





Three Score Years and Ten

As you read this our local communities, along with the entire nation and the Commonwealth, will be marking an event unique in our history. The reign of Queen Elizabeth has exceeded 70 years and it can't have escaped anyone's notice that there are to be Platinum Jubilee celebrations, including bonfires, beacons, processions and street parties. 70 years is a long time; as someone who will achieve that milestone next birthday, I am very conscious of the rather gloomy statement in Psalm 90 that, "The days of our age are threescore years and ten". When I qualified as a doctor in 1976 that was still largely true. The State Pension age for men was set at 65 because, quite frankly, relatively few people lasted much longer. Fortunately, improvements in health and social care, many during our Queen's reign and still more during her lifetime, have increased life expectancy and left many older people fitter and able to gain more from life (and continue giving to their communities) in their latter years.

But if 70 years is a long*ish* time to live, still to be performing the same demanding job you started 70 years earlier is a truly remarkable achievement.

Queen Elizabeth has devoted her life to the service of her country and peoples and has justifiably drawn the admiration of people and their leaders the world over. As I write this, on the day of the State opening of Parliament, it is noteworthy that Her Majesty did not attend the event for the first time in 59 years because of concerns over her health, and it has been distressing to learn of the adverse impact of "episodic mobility problems" on her ability to participate as fully as she would wish in her public duties.

Our Queen has earnt the respect and confidence of the British people and we continue to pray that, as it says in the third verse of the National Anthem, "Long may she reign". I am sure we all hope that she remains well enough to play a full part in the Jubilee celebrations, and I expect she will continue to be active in public engagements for some time yet. But I also believe she deserves to be able to put her feet up and trust that, can she do so, she will enjoy more fruitful years to come.

God save the Queen!





The Violet Chapman Trust

The Violet Chapman Charity (Charity registration number 299996) was established in 1986 after Mrs Violet Chapman, who was a patient of the Blackdown Practice, gave a substantial gift to the doctors, which was intended to provide patients with services and help that were not available under the NHS

The original Trustees were Dr Jonathan Meads, Mrs Chapman and Sir Christopher who, at that time, was senior partner with Ashfords Solicitors and one time president of the Law Society. The Trustees were, at this time, all volunteers not drawing any salary or expenses, and this remains the case to date.

The Trust has discretion to give grants for medical equipment and treatments as well as giving financial assistance to patients of the Blackdown Practice for numerous purposes.

All grants are given for the physical and mental wellbeing of the patients, and many will gain support by the help the Trust gives in supplying counselling where the NHS is unable to supply.

There are many examples that we could give of the patients we have helped recently and would cite one that required

their bathroom to be modernised to enable them to continue to live at home; another patient who needed a chair that would help them in getting in and out without assistance. Another example is a patient who had severe back pain and a grant was given for them to have remedial massage.

If you feel the Trust can help you we would suggest you talk to your GP or any person who gives you support and submit an Application form which can be found online or pick one up from any of the Blackdown Practice surgeries. The Blackdown Support Group enables people to get around more easily, to meet and make friends and when they face life challenges, to feel that they are not alone. We currently offer the following support:-

- Low-cost lunches





Hemyock History Group Report

ode Breaking Sisters is a book written by 2 sisters, both now in their 90's who are cousins of our Churchwarden at St Mary's, Sarah Folland, who gave a talk to our April meeting about the exploits covered in the book.

The two sisters were at school when war broke out in 1939 but their father, Colonel Cary joined the Royal Artillery and was sent with his regiment to the far east. His regiment were advancing towards Singapore when the Japanese with vast air cover arrived in Singapore first and accepted the surrender of all allied forces including Colonel Owtram who was then imprisoned until the end of the war, 4 years later.

The two sisters had grown up with a couple of Austrian Jewish refugees who only spoke German. This proved extremely useful for both girls who signed up to listen across the airwaves for any German broadcast both from the UK and overseas. The elder sister, Patricia, joined up with the Navy as a wren listening in at various listening stations around the coast of England, initially at Withernsea on the Yorkshire coast a few miles from Hull and directly opposite the German Naval bases at Kiel and Hamburg. By slowly turning the wavelength dial until a German conversation became audible and choosing the strongest signal, Patricia would write down the words heard either as normal German words or as 4 character enigma codes. The enigma codes would then be sent to Bletchley Park. Jean, at the age of 18 joined as a FANY, a First Aid Nursing Yeomanry and initially based in London where she met the legendary Leo Marks who set up the blocks of encryption keys to create the coded messages between London and their agents overseas. She later agreed to travel to Alexandria and Cairo when Montgomery had just arrived to take control of the "Desert Rats" in North Africa. Both sisters had to sign the Official Secrets Act before taking up their positions.

After the successful Battle of Alamein, the Allies crossed the Mediterranean and invaded Sicily in September 1943 with Jean Owtram flying via Libya to the southern tip of Italy to a signal station at Brindisi to carry on her secret work with the SOE. Sir Fitzroy Maclean may have had influence with Jean's postings since he was the local Lancashire MP in her home area of Lancashire, was stationed in Egypt and then Italy and was heavily involved with providing armaments to General Tito's partisan army in Yugoslavia General Tito was based in the same area around Brindisi while planning activities of his Yugoslav army. Jean and her group would travel long distances to see different parts of Italy visiting the Duomo in Florence and St Peter's in Rome. Jean's comment that "in Rome you go to look around while in Florence you come to pray" indicates that she appreciated the situation she found herself. While Jean was enjoying the pleasures of the coastal villages of the Puglia coast of Italy, Patricia had moved to Abbot's Cliff, the Y station listening post near Dover. On one particular day a party, including Churchill, Montgomery and other top brass were seen conspicuously walking along the cliffs surveying the channel, presumably adding to the mistaken belief that the invasion of Europe by the allies would be from the Dover area. The reunion between Jean, Patricia and their father, Cary finally arrived in October 1945 with their mother at the family house in Lancashire where the conversation must have continued for many hours.

The May talk was given by Julia Spencer who had previously run the Somerset Allergy and Healing Centre, before moving her family to a remote rural area in SW Spain. Julia's healing

skills were in great demand by the local populace and are now in demand in the Hemyock area since she now lives in the centre of our community. There have been many newspaper reports of her success in resolving serious illness and physical injury in both animals, including horses and family pets, and also humans. Julia said that the healing process comes from a strength which is channelled through her from an external powerful source from above. People can usually be fairly sceptical about such matters, but when the audience was asked whether anyone had experienced such a power, a couple of attendees immediately related events in their past where such a healing force had proved surprisingly effective. The group attending the talk ended the meeting as a supportive close group all on the same wavelength. A very interesting and welcome experience that made us all grateful to Julia. We have now received the official accounts of the Association from our accountants as at 30th April which were available at the meeting.

The History Group was set up in 2007 to generate income for the church rooms which were in danger of being sold off at the time. Over the last 15 years we not only paid rental of the room with many interesting speakers talking to our group, but we have also run zoom History talks, generated DVD's of the area, the Hemyock Historic Map, the WW1 book, a database of historic documents and images, and created a website blackdownarchives.org.uk.

We still have 2 working PC's holding the database and the website which has cost many hundreds of pounds over the years for domain name, hosting fees and maintenance support. We have not been charged by the local technical company over the last 2 years for this technical support and fees and may now be in a situation where the website is considered a Community Asset. We will be making available to the Platinum Jubilee committee all images of past jubilee events for display over the weekend of 3rd June. Over the last year we have donated over £250 to St Mary's and £100 to the Light Brigade.

During the last 5 years we have tried to involve more local people interested in the history of the area in the organisation of the Association, but with limited success. We had a new Chairman for a period of time but there was very little activity and he has now left the area. So we are looking for other interested locals who could take the Association forward from its current strong position. Apart from the management of the assets and the meetings with invited speakers it is important we maintain our strong finances. Our accountant has confirmed we have a cash balance of £114 and a Bank Balance of £2,563 while reducing the value of the fixed assets to £200 which include the 2 PC's, software, database and projector.



The Voice for Devon's Countryside

Devon countryside campaigners lambast Government's new energy strategy

he Devon branch of the countryside charity (Devon CPRE) has criticised the Government's new energy strategy, saying Boris Johnson's emphasis on 'renewables' will not deliver an affordable, clean and secure supply of electricity as people are being led to believe.

Instead, Devon CPRE believes enhanced carbon capture from regenerative agriculture, the only proven method for carbon capture and storage, is a critical factor in the equation and the charity is disappointed that it's not been mentioned in the strategy unveiled yesterday. Experts estimate this could sequester our excess carbon emissions within 15-20 years.

The charity's energy spokesman, Dr Phillip Bratby says: "Producing food and capturing carbon is what Devon's farmland can do and should be doing to help meet our carbon targets – not slowly degrading under hundreds of decaying wind turbines and hundreds of thousands of toxic solar panels, not to mention the huge explosive batteries they need to be even remotely effective."

The Government claims its energy plans will reduce electricity bills, make the UK more self-sufficient and less reliant on imports. Devon CPRE says the Ukraine crisis has highlighted the UK's foolishness in relying so heavily on imports from Russia, and the new strategy will perpetuate our dependence on global supply chains and superpowers. China manufactures most of the world's supply of solar panels, wind turbines and batteries and controls most of the exotic materials needed to make them.

Dr Bratby continues "The public is being hoodwinked into thinking that onshore wind farms are one of the fastest and greenest ways to get so-called 'free' power. Neither wind farms, nor solar farms provide this - they provide very expensive power - and the more we build, the more the price of our electricity will go up. Devon CPRE fought the construction of wind turbines for over ten years and we know rural communities don't want them. We also don't want more of these huge solar developments that are gobbling up our farmland

"The government's proposed energy security strategy appears to have been dreamt up by Whitehall civil servants who have little knowledge of engineering or of life in the real world outside their Westminster bubble. We are not against solar panels in the right locations, such as on roofs, provided they are not Chinese-made, using slave labour. We welcome the proposals not to change current planning regulations for

onshore wind. However, apart from this, the strategy is a complete failure. It will not deliver its stated aims, namely, an affordable, clean and secure supply of energy. Very importantly, for a strategy which involves massive expenditure of taxpayers' money, there has been no risk assessment of what is proposed."

Devon CPRE Director Penny Mills adds, "It's not just the Government who are failing to grasp what's needed. It's difficult to get the message across to politicians of all persuasions. Opposition parties are scrambling around trying to think of something to say and are spouting forth about increasing onshore wind turbines and insulation. Across the country, tens of thousands of new homes are being built to maximise profit for the developers. If the housebuilders reduced their profit by constructing to a higher specification, including decent energy efficiency, it would have benefits all round"

Devon CPRE says it's time the Government introduced a sensible, pragmatic and strategic energy policy, one that prioritises the use of farmland for growing food.

ave you been to the Longmead environmental area recently? There is now a super information board to look at and help spot the various types of flora and fauna that you may find on your walk in the area. Thanks to Keith and Annabel Barr for the hard work of designing the plinth and siting it.



Not on the bird list is a green woodpecker that I heard calling in the deciduous trees on the western edge of the area last week. It has a laughing song or call which led to it being called the 'Yaffle' bird in past times. Green woodpeckers are extremely fond of ants - for food that is!

The young fruiting hedge trees have been growing well at Longmead, and every single whip has a healthy sprouting of leaves, some even now poking out of the protective guards. But in this wonderful bountiful May so has the competing grass, docks and Himalayan balsam! Last weekend a dedicated group started the weeding and re-mulching of the plants and this will be ongoing throughout the Summer. Now that the likelihood of frost has passed, we have also started to replant the raised beds with courgettes, squashes, leeks and beans. A scattering of wildflower seeds and annuals near the new bridge may yet bring some colour to the bare earth there. The scythes will be in use in the next few weeks to mow selectively and encourage habitat diversity.

We were also delighted to be the recipient of a grant from St Mary's Church Charity and Coffee Shop (what a fabulous group of people) which will allow the planting of bulbs in the Autumn. This will brighten up the area in the drab Winter months and provide a much needed food source for the early pollinators. News From Rosemary Lane Chapel

here is a special joy to be found in community. Not only does community provide a place of belonging, but also, an opportunity to serve; to feed into the life of the community and to re-orientate our lives towards others. It is for this reason that we feel so grateful to have an increasingly full calendar at Rosemary Lane Chapel through which we can engage with not only those who make this chapel a place of worship, but also the wider communities of Clayhidon and Hemyock.

This special joy was highlighted by several events in the month of April. First on Palm Sunday we had a wonderful time as we joined together with members of the Upper Culm Benefice and Hemyock Baptist Church for a Palm Sunday Procession. The Procession itself commenced at St. Andrew's with several activities prior to the walk down the hill to Rosemary Lane Chapel. Worship and Prayer punctuated the procession. Meanwhile, an alternative service commenced simultaneously at Rosemary Lane Chapel – a time similarly filled with worship and prayer that drew upon the participation of many. As the procession spilled into chapel the two groups became one. It was a joyful scene of community and an event that could have only happened because of the willingness of so many to serve in different ways.

Within a week, Rosemary Lane Chapel hosted another event that saw many come together for our Good Friday Teaching Meeting. Graham Poland (North Devon) spoke at an afternoon and evening service which sat either side of a light tea. Once more, many came into the chapel from across our local area and even further afield, reminding us that community has the capacity and power to stretch far beyond our neighbourhood. Of course, the cause of our community was a common bond in the Lord Jesus Christ who, as we remembered, died for us upon the cross. It was then, with equal delight, that we gathered once again on Easter Sunday to be reminded of the most incredible news – Jesus Christ rose from death to life. It was thrilling to meet for a sunrise service and declare 'Christ Risen'. Cold though it was, our hearts were warmed at the rising of the Son. Later that morning, we met at chapel for our Easter Sunday family service to take on board something of the meaning of Jesus' death and resurrection - death defeated and the power of sin dismantled – Praise be to God.

Even now, we look forward to further opportunities to gather to experience community. Immediately before us are the many events planned to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee which will include a combined service at St. Andrew's on Sunday 5th June (2.30pm). It seems so fitting to come together as a community to celebrate a Queen who has made 'service' such a foundation of her reign. 70 years that have been so evidently shaped by her faith in the Lord Jesus, who, though the Son of God, came not to be served, but to serve and give his life as a ransom for many (Mark 10:45).

Jesus' heart to serve should shape us as a community in the same manner, just as it has the Queen, just as it did Jude, the brother of Jesus. He loved the community of believers that formed the early church, and to such an extent that he devoted himself to serving them. This community of believers gave himself a place, a place to serve; to orientate his life towards others. When Jude wrote his

letter to the believers, he did not claim a title of prestige – he could have easily sought to remind them that he was the earthly brother of the Lord Jesus as a means of asserting his credentials and authority – but instead, at the opening of his letter he greets this community as a 'Servant of Jesus Christ' before reminding them of God's love and expressing his hope for this community:

Jude, a servant of Jesus Christ and a brother of James, To those who have been called, who are loved in God the Father and kept for Jesus Christ: Mercy, peace and love be yours in abundance. JUDE 1-2

May the love of Christ be a common bond and may his heart be the shaping of us to serve in our communities
