

#### THE BLACKDOWN H LLS TRUST

The Blackdown Hills Trust is looking for local volunteers to help check stock fencing around the grazing units in the Neroche Forest area. These sites are managed by the Blackdown Hills Trust in the Blackdown Forest for grazing conservation: they are a magnet for rare butterflies such as Wood White and Duke of Burgundy and an array of plants, insects, birds and mammals. The areas are part of a Higher Level Stewardship and are grazed by English Londhorn cattle in the summer months.

#### What will the volunteer role involve?

The role will involve walking the stock fence twice a year during the spring and autumn in the grazing compartments to check for any rotten posts or damage to the wire, and reporting back to the Trust. There may also be opportunities to get involved in practical conservation work, for example clearing conifer re-growth to allow native flora to thrive.

Full training will be provided for the role, including maps of the sites, appropriate contact information and information on what to look out for.

In A Christmas Carol, Ebenezer Scrooge suppresses both happy and distressing memories of Christmas past by pretending Christmas doesn't exist. In the Puritan Commonwealth of the 1650s, Cromwell abolished Christmas altogether, and two years ago Christmas was effectively 'cancelled' by the second lockdown of the Covid pandemic. Normal service was resumed last winter, but this year many households are finding it hard to look forward to a Christmas celebration as a combination of price rises, a hike in interest rates and soaring energy costs eat into the meagre budgets of the least well off. Add to that the fears about the situation in Eastern Europe, climate change and political instability, and many people will be wondering whether there is anything to celebrate at all.

For some, eating and drinking rather more than normal and spending time with family or friends might seem a welcome distraction from the unremitting gloom, but overindulgence is often followed by regret, and too close proximity for too long can strain relationships. It might be tempting to think, like Scrooge, that Christmas is mere humbug.

Life for Mary and Joseph wasn't a bed of roses either. While it's reasonable to assume that, as a skilled carpenter, Joseph would not be short of work and therefore fairly comfortably off, he and his wife had their lives turned upside down by a capricious official demand that they relocate to Bethlehem, along with thousands of others. The result, as any child can tell you, is that they ended up in sub-standard accommodation with limited hygiene facilities while Mary gave birth to her baby.

The life of shepherds was pretty tough too. They were poorly paid, out in all weathers, marginalised and exploited by the owners of the flocks they tended. Yet, as they made their way back to work on the first Christmas night after having been summoned to an encounter with the Holy Family in the stable, those shepherds were over the moon with joy and excitement because they had seen the fulfilment of a promise that God would make his home with humans, sharing their sorrows and sufferings and offering hope for their futures. Their joy and excitement represent the true spirit of Christmas. I hope and pray that, whatever challenges any of us face this Christmas, some of that joy and hope will touch our lives.

#### SMCCS TEN YEARS ON

2022 has been quite a year for St Mary's Charity and Coffee Shop. Thanks to all the support we have had by people donating and purchasing items we have been kept busy all year. Not to mention all those coffees and teas the Friends group have made as our refreshment providers.

One of the aims of the Charity shop is to send as little as possible to land fill sites. So we may well send excess items to other charities, some go to refugee groups, some to specialised outlets, some to recycling units and some even gets sold to clothing companies.

Newer readers may not know that as well as supporting the church we also support other charities, mainly those in the village but also some, like the Air Ambulance, which support the village. #### **Theatre Trip**

went to a theatre whist on holiday. Nothing unusual in that you might say, But there was. The stage was wide, very wide, Wide enough for 100 people to stand next to each other.

There were wide open sections at the back of the stage too and one could watch the sky turn slowly dark- er as the performance went on. The interval was a bit long too, getting on for two hours, but then the performance started in the early afternoon and did not end till around 10pm. Most of the audience, (about 4,800 of them) seemed not to speak the language the play was performed in.

There were scenes with just one or two actors, and others with 3 or 4 hundred on stage. There were children doing what children do, running in and out and chasing each other. And there were animals, lots of them. Not your pantomime horses, real horses, and camels and donkeys and dogs and doves – didn't see a cat but I could not say there were none.

Some times the action was quiet, two or three having a polite conversation, other-times it was an angry crowd all trying to get their point across.

Then there was the chap who committed suicide hanging himself from a tree.

So not your average theatre production. If you have not guessed by now we were in Germany in Oberammergau for the Passion Play.

The play came about in1633 when the plague was sweeping across Europe. People in the village vowed that if the dying stopped they would stage every 10 years a play detailing the "passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ". The dying stopped and the village has kept its vow. Nearly everybody in the village is involved in some way in the current productions, nearly 2000 local people. This year's version (it does change slightly as new facts about life in Jesus' time come to be known) was postponed for 2 years due to Covid. Whether the next is to be 2030 or 2032 I cannot say at present.

Would I go again? YES In some way it offers the New testament stories we know well seen from a different angle. If your German is limited, or non existent, worry not. You are given a copy of the script in your own language. And the theatre seats are reasonably comfortable for the 6 hours or so you might be in them. We cannot say tickets are cheap but you get a lot for your money including all that rethinking when you get home. We went with a company specialising in pilgrimages and similar trips, staying just over the border in the Austrian Tyrol with a group mainly from Northern Ireland (The firm kindly recommended by Rev John Stone) and it was a wonderful holiday.

So we offer it as something you could look forward to, certainly a "once in a lifetime" event, but still with enough in it to make going again a whole new experience. Some of our party were on their third visit and came out just as excited as they had been on their first visit. Why not give it some thought?



#### cr2ee - Hugh Scudder Talk

orrendously harrowing but equally highly heartwarming was the talk given by Hugh Scudder, Director of Christian Response to Eastern Europe (cr2ee) at the Church Room Hemyock organised by Janice & David Bawler

Hugh, who has made numerous visits to Moldova on behalf of the charity, began his talk describing his recent trip on taking aid to Ukraine. His slides and videos reminded those present of the onslaught being made on the country including an air raid warning with planes flying overhead during Hugh's visit.

The second half of his talk took those present to Moldova, Europes poorest country, showing just how dreadful life is for an enormous number of the population. Tumbledown homes are dark and dirty with often only one or two rooms which serve as living area, kitchen and bedroom. The only heating and cooking facility is frequently a tiny wood burning stove or open fire and sometimes the only lighting a candle. Those in cities struggle to find work whilst people in the countryside have only their own manual power to pull basic equipment and transport for those who have it is a horse and cart - even Father Christmas uses this as he distributes the thousands of Christmas Shoeboxes donated by people who support the work of cr2ee.

Hugh spoke of the work that the charity has carried out in the country for over 30 years including soup kitchens where far more than soup is served, to work in orphanages, schools and medical centres and summer camps.

Despite their desperately poor lives the people the charity meet are inspiring as has proved by the way they have welcomed people fleeing Ukraine into their homes.

#### **Hemyock History Group**

#### **Taunton Cider**

Our October talk was given by Alan Reeve who was the financial director of Taunton Cider back in the 90's who started his talk with an interesting DVD of the growth of Taunton Cider from its formation in 1911 until the company closed operations in 1998.

Taunton Cider started when an experienced cider brewer met a local businessman and clergyman in Norton Fitzwarren to decide to start a more professional approach to cider production. From small beginnings the company grew to become one of the major drink producers in the country, producing 40 million gallons per annum. The factory was also updated on a regular basis to ensure the latest production equipment was installed with 80 oak casks containing 50,000 gallons each. All the manufacturing equipment to enable the assembly of the casks of all sizes were held in the workshops where skilled Coopers held fort. The conveyor equipment was also of the latest design from the movement of the apples as they arrived directly from the orchards, moved automatically in channels where water washed all muck off the apples and into the presses with the juice flowing into containers ready for the fermentation process with yeast produced in the chemistry laboratory added in the appropriate amount. Although this is an art learned over many years the machinery replicated the brewer's arts and all controlled from a computerised process control desk. The entire operation was so advanced that the large drinks company Matthew Clark decided to buy the company in 1995 for £256m and amalgamate it with its other operations. This amalgamation operation, like many other businesses in the UK, sadly resulted in the closing of the factory in 1998 with the production moving to Ireland leaving the land on which the factory had been occupying becoming available for houses. Some of the local workers must have moved into these new houses, of course. However, the products such as Dry Blackthorn, Diamond White Autumn Gold and Red Rock died out.

We can now announce that Taunton Cider is back in business thanks to Hemyock residents. The name has been bought back from Matthew Clark and production of Taunton Cider is growing rapidly. We were surprised to find that our local friends brought along several crates of the new, old Taunton Cider which were given out to the lucky members of the History Group who have been enjoying this premium cider drink with their meals since the meeting. We can also report that our friends at the Post Office can supply you with bottles of the new Taunton Cider at a very reasonable cost. So at a time when we are concerned about supplies of Christmas fayre to ensure our celebrations you can depend on Hemyock Post Office.

#### **Air Defence**

We were grateful to new resident Chris Benn for his explanation of how our UK air defence operated over the years since World War 2. Chris's 31 years with the royal Air Force has given him a privileged position in the understanding of how we are defended from foreign aggression. Radar has been the protective umbrella that has enabled our defences to withstand incursions. Chain Home radar provided the defence during WWII but was wound down after the war. Following the Russian development of their own atom bomb in 1949,

a new system evolved and technological advancement with rapid development of the Air Defence system with command and control delivered from 2 sector operations centres at Raf Buchan in Scotland and RAF Neatishead in Norfolk. The control rooms were originally located underground in secure bunkers, and continue to be today. Chris reported that he had been moved between these control centres in the UK and overseas every 18 months or so and the family became very used to packing and unpacking! From Buchan in the NE of Scotland to Manston on the South Coast where the RAF station has been turned into our first stop for immigrants arriving by boat across the channel. These 2 operations centres have since been replaced and command and control is now centred on the control and reporting centre at RAF Boulmer in Northumberland and decisions to scramble air defence fighter aircraft held at either the Combined Air Operations Centre in NATO to respond to any Russian long range aviation, or the National Air and Space Operations Centre at RAF High Wycombe for National air policing. Naturally the full details of the UK's air defence cannot be explained to the public or there will be more trouble makers trying to make the news, but google UK QRA and there is a good you tube video. Hopefully this careful control of every incursion of our air space will prevent danger caused by actual intentional enemy activity. The same protection is also provided, for instance for the residents of the Falkland Islands where Chris and family were stationed for a year in 2002. We can only be extremely grateful for our national security to people like Chris and their families for providing such dedicated service over so many

The next meeting of the History Group is on the 15th December when the talk will be about the person who built our Church room in which we meet, the Rector John de Burgh Forbes. The January meeting will be on the 12th January when Dr Bryn Morris of SW Archaeology who will be talking about local Roman sites that he has been involved in excavating. All meetings are at 7.30pm in the Church Room. From the new year all meetings will be on the second Thursday of the month.

#### The Violet Chapman Trust

The Violet Chapman Charity (Charity registration number 299996) was established in 1986 after Mrs Violet Chapman, who was a patient of the Blackdown Practice, gave a substantial gift to the doctors, which was intended to provide patients with services and help that were not available under the NHS.

The original Trustees were Dr Jonathan Meads, Mrs Chapman and Sir Christopher who, at that time, was senior partner with Ashfords Solicitors and one time president of the Law Society. The Trustees were, at this time, all volunteers not drawing any salary or expenses, and this remains the case to date.

The Trust has discretion to give grants for medical equipment and treatments as well as giving financial assistance to patients of the Blackdown Practice for numerous purposes.

All grants are given for the physical and mental wellbeing of the patients, and many will gain support by the help the Trust gives in supplying counselling where the NHS is unable to supply.

There are many examples that we could give of the patients we have helped recently and would cite one that required

their bathroom to be modernised to enable them to continue to live at home; another patient who needed a chair that would help them in getting in and out without assistance. Another example is a patient who had severe back pain and a grant was given for them to have remedial massage.

If you feel the Trust can help you we would suggest you talk to your GP or any person who gives you support and submit an Application form which can be found online or pick one up from any of the Blackdown Practice surgeries. So look out for bulbs planted around the Longmead area but also on the entry into the village from Culmstock and Culmbridge, along St Margaret's Brook by the castle and in Millhayes park. Many thanks to Allies Mid Devon and to all the volunteers who helped in the planting. We look forward to some Spring colour.

The fruiting hedge whips mostly survived the long hot Summer and have put on some impressive growth in the few months that they have been planted. They are hardy little things. If you have room in your garden for a tree, remember to put the 5th February 2023 in your diary. There will be a Tree Hub outside the Longmead Pavillion from 10am where up to five free broad-leaf trees will be given to anyone who wants to plant them at home, on a first come first served basis. The initiative is supported by Saving BritainsTreescapes and the Devon Wildlife Trust.





#### **Dear Residents**

can't believe another year has nearly gone, I think the year is getting shorter, I hope the year has been good to everyone. It has been a difficult year for me, with my family issues, but we are getting by.

Of course we lost our Queen, what a wonderful lady she was, must have been the world's most famous person. We have been given a statement of the financial position of County, I thought it would be useful for you know the situation, it is not good, we have a lot of work to do to produce a balanced budget. The Chancellor of the Exchequer has set out the Government's economic plan which includes further squeeze on public sector spending from April 2023.

Even before this announcement, Devon County Council is projecting that savings of £75 million will be needed next financial year (April 2023 to March 2024) unless the Government intervenes. Councils are required by law to balance their books, but with few available reserves left in the bank, this leaves Devon, like many other councils, at a very real risk of bankruptcy unless action is taken by the Government. Of course, all this comes on top of the huge savings we are already having to make in this financial year, and we would like to thank everyone for their tremendous efforts so far in helping to find and make these savings. But today we have taken the decision to issue a stark public warning that if the situation does not change, then radical cuts that have a significant impact on the quality of life for everyone in Devon will be unavoidable. I know this message is hard to hear and will raise many questions and concerns. The important services that we help to provide are the lifeblood of our county and directly impact on tens of thousands of local people. Many of you will also be Devon residents who, alongside family and friends, use the County Council's wide range of services day in, day out. We would like to stress that absolutely no decisions have been made about where any cuts might happen, and some very difficult conversations will be taking place over the coming weeks with our Strategic Leadership Team and elected Members to find savings whilst limiting the impact on everyone as best we can. We have never witnessed a financial crisis in local government of this magnitude. We have always been rightly proud of the authority's sound fiscal management, our ability to manage the resources we have, and adapt how we work together with our partners in order to protect vital local services and support the most vulnerable. But these are unprecedented times. Rising demand for services after the pandemic, rising costs and the impact of inflation are all taking their toll. The interim Chief Executive is determined to do all she can alongside our elected Members and leaders to fight for Devon's corner, for our vital services, for you and for the people of Devon. Our Leader, Councillor John Hart, is lobbying Devon MPs to make very clear the dire financial situation we find ourselves in and he has also written personally to the new Prime Minister laying out the risk to public services. As a reminder, through our Financial Sustainability work we are already making £36 million of savings this financial year (April 2022 to March 2023). This has been achieved across all services and includes holding vacancies in non-frontline areas and stopping some routine road maintenance. We are squeezing all our contracts with external service providers and reviewing things like school transport for children with disabilities, as well as delaying planned investments in IT and infrastructure

projects, and cutting office heating and lighting bills. We are reviewing all high-cost activity in both Children's and Adult Services with the focus on transforming and improving the support we give while saving resources. We are also reviewing our properties and will be looking to dispose of assets where they are no longer needed. Even then we must find a further £37 million this financial year, largely because of rising demand in adult and children's social care, higher prices for care packages and a higher national pay award to reflect the cost of living increases we all face. I will, of course, keep you updated on our financial position and response. In the meantime, Maria Chakraborty was appointed to the role of Head of HR on an interim basis on 1 May 2022 following a competitive internal selection process. Following consultation with the Trade Unions and in line with our Secondment Policy, we can now confirm that Maria is now our permanent Head of HR. From Tuesday 1 October 2022, the Energy Price Guarantee will reduce the unit cost of electricity and gas so that a typical household in Great Britain pays, on average, around £2,500 a year on their energy bill, for the next two years. Beware of scams - there is no need to apply and you will never be asked for bank details.

With the rising costs of food and energy starting to bite, councils are focusing on what they can do to help support individuals and families.

Recently, we made a few announcements about help or advice available. There are national schemes available to help households with the current cost of living, and information about all of them are available on the one central government Cost of Living Support website. Discounts and offers are available for businesses to help with the cost of living. The Local Government Association (LGA) cost of living hub continues to share best practice designed to help councils to support their residents with the rising cost of living. Mobile Boost Scheme

CDS operates the Mobile Boost Scheme, funded through the Heart of the South West Local Enterprise Partnership's Growth Deal, which is upgrading indoor 4G mobile phone coverage in rural areas. The initiative has helped over 1,105 small businesses and homes which have inadequate coverage, or only have access to one provider and are struggling with connectivity. Businesses and households in Somerset, Devon, Torbay and Plymouth can apply for a voucher of up to £1,200 towards the cost of a mobile signal booster from a registered supplier. The value of the voucher is dependent on the type of technology most suitable for the premises. For further information please contact, Connecting Devon and Somerset.



#### No surprise that this is such a hot topic at the moment.

"The cost of things just keeps going up. The food shop doesn't stretch as far and my bills just keep getting higher and higher. I've made cutbacks and, at the moment, I am just about managing but I am really worried about how I'll cope as it starts getting colder. What should I do?"

A great many people are struggling and worried about rising costs – you are not on your own but there are some steps you can take and support that is available to you.

Check out the online budgeting tool on the Citizens Advice website www.citizensadvice/org.uk.

Also on that website you will be able to find out if you are eligible for any benefits or additional support with your energy costs. There is advice on how to reduce living costs, a benefits calculator and information on other ways to increase your income.

From October 1st. the Energy Price Guarantee limits the cost of gas and electric prices for most households for a period of two years. From October the Energy Bills Support Scheme

also takes £400 off your electricity bill. You don't have to do anything to get the money and you don't have to pay it back. You'll get £66 in October and November and £67 in December, January, February and March. You should automatically get it if you pay by direct debit, standard credit or payment card.

If you have a prepayment meter that isn't a smart meter, you'll get the discount via vouchers or as an automatic credit when you top up at your usual top-up point. Your supplier will let you know how they will issue it. If you have a smart prepayment meter the credit should automatically be added to your meter. If you still can't pay your bills speak to your energy supplier as they have a responsibility to help you come up with a solution.

At CA TNMWD we can also advise on budgeting, managing debt and getting a smart meter installed if that would help you to control costs. #### Longmead

Maverick is still pulling together its final design for the skatepark, including a flood risk assessment and the relocation of the oil tank. Once the pc is happy with it, the application will be submitted to MDDC.

The youth football club is considering the installation of floodlights at the pavilion so that the grass pitch may be used all year around.

The drains around the road to the containers are blocked and need attention. The situation is made worse by cars driving on the grass and making the area muddy. As a temporary measure, the pc intends to install some sleepers to protect the grass areas and then next year consider a larger project to look at the best surface for these areas.

Unfortunately, the village has recently suffered some vandalism in the public toilets. The baby change station has been destroyed and toilet paper has regularly been thrown on the ceiling, blocked the toilets, and been thrown down the road. The toilet roll dispenser has been destroyed and the cistern was pulled apart, resulting in water flowing out of the cistern and flooding the toilets. These acts of vandalism results in additional costs to repair, replace and clean – costs that are met from the precept levied on parishioners and paid to the parish council. This is a waste of public money and disappointing as the money might have been used in a more positive way for the benefit of all.

HTC committee met recently to review club matters, look at how things have gone in the past season, particularly league tennis, but also to look at ways in which we might improve the club for the benefit of the membership as a whole.

The tennis club is affiliated to the LTA, and the club has recently renewed the annual LTA registration. This process should give the membership peace of mind that the club has been able to provide evidence of (for example) safeguarding and welfare policies and complete a comprehensive risk assessment. The policies can be easily found on the club website - there is a drop down box under 'More' where they can be viewed. A date for your diary! The club is planning a winter social evening on the evening of January 13th 2023, with skittles, a buffet, hopefully a short quiz, and the 40 club draw! We owe a debt of gratitude to our team captains, Malcolm and Karen Steer. Their enthusiasm and encouragement had a positive effect, with both league teams having very good seasons. Hemyock A will play in Division 3 of the WSL next year, and Hemyock B can look forward to consolidating their position in Division 5, and with consistency, can have realistic hopes of promotion. Malcolm and Karen will both be presented with a bottle of wine as a token of appreciation for their efforts. Those visiting the courts can't have failed to notice how the paint is fading rather badly. Chiltern, our resurfacing contractors, hoped to clean and respray the courts before the Autumn, but this has not proved possible. However, they have now given an undertaking to clean the courts in early Spring 2023, and aim to respray a short time afterwards. This should mean that the next court repaint following that (probably around 2027-28) will coincide with resurfacing. The club is fully aware that inflation will mean this will prove a much more costly exercise than last time, so the sinking fund will be kept under review to ensure adequate money in the coffers.

This brings us on to the topic of membership numbers, and it's clear to the committee that the club must do everything possible in an effort to grow the adult membership. A number of different ideas have been tried over the years, for example, a discounted membership rate on first joining, or free 'rusty racket' sessions, but with limited success in recruiting adult members in the long term. One idea that has some merit and the committee wish to explore is to offer a number of free coaching sessions (say 6 - 8 sessions) to new members who may feel that their present skills need improvement. Exactly how we'll make this work needs a little refinement, but watch this space for more details.

Another date for the diary is 30th March, when we hope to at last hold our AGM. We need more committee members to help the existing committee, also someone to help oil the wheels of managing Clubspark, ideally a 'membership secretary' and it would be great to have someone keen on the publicity angle of the club who could for example get articles and photos to media, local newspapers, and keep the website fresh and relevant. All help and volunteers gratefully received.

Finally, a big thank you to Dan Sizer, our coach for his wonderful work with the juniors, who are still queuing to take part in his after school sessions, and to everyone on the committee for their ongoing commitment and support.





#### Parish Lengthsman

The parish has a modest budget to employ a trained lengthsman to maintain those ditches/drains which are no longer maintained by Devon County Council. Please report any problems to the clerk or a councillor so that the lengthsman may be deployed where he is most needed.

The pc has been successful in its bid to the Highways Maintenance Community Enhancement Fund for materials to mend those potholes that do not qualify for repair by Highways. The pc will review this project to see how long it takes to use the pothole repair kit and how successful the repair is.

#### Hedge

Many comments have been made to the council about hedges around the parish encroaching on to roads. Residents are politely asked to ensure their hedges are kept trimmed. Whilst there are some restrictions on when hedges may be cut, if there are road safety concerns then under these circumstances those restrictions do not apply.

#### **Local Tradespeople**

From time to time the parish council employs people to carry out tasks on its behalf. These tasks range from repairing a wall, improving and repairing footpaths, gates and bridges, clearing ditches, and other general maintenance works. The parish council is keen to use local tradespeople and to that end if you would be interested in quoting for any such works then please contact the

clerk giving your contact details and the types of work you are interested in and your details will be held on file.

#### **Rose Cottage**

The scheme to demolish Rose Cottage and build a pair of semi-detached 3-bedroomed homes with garages has been submitted by a developer to MDDC. No planning decision has been made on this application. The charity awaits a decision before it considers what it wishes to do with regard to Rose Cottage. The charity is keen for there to be smaller, more affordable, homes in the parish, rather than Rose Cottage being redeveloped to create another large house. At this stage no decision has been made on how the charity might proceed with Rose Cottage and it will obtain legal advice to ensure it complies with any Charity Commission regulations/guidance.

#### **Hartsmoor Lakes**

The charity has chosen a new team to manage the lakes on behalf of the charity. A lease agreement is being drawn up and the charity hopes that, with some investment, over time, the lakes will provide an income for the charity to use for the benefit of the parish. The charity is taking a long-term view with the lakes (5 years plus). Once the terms have been agreed between the parties and an agreement has been signed, etc., the charity will share its future plans for the lakes and how the parish may benefit from them.

Thank you to all those who attended the volunteering day back in August. The otter fence is almost complete and the area around the lakes is looking a lot neater and tidier.

#### The land

The charity has agreed a new 5-year lease with Rob Burridge to graze the land.
