#### THE BLACKDOWN H LLS TRUST

The Blackdown Hills Trust is looking for local volunteers to help check stock fencing around the grazing units in the Neroche Forest area. These sites are managed by the Blackdown Hills Trust in the Blackdown Forest for grazing conservation: they are a magnet for rare butterflies such as Wood White and Duke of Burgundy and an array of plants, insects, birds and mammals. The areas are part of a Higher Level Stewardship and are grazed by English Londhorn cattle in the summer months.

#### What will the volunteer role involve?

The role will involve walking the stock fence twice a year during the spring and autumn in the grazing compartments to check for any rotten posts or damage to the wire, and reporting back to the Trust. There may also be opportunities to get involved in practical conservation work, for example clearing conifer re-growth to allow native flora to thrive.

Full training will be provided for the role, including maps of the sites, appropriate contact information and information on what to look out for.

#### A Queen like no other

Our greatly loved Queen Elizabeth was loved not just because she had been our Queen for so long – more than 70 years – nor because she had been so widely travelled and met so many people in this country and around the world but because of the person she was, because of her character.

There are no reliable recorded incidents of Queen Elizabeth losing her temper, using bad language, or refusing to carry out a duty expected of her. Most of us would probably find it impossible to match that record for a week never mind 70 years. How did she manage to be like this, to show such remarkable consistency of character for so long and to be what we call these days a remarkable 'role model'?

She answered this herself back in 2002 when she said that it was all down to the depth of her trust in God. Here is exactly what she said then:

"I know just how much I rely on my faith to guide me through the good times and the bad. Each day is a new beginning. I know that the only way to live my life is to try to do what is right, to take the long view, to give of my best in all that the day brings, and to put my trust in God... I draw strength from the message of hope in the Christian gospel."

Perhaps that trust also had something to do with a poem by Minnie Louise Haskins which became famous during World War 2 and which she gave to her father, King George VI. Here is the opening section of that poem, called **God knows**, which the king used in his Christmas broadcast:

And I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year 'Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown' And he replied: 'Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the Hand of God. That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way' So I went forth, and finding the Hand of God, trod gladly into the night.

As you give thanks for all that Queen Elizabeth has given to us, please reflect on the fact that our character depends on finding the Hand of God and clutching it tight.

Joining with you in thanks for Queen Elizabeth and welcoming King Charles

#### The Violet Chapman Trust

The Violet Chapman Charity (Charity registration number 299996) was established in 1986 after Mrs Violet Chapman, who was a patient of the Blackdown Practice, gave a substantial gift to the doctors, which was intended to provide patients with services and help that were not available under the NHS.

The original Trustees were Dr Jonathan Meads, Mrs Chapman and Sir Christopher who, at that time, was senior partner with Ashfords Solicitors and one time president of the Law Society. The Trustees were, at this time, all volunteers not drawing any salary or expenses, and this remains the case to date.

The Trust has discretion to give grants for medical equipment and treatments as well as giving financial assistance to patients of the Blackdown Practice for numerous purposes.

All grants are given for the physical and mental wellbeing of the patients, and many will gain support by the help the Trust gives in supplying counselling where the NHS is unable to supply.

There are many examples that we could give of the patients we have helped recently and would cite one that required

their bathroom to be modernised to enable them to continue to live at home; another patient who needed a chair that would help them in getting in and out without assistance. Another example is a patient who had severe back pain and a grant was given for them to have remedial massage.

If you feel the Trust can help you we would suggest you talk to your GP or any person who gives you support and submit an Application form which can be found online or pick one up from any of the Blackdown Practice surgeries. Having said that, there has not been much activity at County this last August and of course, any meetings in Sept has been postponed because of the mourning period, but those meetings will take place in time, so it is going to be hectic, particularly the build up to preparing for next years budget, which will be very challenging as you will see below.

At month 4 it is estimated that budgets will overspend by £17 million, excluding the dedicated schools grant deficit. This is made up of an underlying overspend of £35.6 million that is being reduced by £18.6 million of Financial Sustainability Programme (FSP) proposed savings and income. There is also a risk that inflationary pressures could result in costs, in addition to this overspend, of more than £10 million this year. The pandemic and geopolitical situation has created huge financial pressures nationally and the County Council is not immune from that. Immediate action is being taken to safeguard the financial sustainability of the authority. Work is ongoing to identify services and projects in both revenue and capital that can be transformed, modernised, remodelled, funded differently, ceased, or postponed. At month 4 £18.6 million of in year savings and additional income has been identified and work is ongoing at pace to increase this figure and further reduce the forecast overspend. I thought you might be interested in what is happening in the Devon Housing Market and what the latest data is showing.

- Housing affordability in Devon increased to 10.35 times the average salary in 2021. Around 20% higher than the rest of UK.
- Average house price is £300,000 in Devon. No area
  of Devon currently has an average house price that
  would allow a first-time buyer to access 'help to buy'
  provision of an 'average' dwelling.
- ◆ 3,726 new dwellings added to 385,000 stock in 2021 including 600 'affordable homes' (a net gain of 490 after accounting for a loss of 110 through Right to Buy). Against an increase in working population of around 4000.
- At the current rate of net additions to affordable stock, even if we closed housing lists tomorrow, it would still take over 32 years to clear the backlog (reducing to 26.7 years if Right to Buy was scrapped noted to show that while it (RTB) is a significant factor for a number of reasons, it's not the whole story).
- Housing waiting lists numbers increased to 16,058 households by the end of 2021, with 4,500 requiring urgent accommodation. The number of people classified as homeless across Devon increased by 600 last year.
- Private rent stock levels across Devon fell by around 50% between 2019 and 2021.
- The number of housing benefit claimants aged over 70 rose steadily through the year, to 7,000, a

- 4% increase on the previous year. Only 7 additional supported housing units were however completed in quarter 1 of 2022.
- The number of individuals living in accommodation consider insanitary, overcrowded or otherwise unsuitable rose to 3,000 by the end of the 2021 across the area. 374 households were in temporary accommodation during Q4 of 21/22, including 70 with children.
- Devon had 11,100 second homes registered during 2021, an increase of around 2% since 2019. In South Hams, second homes made up 8.3% of all housing stock in year. It should be noted however that these official figures may significantly underestimate the real number of homes being used for Airbnb and other purposes.

The Council is committed to becoming an organisation that is intolerant to prejudice and discrimination and helping Devon to be a place that is inclusive, compassionate, and caring, where everyone can feel safe. Progress has been made in response to the findings of the Race Equality Audit report, with actions taken to support colleagues and develop a more inclusive culture. Work will continue to address racism in the workplace and our communities and to improve the protection of staff.

T emyock Skatepark, a little summary of our activities. The idea for a skatepark in Hemyock was born out of a public meeting in February of 2020, when our community was asked for ideas on how to use the community land given by Cavanna homes. From this initial meeting 4 local parents, who had seen the benefit of skateparks, formed a team.

A worldwide pandemic and 2 lockdowns later it has evolved into a successful campaign backed by the local and wider community with a developing network of support from industry professionals in the skateboarding community. Our initial community activity consisted of 19 young residents of Hemyock canvassing door to door to share their ideas about a community wheeled park. Over 500 signatures of support were collected. We created a proposal pack which was shared with the Parish Council collating research with benefits of wheeled parks, feedback from Councils within the South west Region, amongst other details. Anyone is more than welcome to view this pack. The Parish Council agreed to locate a wheeled park in the sports area within the Longmead complex. We created a tender pack which was sent to numerous skatepark builders. We have now appointed Maverick to build our park and the designs have been displayed at all of our events. If you would like to take a look then please contact us. We have applied and won several community grants over the last year to provide free community events, which you may have joined us for. Our first pop up skate jam took place in January, held in the Garages we were overwhelmed by the success and support from the community.

Since January we have created 3 more pop up free community events with mobile skate ramps and stalls as well as free skate coaching sessions. We have welcomed over 1,200 guests, provided over 200 free lessons, generated an income of over £8000 which is held by the Parish Council. We have built up a loyal brigade of skate jam volunteers A special thank you must go to Alannah our face painter extraordinaire, Fiona our provider of cakes and all those who have quietly supported the project from attending on the day, sweeping the MUGA the night before, manning a stall or helping load tables like Bob did for our September jam. We have been lucky enough to see the very best of individuals coming together for this exciting project and we thank anyone who has helped along the way. We have forged links with skate professionals, as well as other skate parks and their councils. We have received thousands of pounds worth of prizes for each event to support fund raising opportunities. This has allowed us to provide free first aid training to 12 local teenagers and build up assets in the form of equipment, we now have a free to loan service to anyone wanting to participate without having a financial impact. Our pop-up jams are now complete and the time and energy which was used to plan them is now going to be used to complete targeted fundraising and bid applications to reach over £230,000 which will give us a bespoke competition standard

#### Hemyock History Group

Te started our new financial year with a talk from Mr
Amyas Crump on the Culm Valley Light Railway.
Amyas's father was manager of the Hemyock Milk
Factory which was the reason the Railway was built down the Culm
Valley between Hemyock and Tiverton to take fresh pasteurised
milk from the Blackdown Hills to London.

One of the steam trains was called Amyas and when the Milk Factory closed, the future of the branch line from Hemyock was also sealed. The railway was built by Victorian industrialists and started operations in 1876, closing in 1975, so just missed celebrating its centenary. No doubt the railway line from Hemyock connecting with the GWR lines around the south west, must have attracted many people to live in Hemyock. One resident, Rector John de Burgh Forbes came from the royal court in St Petersburg, where he was chaplain to the British Ambassador, since he could journey from Hemyock by train to Plymouth and onwards to the Mediterranean where he could spend his winters on Sicily where he also served at church.

Amyas displayed many unique photographs of the trains steaming through the pleasant green hills of the valley from Hemyock with station stops at Whitehall, Culmstock, Uffculme, Coldharbour Mill and Tiverton. A smaller branch line ran from Whitehall to Culm Davy where there was brick manufacturing from the available clay. In Hemyock the railway milk tanks were towed over the main road at Millhayes to be filled with milk in the factory before being towed back onto the line behind the engine.

In its heyday the railway would take children from the valley to study at Tiverton Grammar School and back home again. This was certainly an incentive to study and pass the 11+. Children at the current Hemyock Primary School could be forgiven for not being able to answer the question as to why there is a station road in Hemyock, since there is very little evidence of the line today. The last passenger service on the line ended on September 9th 1963 and the line continued for goods traffic until October 1975 when the Milk Factory was producing St Ivel Gold spread using technology brought in from Denmark and Sweden. The vegetable oil required for the process was transported down from Liverpool by lorry until it was decided that the Gold Spread could be manufactured in Liverpool without this delivery cost and due to the grants being offered for companies investing in the Liverpool area. Our thanks to Amyas for the remarkable photos he displayed.

Our next talk will be on Thursday 13th October when Alan Reeve, at one time Financial Director of Taunton Cider, will be talking about the History of Taunton Cider and why it collapsed, while Thatchers have gone from strength to strength. The November talk will be given by new Hemyock resident Chris Benn on his career in the RAF as a Air Defence Strategist.

#### What a long hot Summer!

Despite the hot dry Summer all of the new hedging trees have survived, probably due to the clay soil. The raised beds were not as bountiful this year due to the dry weather but people were able to forage rhubarb, blackcurrants, onions, courgettes, strawberries and herbs

#### Future work:


Weed and replenish the raised beds with compost Continue the care if the hedging saplings Planting of 200+ narcissus and daffodil bulbs donated by Allies Devon

#### St. Andrew's Church News

here have been two memorable events which we have particularly enjoyed during August. After a family service, followed by coffee and biscuits outside church, we made our way down to the field behind the car park where we could sit in a marquee or in the sunshine to have the particular delight of a barbeque and vegetables which were so delicious and a really lovely choice of desserts. This was a very happy occasion for socialising with so many.

For three afternoons including bank holiday Monday, there was a History Group's exhibition to celebrate Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee. The church was decorated with Union flag bunting and banners from earlier jubilee celebrations that had taken place during her reign. Newspapers from as early as 1952 lined the south wall of the church.

There was a long line of photographs of the clergy who had served at St Andrew's from 1949 until the present day. This included Revd. Way who was the last rector to serve solely at Clayhidon but also included visiting bishops from Exeter, Plymouth and Crediton. Numerous events that have taken place at St Andrew's were shown and changes to the building inside, such as the oak screen at the vestry and another above the balcony. The bell ringers were also in photographs from very early years.

There were photographs of new and changed buildings of Clayhidon and so much change in farming from the time of horse and cart to the latest machines and methods of milking by robot. MPs were on display; flooding in Clayhidon; the visit by Prince Philip to Fenix Carriages – our only Royal visitor. We even had photographs of birds which have visited the parish that had not been seen in our country in 1952.

We were delighted to welcome new people into the church who live in remote areas of the parish and who have not entered St Andrew's previously.

The annual service which we hold for horse riders was due on September 11th. Of course by that date we had heard of the tragic news about Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II. Rather than cancel the event, we decided because of the Queen's great love of horses, to hold the service with reverence and to sing the National Anthem to King Charles III. More than thirty riders and horses attended and everyone appreciated the

#### **CLAYHIDON LOCAL HISTORY GROUP**

uring the bank holiday weekend in August, there was the annual exhibition by the Local History Group, which was held on three afternoons in St Andrew's Church.

This year our subject was Clayhidon during the reign of Queen Elizabeth II, recording events and changes which have taken place in those seventy years. The church was ornately decorated and we had many banners from previous celebrations to show. There was also an incredible amount of newspaper photographs of our Monarch enjoying the festivities. The newspapers which younger people had never seen hung all along the south wall and were a wonderful reminder to older people of so many glorious occasions.

There was a vast photographic display of incredible changes which have happened in our parish. From the time of farmers using a horse and cart we could see the astonishing use of such powerful machines that are seen in the fields today. Farming has developed to such an extent that cows are milked whenever they feel like it and by a robot! The photographs proved it. On another farm, milk is available whenever you want to help yourself from a machine or you can pour yourself a milk shake.

So many new houses have been built or barns have been converted. The Half Moon has been extended as well as changing its walls from white to blue and back to white. Covid brought about changes with special people delivering goods. There were photographs of all our MPs. Many changes have taken place in the church building, and the series of new rectors was displayed. Perhaps one of our most unexpected changes is in some new birds which now visit us. A photograph of one of the heron family, an egret, shows it in a stream that leads into the River Culm. Seventy years ago, it had never been seen in this country.

The visitors who came thoroughly enjoyed staying for a long observation and perusal of our parish where so much has happened in this dreamy atmosphere.

#### MILK BAR GOES BANANAS!

brave new business venture on a Blackdown Hills farm has "gone bananas" in its first two weeks. Palmers Farm, Clayhidon, where the same family has lived for 300 years, has become an unlikely tourist destination since Jamie Blackmore and his wife Casey and mother Thelma opened a fresh milk vending machine and milkshake bar.

"We're thrilled by the number of walkers, cyclists and motorists who have managed to find us and are stopping to buy milk and shakes. It's just gone bananas," said Casey. "We're a tenthgeneration, family-run farm in the Blackdown Hills and take huge pride in looking after our herd of gorgeous girls. We believe a happy life spent grazing the fields makes for the most delicious, nutritious milk around." Customers can buy fresh pasteurised, non-homogenised whole milk or create their own milkshakes with a variety of syrup flavours. Reusable 1-litre glass bottles are for sale, or people can bring their own.

The Milk Stand is on a lane just over a mile outside Hemyock (postcode EX15 3PS). "We think it makes the perfect stop if you are on your bike or enjoying a family walk," said Casey." There are a couple of picnic tables so you can stay a while and enjoy the beautiful surroundings while you sip. You might even hear the tinkle of Fiona's cowbell as she grazes the fields nearby with her friends. The Blackmores' herd of British Friesian cows are milked twice a day, and their milk is then pasteurised on Palmers Farm in a newly converted shipping container.

It is a season, a time in which we stop and, as we give thanks for another year's harvest, set our minds to consider more broadly, the thankfulness we hold. Both in my personal life and in the life of the fellowship at Rosemary Lane Chapel, there is much that we are thankful for. In the context of recent years, we are grateful for the opportunities to regularly meet together, to welcome others into the life of the church and extend hospitality to various groups within our community. We are grateful to those with whom we have forged relationships this year, both at home and overseas. We are grateful for the many people who give of themselves with a servant heart to enrich the life of the church and the community around us. We are grateful for the love and support of others, friends, family and neighbours, especially when, for many, life has been difficult. And, above all, we are grateful to God, the One who is the great provider, Lord of the Harvest, for his enduring faithfulness and love through each and every day.

King David, who knew many highs and lows in his life, knew what it was to be strengthened by the practice of thanksgiving. On one occasion, when the Ark, a symbol of God's presence, was restored to his people, David knew to whom he must turn, and did so with this song of thankfulness (1 Chronicles 16:8-11):

Oh give thanks to the Lord; call upon his name;
make known his deeds among the peoples!

Sing to him, sing praises to him;
tell of all his wondrous works!

Glory in his holy name;
let the hearts of those who seek the Lord rejoice!

Seek the Lord and his strength;
seek his presence continually!

David's thankfulness was an invitation for others to consider the goodness of God. This is true also for us, our thankfulness, nurtured in this season of harvest, is an opportunity for others to consider the faithfulness of God. Of course, nowhere is His faithfulness seen more abundantly seen than in the sending of His Son, the coming of the Lord Jesus Christ to be the very presence of God with us. The Apostle Paul knew this, and through very difficult days in his life, never lost touch with the power and poignancy of a disposition of thankfulness. Indeed, Paul wrote these words whilst imprisoned in Rome:

Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord, always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ

- Ephesians 5:19-20

This encouragement toward a spirit of thankfulness, the kind nurtured in the season of harvest, seems so fitting at this time of writing when, as a nation, though we mourn the loss of our Queen, we are collectively filled with a sense of thankfulness for her sense of duty, the grace in all her conduct, and the servant heart by which she undertook all her duties in serving the people of this nation and the Commonwealth. Perhaps most poignantly for me, is a sense of thankfulness for the way in which she shared her faith in Jesus and the hope and joy it brought our Sovereign. In the foreword to a book written as part of her Platinum Jubilee celebrations, the Queen said this:

I have been – and remain – very grateful to you for your prayers and to God for his steadfast love.

I have indeed seen his faithfulness.

I pray that we would each see the faithfulness of God in Christ Jesus and find cause for thankfulness in the varying seasons of our
