





A glimpse of the universe in the making

The first full-colour pictures from NASA's new James Webb Space Telescope were recently released, revealing the most detailed glimpse of the early universe ever seen. At least one of the specs of light which appears is thought to date back more than 13 billion years – one of the very first stars in the universe.

When I saw the photo I was awed by these new glimpses of this vast and ancient universe, and felt what tiny things we human beings are within it. So I was hit between the eyes by one of Joe Biden's comments on seeing it, which was rather different: 'These images are going to remind the world that America can do big things, and remind the American people – especially our children – that there's nothing beyond our capacity.'

Which is the right approach? Humility in the face of the vastness of the universe? Or the drive to exercise our full human potential to make our mark in it?

It is the same tussle in ways of seeing and ways of approaching life which we observe in our national leaders. All leadership must balance a proper humility with a bold exercise of human skills, talent, enterprise and possibility. We are quick to judge those in public life who don't get the balance quite right.

But for ourselves, too, in our daily lives, there is often a balance to be struck. You might be the sort of person who is more hesitant to exercise your personal responsibility. You may find it easier to take the servant path. Perhaps Joe Biden's approach to life is one which can encourage you to see afresh your own talents and recognise God's commission to you to bring to bear on the world all the strengths that your personality, background, talents and current situation can bring

On the other hand, perhaps you are the sort of person who too readily takes control of situations without reflecting on how appropriate that is and whether responsibility should be shared with those around you to enable them to play a fuller part

Either way, a writer 1000 years before Christ, King David of Israel, seems to combine both approaches as he stared up at the night sky: 'When I consider the heavens, the work of your hands, the moon and the stars which you have set in place, what is man that you are mindful of him? Yet you have made him little lower than the angels and have crowned him with glory and honour and put all things under his feet.' (Psalm 8)

In the face of the vast universe King David is humbled. Yet he is also energised by the knowledge that the God who put it all in place also appoints humankind to step up to the role of steward and manager of this vast and beautiful cosmos, charged with making it fruitful and productive.

As our national leaders face new challenges, and as we too may be presented with new opportunities this autumn, humility and a bold exercise of responsibility will go well hand-in-hand.



Our October talk will be from Alan Reeve on the 13th October and Peter Fisher on the 10th November.

Major Peter Fisher has given an interesting talk some time ago about John Wood from Hemyock who joined the 40th Regiment of Foot when it later became associated with the 2nd Somersets. This regiment fought in South America when Britain attempted to invade Montivideo and then Buenos Aires before returning to be one of three regiments serving throughout the Peninsula campaign with Wellington. Napolean's forces invaded Portugal in 1807 and Wellington fought a total of 16 battles in the Iberian peninsula up to 1812 driving the French back. Around this time Private Wood was sent over to North America where he successfully fought against the French in the Southern States before being recalled with his regiment urgently to Europe to join Wellington's forces in time for Waterloo. In the meantime Napolean was otherwise engaged in Russia extending his front in all directions.



The Violet Chapman Trust

The Violet Chapman Charity (Charity registration number 299996) was established in 1986 after Mrs Violet Chapman, who was a patient of the Blackdown Practice, gave a substantial gift to the doctors, which was intended to provide patients with services and help that were not available under the NHS.

The original Trustees were Dr Jonathan Meads, Mrs Chapman and Sir Christopher who, at that time, was senior partner with Ashfords Solicitors and one time president of the Law Society. The Trustees were, at this time, all volunteers not drawing any salary or expenses, and this remains the case to date.

The Trust has discretion to give grants for medical equipment and treatments as well as giving financial assistance to patients of the Blackdown Practice for numerous purposes.

All grants are given for the physical and mental wellbeing of the patients, and many will gain support by the help the Trust gives in supplying counselling where the NHS is unable to supply.

There are many examples that we could give of the patients we have helped recently and would cite one that required

their bathroom to be modernised to enable them to continue to live at home; another patient who needed a chair that would help them in getting in and out without assistance. Another example is a patient who had severe back pain and a grant was given for them to have remedial massage.

If you feel the Trust can help you we would suggest you talk to your GP or any person who gives you support and submit an Application form which can be found online or pick one up from any of the Blackdown Practice surgeries. Dear Residents

I hope there are not too many problems in and around Hemyock, if there are, and I can help, please give me a call.

This is a little of some of our revenue costs, we as Members have received regular budget monitoring reports throughout 2021/22 in which budget pressures and risks have been identified. The outturn overspend of £3.3 million is an improvement from the £5.8 million forecast outturn which was reported to Cabinet 9th March. The overspends relate primarily to the budgets for Adult Care and Health and to Children's Services. The outturn for Adult Care and Health services is an overspend of £3.4 million. Adult Care Operations and Health outturn is £4.2 million overspent, the main reason for this overspend relates to significant pressure on unit rates in all service areas. There has been an increase in nursing placement volumes for older people. These pressures have been partially offset by underspends on staffing budgets which reflect the difficulty in recruiting care management staff. The challenges of recruitment and staffing levels under establishment bring challenges in being able to contain rising cost pressures. Adult Commissioning and Health outturn is £783,000 underspent, due to an under spend on Mental Health placements, further core staffing vacancies, and central budget underspends. The position for Children's Social Care is an overspend of £7.2 million. While the overall number of Looked After Children in placement was less than budgeted, there have been higher volumes of children needing complex care arrangements. At the same time the average cost of these types of placement has increased, leading to an overspend of just under £5 million.

This is the letter we received from Phil Norrey, announcing his retirement from DCC.

Dear colleagues

After nearly 17 years since my appointment as Chief Executive for Devon County Council, I have decided that it is time for me to retire.

It has been a huge privilege to serve the elected councillors and people of Devon in this role and to work with so many talented and dedicated Devon County Council employees. This has been a difficult decision as Devon County Council has been such a big part of my life for nearly a quarter of a century, but it is the right time for me and, more importantly, the organisation.

We have nearly completed the process of assembling a great new senior team, and that team and the whole organisation deserve the best possible leadership, with fresh perspective and drive, to help the Council and the communities we serve navigate through what will be a challenging period ahead. I will be leaving on 31 August 2022 and the Council is taking immediate steps to recruit my successor and to make an interim appointment should that be necessary. Best wishes,

Potholes and safety defects are always high on any Parish Council agenda, this is how the Highways assess potholes. With regard to consideration of a pothole for repair we operate a risk based approach in line with national guidance. As such our Inspectors consider a number of factors including the position of the defect within the carriageway, the speed limit

of the road and the potential risk to road users. All these factors then lead to a decision whether to order a repair and the appropriate timescale for that repair. Anything that is considered a safety defect will be repaired in accordance to Devon County Councils policy. If a member of the public or Parish see a pothole that meet the intervention levels of being over 300mm in diameter and having a vertical face (sharp edge) of 40mm or over, the quickest and easiest way to deal with them is to report them online through our web site using the link below. This is the same as I would do and goes straight to the contractor for investigation saving the time of the Neighbourhood Officers visit.

NOTE: -

Potholes are only filled provided the above criteria is met and only those reported will be inspected/filled accordingly. When logging potholes through the Public Information Portal (PIP) system, they must be entered individually and not blocked together, our contractors will only deal with each pothole individually, therefore each must have its own unique number. Potholes logged using the PIP system remain as enquiries (public 'W' reference) until such time the inspector deems them to be a safety defect, at which point they are assigned to our contractor (internal 'D' reference) for repair. The response time is now based on their risk-rating ascertained during the inspector visit as well as the time scale (in most cases 28 days from the time of assessment), alternatively the enquiry may be closed down as 'no further action', this could be for example, due to not meeting policy or being a duplicate log/report. The PIP system shows the pothole(s) which have been logged (blue circle with a number if more than one at any location or a green circle with a picture of a car for a single pothole) and has now been updated to show a triangular road works sign symbol once assessed with an estimated date of repair.

Broadband CDS Lot E – East and Mid Devon Area.

This is just a bit of update from CDS of the progress of broadband, not there yet. Although the main activity of supplying broadband in Hemyock, Culmstock, Uffculme & Willand has been via Gigaclear. This contract, which will deliver new fibre connections to 13,890 homes and businesses, is also in delay, and CDS are working with Airband to complete a remedial plan and set of updates and communications to residents affected.

There are similar reasons for the delay, in particular the appointment of strategic civils and design partners has taken longer than anticipated, continued difficulty in agreeing critical wayleaves impacting on Airband's ability to finalise the designs and commit to a build schedule and the permitting this requires. A key part of approving the revised plans and timescales will be reaching agreement on extending public funding. However, design and survey work has been completed in 1 cluster between Tiverton and Nomansland, serving circa 600 premises, and build is well advanced with completion scheduled for Q2 2022/23. Survey and design activities have begun in clusters between Sampford Peverell and Bradninch as well as between Seaton, Gittisham and Sidmouth with clarity on the next to go into build expected shortly.

HEMYOCK PARISH HALL (HPHMC)

By the time you read this, the AGM will have taken place and another year will have begun managing the Parish Hall, for many a focal point of the village and a centre for activities as diverse as badminton, salsa, zumba, short mat bowls, toddler group(s), the monthly market, gardeners club, cricket club, Young Farmers Club, dance groups, art club, and of course the occasional quiz, dance or, private party, not forgetting that (covid allowing) once a year, Valley Arts turn the hall into a theatre for their annual musical production or panto.

The trustees give their time freely, but take their responsibilities seriously. Maintenance of the fabric of the building and the equipment therein is key, but so is some modernisation and improvement, and so in the last 12 months, funds have been spent on 100 new chairs, 10 round tables (much more suitable and sociable for functions), and a cupboard to store drinking glasses. We have also spent money improving security and access to the hall.

In 2007, when Robin's Court was built on the site of the old tennis courts, trustees listed on the Charity Commission report numbered 24. There are now about half that number, and of those, many are what can be politely described as 'elderly'. If the number of trustees dwindles further, and officers (treasurer, secretary, chair and vice chair) are unable to be replaced, then there will have to be change. Perhaps officers will have to be appointed and paid to carry out their work, and the cost will have to be offset through higher charges for hall users. There is also the possibility of local authority involvement, which often results in detachment from parishioners. The hall committee meets about every two months (occasionally in between as well), to do its best to ensure that the facility is well managed. If you think you could spare one evening every two months and maybe a little time in between or you would like to know more, then please get in touch. We'd love to hear from you, and promise that you'll be made more than welcome.

Footnote: John Churchill has decided that the time is right for him to step down from the hall committee. John has been an elected trustee for many years and a true asset to the committee, for which we all owe him a debt of gratitude. We are all very thankful for the valuable contribution John has made over the years.

Community Speed Watch - More Volunteers Are Needed!

Have you seen or heard vehicles speeding on Station Road? Are you concerned? Could you spare an hour to monitor the traffic? The village has its own speed watch team and it is looking for new members. During the first 6 months of this year our small group of speed watchers have held 20 sessions, logged 82 cars speeding, 69 of these were sent a letter from Devon & Cornwall Police and 5 were logged onto the police system. The maximum speeds recorded were 40 mph in a 20mph zone and 46mph in a 30mph zone. The Parish Pump August • September 2022

Our Thatching Life, featuring Ferrari the Thatcher, Daisy his apprentice, a lot of reed and animals various...

T f my barn had a belt, I would need to let it out a couple of notches. In times before, (before the war, before covid, before... Leverything) I'd buy in reed for the next job as I was finishing the one I was on. Because of the ongoing uncertainty of availability and price, I'm buying in what I can, when I can for the whole year ahead. *The barn has been stuffed to the gunnels, and obviously the thing* you want is always behind everything else... as were the bees.

Daisy was throwing down bundles of reed for me to load, when she revealed a little hive of now very angry bees. I put on my very own bee suit, given to me by Martin and Karen of Chaffcombe, and moved the hive into a shoe box and put them high out of my way and theirs. So we are off and running on a large water reed re-thatch in Honiton. There is a Georgian front added to a much earlier farmhouse at the back, and as we took off the thatch in the valley we could see all the old hip of the roof still in place inside. What we could not see were any timbers holding up the sheets of tin lining the valley (where one roof meets another at an internal right angle). How in the world it had held itself all in place was a mystery and lucky that neither of us fell in! A couple of days later and all the old tin was gone, new timbers in and a lead lined valley glaring at us in the rising temperatures. Pressure on a little bit as we were booked to go on holiday with Daisy's girls and their friends, but with a day to spare we finished the first section. Just as well as the skies opened and threw several tons of water at it. We were soaked through. A change of clothes and we were off to retrieve one of Daisy's cows from the Dartmoor Dating Agency. The cow decided she was quite happy on Dartmoor thank-you-very-much and went off with the rest of the herd to the farthest corner of the field. A hike through gorse and more rain had us soaked through again, but at last she loaded and we were off back home.

Daisy fetched her friend John to look after Jelly and Widget went to a friend of mine, under strict instructions not to let either of them onto the furniture, and then after what seems like years, of course it has been years, we were packed and on our way to Crete. This was Lulah's choice for her 16th Birthday, and what an excellent choice it was. We started off in the Old Town of Rethymno, solidly built by the Venetians in the 16th Century, with narrow alleyways several degrees cooler than the beach, and great limestone arches bracing meter thick walls. It felt like up to half the houses were now guest houses, much like our own coastal villages I suppose, with the remainder split between local people hanging in there and derelict houses waiting for something to happen to them. These to us are the most fascinating as we peer through gaps in doors or missing stones to see which of them would be our hearts desire to restore. Very few are for sale though as most are firmly held by families waiting for either the time or the funds to reinstate them.

The girls either window shopped or made for the beach, while we tried and I think failed to walk every one of the alleyways. I'll be honest we managed a fair bit of snoozing too. We needed it. Daisy's not been so well of late, and I think the Cretan heat made us slow down and just rest a bit. Saying that we also hiked two gorges, one small and full of natural pools to swim in in the shade and cool off, one claiming to be the deepest

and longest in Europe at 16km long. A bus takes you to the top of the gorge and you hike to the sea past more beautiful natural pools and a lot of stern looking wardens reminding you that it's drinking water and not to put your stinky feet in it! After 6 hours of fairly hard hiking you pretty much throw yourself into the sea to cool off and ease your aching feet. It was stunning though, definitely worth the effort and the day after we did about the most touristy thing we could find and went to a water park. Daisy and I only discovered the pure, simple, childlike joy of water slides fairly recently. I think it balances out all the cultural things we visit and the hikes we do. It's just great fun. For our last few days we moved up into the mountains to Milia Mountain retreat. Built out of the ruins of a village uninhabited since the 50's, it's completely off grid with banks of solar panels, spring water and much of their own produce for the restaurant. Two local families whose parents had lived there decided in the eighties to get the right to enclose the land, I would guess between 5 and 10 hectares... hard to say when half of it is a near vertical mountain ... and reduce overgrazing and manage the land in a more sustainable way. The difference between their parcel of land and their neighbours was stark, theirs being more lush and green, the neighbours while not barren at all was definitely the

It took us a while to get Daisy out of the restaurant each day as the list of delicious things to eat was as long as Daisy's desire to try them all, but when we did, we headed to a secluded beach edged with 1000 year old Cedar trees, each lazily dripping sap into the shady sand. Instead of parasols each family had a tree to shelter under. The sea was as clear and blue as you could possibly imagine. We had a snorkel to share and there was shoal after shoal of fish of all sorts and sizes. Lulah and Emma each saw octopus too...and as it turns out, probably a bit more than any of us had bargained for as two young Greek gods took to the water with not a stich on. Daisy and I laughed out loud as we watched the girls stuck on a rock looking in all of the other 300 or so degrees around, anywhere except there!

The only thing that really riled me was as we drove to the beach through acres and acres of greenhouses, growing mostly tomatoes I think. There were goats on what at first I took for piles of old plants, which it partly was, but it was mostly old baler twine used to hold up the tomato vines. And then when we parked it was in a sea of litter, mostly from the greenhouses but of course a lot from the likes of us. There was just so much of it, I felt quite angry. Daisy just quietly got out and fetching a bag from the boot filled it with rubbish from next to the car, tied the top and walked it over to the huge waste bins left for the purpose. Baffled, I did say to her, "What good will that ever do, look how much there is?" Cool as a cucumber and already getting ready for the beach she just said, "Yes, but at least that bit is clean". I admire her for it but struggle with that myself. I'd have to go back with industrial sized skips and a contract with a polypropylene recycling company in my hand. It says a lot about both of I s'pose, and it's no different at work; I'm all about the big Italian gesture the grand sweeps of jobs done and jobs to do, while Daisy focusses on the small stuff, all the small things I just can't be bothered to do. I'd spend all day walking awkwardly over something just to get on with the work, but Daisy'll move it straight away, tidying it into the right place. She just smiles, and then I don't walk awkwardly anymore.

This is our parish, our community and we are proud to be able to celebrate Her Majesty in her glorious years of achievement.



Village Hall Plans

Please take a look at our revised plan for a village hall extension and tell us what you think (writes Neil Carter, chairman, Clayhidon Village Hall Committee).

Before the pandemic stopped everything the hall committee was able to make big improvements, thanks to the generosity of local people and donations from Viridor and our parish, district and county councils.

We replaced the leaky roof, bought equipment for the kitchen, and invested in sound and film projection equipment. We also gained planning consent for an extension behind the stage, but this has expired and we have to reapply.

The committee took the opportunity to look again at the extension plan and we now think we could do better.

So, here's the new plan—pretty similar to the old one but a little bigger and, we think, much better.

We have added a new entrance lobby on the side of the building towards the back of the car park. When necessary, we can turn this into a one-way system, using the existing front entrance as

There's a lot more storage, in addition to the original plan for converting the old toilets to stores for tables, chairs, portable staging and other equipment.

We are separating the bar from the kitchen hatchway, to improve hygiene and reduce queuing. There's much more room allocated to the new toilets.

We'll have a smart, well insulated small meeting room, which on performance nights will double-up as a green room. And there's an upstairs area for the parish archive, where the wonderful records kept by the history group can be stored safely.

Charity Update

Rose Cottage

Following pre-application advice from Mid Devon District Council the plans to demolish Rose Cottage have been revised. The scheme now includes the redevelopment of the developer's Brethren Chapel, next door to Rose Cottage, and a pair of semi-detached 3-bedroomed homes with garages. At this stage no decision has been made with regard to how the charity might proceed with Rose Cottage and it will obtain legal advice to ensure it complies with any Charity Commission regulations/guidance.

Hartsmoor Lakes

Unexpectedly, in July, Mike Leigh-Mallory resigned from managing the lakes. The charity thanks Mike for all the time, effort and help he has given to the charity during the last year or so.

As a temporary measure the lakes have been closed, the gateways have been blocked and members of the fishing syndicate have been refunded their fees.

The charity will be considering its position. It is inviting business plans from those individuals that have expressed an interest in running the lakes on behalf of the charity and hopes to appoint a new manager.

In the meantime, the charity was hoping that the community would come out and help finish the otter fence that has been erected around the syndicate lake. The charity suggests the weekend of 20th/21st August. A collar and skirt need to be fitted and there are areas that need strimming, trees cutting back, as well as a general tidy-up of the area. If you are able to help, please let us know by emailing the clerk at the email address provided at the bottom of this report.

News From Rosemary Lane Chapel

Both have been well attended when it has been possible to meet, and this was true of our final sessions. Venturers enjoyed a 'Big Summer Special' on the chapel field with a bouncy castle, ice cream stand, sandcastle competition and many more summer games. The weather was perfect, and the kids had a wonderful time. A week later and the Toddler group concluded their season with a trip to Vivary Park for fun, games and a picnic.

These aren't the only activities to pause over the summer. The BSG Lunch Club hosted by Rosemary Lane Chapel also has a break in the month of August as the pattern of midweek meetings eases for the school holidays. Of course, even now, planning begins for the new season of activities which will get underway in September (see adjoining ad for further details).

That said, not everything comes to an end during the summer season. Our regular services held on a Sunday at 11am continue as we meet together to worship the Lord, enjoy fellowship and share in His Word. Ever since that evening of being filled with a sense of wonder at God's creation I have been thinking about some of the words written by King David. David spent many nights with the stars for a blanket and the ground for his bed. This was true from a young age when, as a shepherd boy, he watched his father's flock. Later in life he similarly slept under the stars when on the run from his enemies or heading to battle. It is unsurprising then, that someone who so often looked up into the starry night sky should write this (Psalm 19:1-4):

The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands. Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they reveal knowledge. They have no speech, they use no words; no sound is heard from them. Yet their voice goes out into all the earth, their words to the ends of the world.

For David, the sun, moon and stars revealed the glory of the Creator. They also had the impact of making David aware of how small he was in the context of creation. Small, but not insignificant! For God, who names all the stars, knows you by name also. He knows you and He loves you. This thought, stirred by the skies proclaiming the glory of God, caused David to fall in wonder and worship (Psalm 8:9):

Lord, our Lord,

how majestic is your name in all the earth!




