planning decision can be made, one that will affect the landscape and the environment for decades.

"The applicant has not calculated the CO2 emissions directly and indirectly produced by the solar farm (its carbon footprint). These include the CO2 emissions produced during the mining, processing, refining, manufacture and transport of all major components and the construction, maintenance, decommissioning and disposal of all components. All these factors must be calculated as part of a whole life carbon assessment."

Paytherden residents have set up a community campaign page, Paytherden Solar Grass Not Glass paytherden.co.uk

Devon CPRE Director Penny Mills says, "We are a small, independent charity fighting these solar farms application by application and they are coming thick and fast across the county. In East Devon alone, we are facing the prospect of three new ones - two currently in the pipeline at Clyst Hydon and Axminster - and one expected to be submitted soon near Whimple. Across the whole of Devon we are losing thousands of acres of farmland that we need for food production, a far better use of our land in this country than inefficient solar panels. #### The Violet Chapman Trust

The Violet Chapman Charity (Charity registration number 299996) was established in 1986 after Mrs Violet Chapman, who was a patient of the Blackdown Practice, gave a substantial gift to the doctors, which was intended to provide patients with services and help that were not available under the NHS.

The original Trustees were Dr Jonathan Meads, Mrs Chapman and Sir Christopher who, at that time, was senior partner with Ashfords Solicitors and one time president of the Law Society. The Trustees were, at this time, all volunteers not drawing any salary or expenses, and this remains the case to date.

The Trust has discretion to give grants for medical equipment and treatments as well as giving financial assistance to patients of the Blackdown Practice for numerous purposes.

All grants are given for the physical and mental wellbeing of the patients, and many will gain support by the help the Trust gives in supplying counselling where the NHS is unable to supply.

There are many examples that we could give of the patients we have helped recently and would cite one that required

their bathroom to be modernised to enable them to continue to live at home; another patient who needed a chair that would help them in getting in and out without assistance. Another example is a patient who had severe back pain and a grant was given for them to have remedial massage.

If you feel the Trust can help you we would suggest you talk to your GP or any person who gives you support and submit an Application form which can be found online or pick one up from any of the Blackdown Practice surgeries. The Trustees are only too happy to consider any applications. Alternatively for more details please contact the secretary, Mrs Judy Barton on 01823 680975 or j.h.barton@hotmail. co.uk.

#### **Hemyock History Group**

The talk in December was given by John Ward, a Hemyock resident, who has held the national collection of Gentians and other Alpine plants. John has also been a lifelong Mason and gave a fascinating presentation on the History of the Masons including a film of the activities at a Lodge meeting with all the masons wearing their appropriate regalia.

The Masons originated as the masonry experts who built our Cathedrals. Every large church building will have a keystone at the east end of the building showing the initials of the master mason. One has to contemplate the effect that these magnificent buildings had on the normal person in the mediaeval era. This is why so many of the elite travelled huge distances to celebrate the awe of standing in the nave and looking up through the highest window. When the Saxons arrived here at Taunton Vale in 710 led by Ina they fought the Celts up on the Blackdown Hills led by Simon, the Viking, who died and was buried at Simonsbarrow. Ina celebrated by travelling to Rome, not an easy journey in those days. In fact Ina retired to Rome in 926, to spend the remainder of his life in the great city. He did leave a plaque in the central aisle of the nave of Wells Cathedral, so that we wouldn't forget him.

One of Ina's descendants, Athelstan, is reputed to have formed the first Masons meeting in 931 and there are documents purportedly showing the minutes of this meeting. However, either because they wanted to maintain a secrecy pact or the organisation fell apart it was not until 1717 when we have documented proof of the rules and the continuous record of the meetings of the Lodge of Freemasons held in the Goose and Gridiron pub in St Paul's Churchyard. The first law of the freemasons is that you must accept that there is a Higher Authority. They initially elected an Anthony Sayer as the oldest Master Mason and then Master of the Lodge as its Grand Master agreeing to hold a Grand Feast once a year and commanded the Master and Wardens of Lodges to meet the Grand Officers every Quarter in communication as the only two purposes of the Lodges.

The growth of the Lodges in England progressed from 1717 with some 7,000 Lodges now in existence with many more in Scotland, Ireland and Wales who have their own Grand Masters. Freemasons started up in France in 1722 with the 300th anniversary celebrated in France this year. This very quickly moved around Europe, Russia (remember Pierre Bezukhov in War and Peace where Tolstoy describes Freemasony as a Christian secret society with firm beliefs in scripture and a single deity and with strong connections with politically influential individuals). We can understand how beneficial such an organisation of fellowship is for men with a support network to assist individual masons who find themselves in difficulties in either business or personal life. John described the various levels or degrees that one must go through as one progresses through the Masons.

We were privileged to have Michael Bowerman give our talk in January on the family history of the Bowermans and their 400 year residence in Hemyock.

The Bowerman family have connections to the Isle of Wight, owning what became Osborne House in the early days, John Russell who became the first Earl of Bedford, and various Merchant Adventurer activities in the Caribbean and Spain. We started with the Dissolution of the Monastries when Dunkeswell Abbey was taken over by HenryVIII's men in 1539 with the Monks

being dispersed and the property and land taken by the Crown and given to the Kings new favourite John Russell, who was made Baron Russell by the King in late 1538. He was first noticed at Court when Archduke Philip of Austria and Juana his wife (King and Queen of Castile) were shipwrecked off Weymouth, and he escorted the royal couple to the English court in London. From then on John Russell was on an upward trajectory. John Ley was the last Abbot of Dunkeswell and he seems to have married into the Bowermans after leaving Dunkeswell Abbey and becoming the Vicar of Sheldon and Sainthill. One of the other Monks given a pension by the King when they left the Abbey was a William Boreman, although he had to travel to London to receive it. Another William Bowerman is reported as the sub Dean of Wells Cathedral. It was about this time that the Bowerman family moved from the Isle of Wight to Hemyock and settle in Whitehall Manor where they stayed in residence for over 400 years. Various members of the family became involved in overseas expeditions as did may families around the West Country. Either by simply financing expeditions or actually fitting out a ship, raising a crew and sailing off west in search of gold, silver or goods to trade back in England, Lawrence, Hugh and Simon begin to build up the Hemyock Bowermans status as merchants during the reign of Elizabeth. In 1548 Lawrence has begun to establish himself as a merchant trader in Spain and has to act in support of the men of San Sebastian who stand accused of piracy along with Robert Tyndall a merchant of Bristol residing in San Sebastian. This town in the North of Spain is still one of the most desirable locations for wealthy Spaniards where Juan Carlos, the old King and his family are known to reside when not in Dubai, or shooting in North Devon.

Lawrence married Katherine Cardwell, of Spanish descent and continued trading between Devon and Spain, moving down to Exmouth. Lawrence has documented that around this time the Spanish sailors in San Sebastian were taking the ropes and sails from the English ships with the purpose of fitting out Spanish galleons ready for 1588 and Philip's Grand Armada. Simon, meanwhile appears to have sited himself around Greenwich and close to the financial centre of England, with Hugh a factor in Spain and Lawrence a factor in Devon. Michael has made available many copies of the original documents he has unearthed of the Bowerman activities in the various trading locations on both sides of the Atlantic including Cartagena in Columbia, South America. Hugh eventually moves to Southern Spain to Seville and has a magnificent memorial statue in an Andalucian cemetery.

One of the attendees of the History meeting was a Julia Spencer who lives opposite the Pump and who has published a book of her time living with her family in a mountain village in Andalucia where they experienced extreme criminal activities against them, all described in her book Calamares and Corruption, copies of which can be obtained from Julia.

We have another Hemyock resident talking at our February 17th meeting, when Chris Western will be talking about the 1893 Polar expedition and on March 17th Colin Spackman a local historian will be talking about local History.

#### STOP PRES

The Book of Hemyock (Clist and Dracott) mentions a number of celebratory past events. We read of The Coronation Committees pictured by the newly erected Parish Pump from 1911 and 1937 whilst the Silver Jubilee in 1935 of George V and Mary saw a service of Thanksgiving, sports for all including races, pillow fight and tug of war with free tea and refreshments and of course the parish celebrations for significant dates concerning Her Majesty. Looking back to 1952 there will be those who remember villagers taking part in country dances through the streets and other activities.

id you get what you wanted for Christmas? I did! The strange assemblage of packages and tubes on Christmas morning revealed an Austrian scythe, complete with an impressive blade and sharpening kit. My dear better half had contacted Andi Rickard, our local scything expert, and secured for me her last scythe.



So now I have my own kit to scythe at Longmead..... and more good news, we will be able to buy up to three more for other volunteers to use, as we have been fortunate to get a community support award from mid Devon via councillor Ray Radford. Late Spring and Summer scything is now a real possibility.

We have also been

fortunate to have been successful in the application for wildlife hedging plants from the Woodland Trust. In early March, a large delivery of hawthorn, blackthorn, elder, rowan, hazel, dog rose and crab apple will arrive ready to go into the ground. They should provide a rich harvest for wildlife and humans in five to ten years time - elderberry or crab apple jelly, sloe gin, dog-rose hip syrup... so much to love. In the meantime the ground needs to be prepared, and once the trees are planted they will need to be mulched and protected with tree guards. So, we will need as much volunteer support as possible. Do you feel like being part of that group? For those using social media, keep a look-out on the Hemyock Community page for dates and times. At the moment the weekends at the beginning and the end of half term (12th-13th and 19th-20th February) are pencilled in for the ground prep.

The pond has been well and truly replenished from the recent deluges that Hemyock has been subject to over the last three months. In fact at one point St Margaret's Brook, which flows through the area, was flowing so well that the raised beds were half submerged. Work has been done by the volunteers (a special thanks to the DofE lads), and the raised beds have been weeded, more reed mace pulled from the pond, a few bulbs have been planted by the new bridge and long grass removed from around young shrubs and trees.

We know that Spring is on it's way and it won't be too long before the pond is wriggling with tadpoles. Longmead environmental area is a great place to observe nature over the year, and appreciate the cycle of life. See you there!

#### The Blackdown Hills: A Photographic Portrait

photographic exhibition documenting two decades of farming life on the Blackdown Hills opens at Somerset Rural Life Museum from 8 January to 19 March.

Somerset-based photographer Pauline Rook was commissioned in 2002 by the Countryside Agency to create a photographic record of the Blackdown Hills. Her brief was to capture the 'spirit and essence' of the area. The commission ignited a love of this unique corner of Somerset, and Pauline has now been photographing the landscape for almost 20 years. Over this period she has explored hundreds of miles of country lanes and paths, getting to know the individuals, countryside and buildings that make the Blackdowns so distinctive.

Pauline said: "My principal passion continues to be working in the rural environment. I built up a photographic archive for the Blackdown Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty when it was newly designated. This relatively underpopulated and inaccessible landscape of small farms and many lanes continues to fascinate and delight me. I love to include farm animals in my pictures – my years of farming and having my own flock of sheep have come in handy."

The countryside and photography have been lifelong passions to Pauline, who spent almost 20 years dairy farming in Somerset. This fuelled her desire to document the wonderful characters of the farming world. Pauline is an Associate of the Royal Photographic Society. The exhibition will bring together over 50 photographs and includes a selection of Pauline's most recent work, captured using the infrared techniques she began to learn during lockdown.

Sam Astill, Head of Museums for the South West Heritage Trust, said: "The photographs tell a tale of rural survival as well giving an insight into the working practices of an accomplished Somerset photographer. We're delighted to be exhibiting Pauline's work in the museum whose many

#### **Dear Residents**

his time of year sees all Authorities struggling with the budgets. Currently and we have a few more months to go, we are over budget, this is not unusual at this point during the year. We have always brought it back in line by the end of the year and we will do the same this year. We do not want to dip into our reserves. By law we have to produce a balanced budget.

This report outlines the financial position and forecast for the Authority at month 9 (to the end of December) of the financial year. At month 9 it is estimated that budgets will overspend by just over £8.3 million, an increase of £1.3 million from month 6. The Dedicated Schools Grant projected deficit, relating to Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND), is forecast to be £39.0 million. In line with Department of Education guidance this deficit will not be dealt with this financial year but carried to future years. Central government has continued to provide a number of grant funding streams this year to help support Local Authorities during the pandemic. The confirmed additional funding Devon County Council is expecting to receive directly this financial year is currently £50.7 million, in addition to the £25.6 million carried forward from 2020/21.

Adult Care and Health services are forecast to overspend by just over £5.1 million, a reduction of £71,000 from month 6. This position includes £3.2 million of budgeted savings. Adult Care Operations is forecasting to overspend by just under £5.4 million, this is a mix of price and volume pressures. Within Learning Disabilities and Autism higher demand has continued into this year with client numbers in these areas being 142 more than the budgeted level of 3,569. Older People is also experiencing significant pressures, mainly due to price pressures on residential and increase in the number of nursing placements which are 36 more than the budgeted level of 516. Adult Commissioning and Health and Mental Health is forecast to underspend by £230,000.

Revenue Expenditure Children's Services are forecasting an overspend of £9.1 million an increase of £1.8 million from month 6. However, this figure does not include the projected deficit of £39.1 million on Special Education Needs and Disabilities (SEND).

Part of my duty is to serve on the Devon & Somerset Fire & Rescue Service (DSFRA). I thought you might like to know what they have been up to during the pandemic crisis. Firefighters from across the five south west fire and rescue services are to continue to provide vital life-saving support alongside the ambulance service. Since the early stages of the pandemic, firefighters have been working with ambulance crews from South Western Ambulance Service (SWASFT) to assist during medical emergencies. The partnership has led to countless lives being saved and received praise from government and royalty. The shared crews have so far attended in excess of 30,000 calls, more than half of which are within the highest two priority calls, which are to people in life-threatening or serious conditions. With the current winter pressures on the NHS and surge in Omicron cases, this arrangement has been extended and will now continue until April 2022.

Strong partnerships between fire and ambulance services aren't new. Fire crews are often called upon to gain entry to

houses so that paramedics can see to patients and some fire stations have staff who are trained to give basic life support to people until the arrival of an emergency ambulance. Under the agreement, fire officers will continue to work alongside ambulance staff by driving vehicles and assisting clinicians to provide patient-focused care.

In adult social care in Devon right now:

- We currently serve around 11,000 people and the majority of our spend is on working age adults
- We commission 34,000 hours of personal care each week in people's homes and the same amount again of enabling care helping to promote people's independence.
- We are supporting over 100 more older people in nursing care from last year which may be reflective of increasing complexity of need
- We are seeing unprecedented requests for care, and when we receive those requests they are from increasingly poorly people, with increasingly complex needs, that requires complex care from more people.
- We continue to struggle to meet assessed need for personal care and in any week we have around 6,000 hours of care that we are unable to supply. This relates to approximately 460 people who will have their needs met in a different way including extra support from family members, other voluntary sector services or some other support to keep people safe. Nobody is left without some support and teams are constantly monitoring the risk and targeting the care we can source to the most needy and urgent cases.
- Alongside the growing requests is a stretched workforce, between Aug to Oct 2021 there were 3081 care worker vacancies, a rise of 86% on the same period in 2019. The supply of staff is extremely challenging and putting a huge strain on those in the caring workforce.
- Nurse shortages in nursing homes is leading to some homes having to cancel their registration to provide nursing care.

I am hoping very much that the majority of the disruptions caused by Gigaclear installing broadband in our area has decreased somewhat. Nevertheless, we have set up a working group to investigate what really is going on, particularly the harder to reach areas. I believe what is happening is broadband providers are cherry picking and the harder to reach areas are suffering, we intent to find out.

Because of Covid I have not been able to attend Parish Council meetings as I would have liked, it is worse now than it ever has been, I hope this will improve as the omicron virus recedes, I hope. I am always around if there is something I can help with.

Very early in the month of December we met with members of the Blackdown Support Group Lunch Club to enjoy our annual Christmas lunch. Suffice to say, the Christmas lunch was delicious and a wonderful way to commence our Christmas celebrations. Dennis Sanders provided the entertainment with a festive quiz that was the cause of much fun and laughter. With 8 points on offer for the names of Father Christmas' reindeer, I'm afraid to report that I stole the win, and with it, a box of Quality Street as a prize.

As Christmas drew closer still, we took great delight in meeting together. Our Family service on the 19th December created a space for all ages to consider what it is to know Jesus as Immanuel – The Present King. We hold our plans lightly recognising that it is the Lord who establishes our steps, and yet, in the face of so much uncertainty, we do still make plans.

Of course, the reality is that every single day is filled with uncertainty but there are events and seasons in our life, like the kind we have all endured through this pandemic, when we become increasingly conscious of life's uncertainty. This can be unsettling and cause of much anxiety. The answer, I believe, is to look to that which is certain. At the start of this year, we have been looking at the little book of Habakkuk which gives us insight into a conversation between God and his servant, the prophet Habakkuk. Habakkuk is surrounded by uncertainty which unsettles his soul and so, he cries out to God. And though Habakkuk doesn't understand the fulness of God's answer, he is reminded that God is with him, at work in his life and the life of the people. Habakkuk asks this question:


Are you not from everlasting, O Lord my God, my Holy One?

The question is a rhetorical one, it is both asked and answered by Habakkuk. He is reminded of who God is, all that God has done, and given assurance in all that he is doing and indeed, will do. The situations that have caused Habakkuk to feel the weight of uncertainty remain, but now Habakkuk has fixed his eyes upon the Lord, he has an anchor for the soul... the steadfast love of the Lord. I believe we can each find this same anchor in looking to Jesus. So much so that, even when we are increasingly conscious of all that is uncertain, we would be able to sing, as Habakkuk does at the very end of exchange with God (Habakkuk 3:17-19):

Though the fig tree should not blossom,
nor fruit be on the vines,
the produce of the olive fail
and the fields yield no food,
the flock be cut off from the fold
and there be no herd in the stalls,
yet I will rejoice in the Lord;
I will take joy in the God of my salvation.
God, the Lord, is my strength;
he makes my feet like the deer's;
he makes me tread on my high places.

#### Tips for greener living



We're all looking for ways to help our planet, or at least reduce our impact on it and there are many guides on how to do it.

One example can be found at <a href="mailto:greenpeace.org.uk/guide-to-life">greenpeace.org.uk/guide-to-life</a> which suggests many of the things we can do in everyday life to reduce our carbon footprint.

This and other guides give lots of advice on things to do, but not a huge amount of practical help on how to go about it. I'm hoping 'Tips for greener living' will become a regular feature in the Pump where you can send in your own practical ideas/local eco-friendly suppliers etc and pick up tips from others.

To get the ball rolling, here are two tips of my own:

- Make your own marmalade using 'Ma made' (tins of ready-cut seville oranges). It is available in most supermarkets, although you often have to search for it because it tends to be hidden away on a bottom shelf. One tin makes 6lbs; it's really easy to make, much better than shop-bought and, of course, you can re-use the same jam-jars many times over.
- If you shop in Wellington, try going to Blue Pantry where you can take your own containers for most dry foods + household cleaners, shampoo etc. Not as convenient as picking up single-use packets and bottles from a supermarket, but, if you've got the time, a much nicer shopping experience and far less wasteful.

#### Winners of Devon's Best Young Landscape Artist Competition 2021

painting by a ten-year-old girl from Dartmoor depicting a vista of Meldon Hill and a mixed-media artwork by a seventeen-year-old from Dawlish portraying a South Devon seascape have won first prize in the two age categories of Devon CPRE's inaugural Best Young Landscape Artist Competition.

Matilda Baker and Christopher Moore have each won £100 and the prestigious title of 'Devon's Best Young Landscape Artist' 2021.

Exeter-based landscape painter Kath Hadden brought her considerable expertise to the judging process after the local countryside charity rebranded its traditional painting competition for children in 2021 and opened it up to under 18s. Kath helped Devon CPRE Director Penny Mills select the winning entries from an overwhelming number of submissions from right across the county in a variety of media. Matilda's painting and Christopher's work combining paint and collage both stood out because of their composition, originality and clever use of the chosen media.

However, it was a close-run thing and the judges awarded a number of Runner-Up Prizes and a cash prize of £25 each to four other young artists whose work caught their eye. In the younger age category (7-11), nine-year-old Martha Murrin, eleven-year-old Thomasin Manley Frost and ten-year-old Olive Martin were runners-up. In the older age category (12-18 years), the runner-up was sixteen-year-old Claudia Tam and there was a commendation for fourteen-year-old Rosie Brazendale-Sweet.

Commenting on the results, Kath Hadden said, "I thoroughly enjoyed looking through all the artwork. Such a lot of effort

The youngest category was particularly hard to judge as there were some very strong entries, which showed talent beyond their years. Matilda's winning entry was a perfectly captured Devon scene, with great attention to detail. Congratulations, Matilda! Thomasin's screen print of Exmouth beach showed a brilliant use of colour and composition, and Olive's piece was a familiar scene to anyone who has explored this area of South Devon, beautifully painted in acrylics. Martha's image of a tree-lined road didn't have a specific location, but I was impressed by her composition and use of colour.

"In the older age group, Christopher winning piece showed a creative approach in the way he manipulated the paper to create a clever collage, referencing a local legend about The Parson and the Clerk, which I knew nothing about. Claudia's mixed media piece was a feast for the eyes - there was so much to see in it and I thought it was a brave approach to a tricky composition. I also loved her personal story behind the picture. I thought Rosie's Devon flag, depicting four small Dartmoor studies with a very limited palette, was highly effective. Congratulations and keep making, drawing and painting everyone!"

It's wonderful to see the very personal take on Devon's landscape and scenery that our young artists brought to their compositions. 




