### THE BLACKDOWN H LLS TRUST

The Blackdown Hills Trust is looking for local volunteers to help check stock fencing around the grazing units in the Neroche Forest area. These sites are managed by the Blackdown Hills Trust in the Blackdown Forest for grazing conservation : they are a magnet for rare butterflies such as Wood White and Duke of Burgundy and an array of plants, insects, birds and mammals. The areas are part of a Higher Level Stewardship and are grazed by English Longhorn cattle in the summer months







#### What will the volunteer role involve?

The role will involve walking the stock fence twice a year during the spring and autumn in the grazing compartments to check for any rotten posts or damage to the wire, and reporting back to the Trust. There may also be opportunities to get involved in practical conservation ork, for example clearing conifer re-growth to allow native flora to thrive

Full training will be provided for the role, including maps of the sites, appropriate contact nformation and information on what to look out for

#### Springtime of the Soul

Most people who know about the Church's season of Lent - the 61/2 weeks leading up to Easter - will imagine it as a miserable time; after all, isn't it traditionally the time for giving up things that are nice or fun? While it is referred to as a "penitential" season, and the concept of penitence is tied up with saying sorry for the wrong things we have done or those which make us feel bad, the whole Christian concept of confessing those wrongs and seeking forgiveness is mainly about

making a new start. There is certainly no reason for wallowing in self-pity or self-loathing.

The name Lent comes from lencten, an Old English word for Spring, which

refers to the lengthening of the days, bringing the promise of summer warmth, new growth and the fruits of nature. I guess fewer of us have a "spring clean" than used to be the case, but springtime was the time to move things outside to expose the dusty cobwebby corners to daylight, and to clean up the dirt and mess that had built up through the winter.

I hope nothing I've said stops anyone from denying themselves some luxury during Lent, as long as it is for a good reason and doesn't just make them miserable; but don't rule out the possibility of taking the opportunity afforded by this season to make some positive change in behaviour that might benefit you as much as those around you. The warm glow you perceive will be down to the "springtime of your soul".



In many ways, Lent is a bit like New Year - an opportunity to resolve to change one's life for the better in a small way. So rather than giving up chocolate because it's naughty but nice, one could decide to do something positive each day - something as small as saying "hello" to a neighbour who often gets ignored, or offering to run an errand for someone who is housebound. Even if such acts of kindness conferred no spiritual benefit, I write this having just

> listened to Michael Moseley explaining how doing such acts has been shown to have a beneficial effect, not just on mental wellbeing (the "warm glow" we might expect), but also improving our bodies' immune responses and making us less prone to physical illnesses.

If you look around, the UK has some very creatively named small businesses - there's even an annual award to celebrate them. Recent winners / nominees include: A one-man gardening business trading as 'The Lawn Ranger', 'Petal Pushers' (florists), 'Pride and Groom' (dog/cat groomer), 'Wish You Wash Here' (dry cleaners), a Suffolk tiling business called 'Grout of this World' and independent coffee roastery, 'Perky Blenders'.

Maybe they should run a similar competition for churches, as there are some unusual titles around. Some choose names from the Bible that are thought to be appropriate. So, you find chapels called Ebenezer, which means 'The Lord has helped us', or Bethel, meaning 'The house of God'. But I particularly liked one from a type of church looking to reach people who might not feel so comfortable in a traditional setting. They meet in a pub in a busy city centre and offer many of the things you would expect to find in a conventional church building. I love the title: the church in the pub is simply called 'Bar None'. In the words of the advert, it does exactly what it says on the tin.

Some people get the wrong idea about church if their experience of it has been limited. Sadly, for others, their experience of church has given them the wrong idea about God, and instead of being drawn to him they have felt that their failings disgualify them from coming to church at all. Churches shouldn't be exclusive clubs for the initiated but communities that live out the invitation of Jesus to come, bring our burdens to him and exchange them for his rest (Matthew 11:28). I'm sure our local churches echo this sentiment - maybe it's time to give church another try; after all, Jesus came for everyone... Pastor Steve

#### Hemyock History Group

r Peter Fisher gave a talk to our December meeting about a mysterious death in 1869 in what used to be the Merry Harriers. At the time the Somerset Yeomanry would meet in a field overlooking the Vale of Taunton for their annual exercises. Using tents and outside kitchens to look after the men they would parade up and down looking splendid in their uniforms. The field kitchen with its red brick structure can still be seen in the field on the north side of the top road towards Blagdon and Corfe. This is of interest in that the son of the man who died was in the Yeomanry and stationed at the camp.

The unfortunate father had brought his daughter with him and entered the Merry Harriers on a mission which he never accomplished having travelled from their home in eastern Somerset by train and foot. One can imagine the goings on in the public house which the yeomanry would have been excluded from by order of their officers. The unfortunate man was known as an itinerant umbrella trader. Was he hoping for a sudden downpour to catch the locals out so that he could supply his products in sudden demand? Or was he intent on acquiring more products by nefarious means as he walked through the pub's cloakroom. The documents that Peter has researched do not give a definitive background to the story. Suffice to say that the unfortunate man died, his daughter was looked after and his son continued to serve in the Yeomanry and another man served a few months in jail for manslaughter.

We were pleased to welcome a South Korean TV crew for the entire day on the 14th December when they filmed various History Group members talking about the importance of learning about our history, preserving historical documents and important images for our community. In fact one of the important reasons why they came to Hemyock was that they wanted to show their public back home how our community involve all ages in activities. In fact many of our local residents in their 70's and 80's, if not older are involved on almost a full time basis protecting our community assets, bringing groups together and getting everyone involved in intellectual, musical, Christian and other varied interests to the benefit of those people who become involved and for the benefit of our community. The film they have produced is being edited back in South Korea and will be available at some stage this year. The TV group also went to a village in Hampshire and Chippenham in Wiltshire.

Charlotte Bacon from SW Water gave a very interesting talk at our January meeting about the workings and finances of the Water Company, which has recently acquired Sutton and East Surrey Water and Bournemouth Water in addition to Bristol Water. They are responsible for 860 miles of coastline round the SW and have an objective of reducing spillages to a level of 10 per annum per asset by 2040. There were 27 spillages recorded last year. Of the £900M spent by SW Water last year £700M was provided by the customer invoicing. SW Water has strong finances paying out 8% of their total expenditure in dividends and 8% in loan interest.

Customers use on average 145l of water per day and SW Water can supply many useful tools to help customers reduce their consumption such as a 4minute shower timer, a buffalo plastic device to reduce water usage per flush. They will also supply a water butt free of charge that can save surface water for use around your home and garden. They have 655 water treatment plants across their area and are regulated by Ofwat, and the Environment Agency. Their plan is to have designated clean bathing facilities on the coast within 1 hour of any residential area in the SW. They also have plans to develop 9 desalination plants converting sea water into clean drinking water.

The February meeting on 8th February is a talk by Peter Walter on Vestry meetings and the March meeting on 14th March is a talk from John Young on 'The Vicar of Broadhembury, AM Toplady (1740-78)'.

#### **Dear Residents**

Tes, we are well into another year, so I hope you all had a good Xmas and this year will be good. We are now into the time when we have to prepare for the next coming Council's budget. AS always it will be difficult to arrive at a balanced budget, which we have to present to Full Council on 15th Feb. As the budget has not been agreed yet, I can't tell you what the Council Tax increase will be, DCC together with the Police and Fire Authority have to submit it to the MDDC who will then send out the Council Tax request.

The Senior Leadership Team has worked extensively with the service leads and finance officers to forecast costs and to develop plans to manage net service costs within affordable financial targets.

At Month 8 it is estimated that budgets will overspend by £4.5 million, comprising the £2.9m of in-year additional savings still to be identified plus net £1.6m in other variances. This is an improvement of £9.1 million compared to the Month 6 forecast.

This report provides a brief update on progress in this regard and presents the proposed service budget targets for 2024/25 totalling £743.4 million, a net increase of £43.8 million or 6.3% compared to the 2023/24 adjusted budget.

In terms of the Budget for 2024/25, inflationary pressures continue to be felt across the economy, local government and our partners and social care is particularly impacted by increases to the national living wage. Within the proposed Service Targets, it is proposed to allow for £22.8 million in total inflationary pressures. The rates of inflation used depend on the activity and any anticipated contractual obligations.

The inflation rate has continued to fall, and in November was 3.9%. The National Living Wage increase also drives an inflationary impact on our costs.

In the Autumn Statement, announced on 22 November, the Government confirmed the National Living Wage will increase by 9.8% to £11.44 per hour. The Target Budgets set out below include £25.7 million for this additional cost. Despite the rate of inflation falling in recent months the impact of inflation on cost of living, business and service delivery costs places sustained financial pressures nationally, and this contributes to the ongoing impact in terms of price and demand pressures on the Authority's budget.

This is reflected in the proposed Target Budgets with investment of £48.5 million to cover inflation and national living wage plus £44.9 million to cover demand and other spending pressures and priorities. To enable the authority to set a balanced budget, savings, alternative funding and additional income of £49.6 million have been identified. Overall, there is additional funding of £43.8 million or 6.3% for services next year.

It is not currently planned to support the proposed budget targets by using general reserve balances. This reflects a strategy of 'living within our means' and as such to set service budgets that are affordable within anticipated income and funding totals for next year.

The proposed service revenue budget targets for the 2024/25 financial year are set out in the table below:

Please be aware, these are only provisional budget figures, yet to be agreed by Cabinet and then Full Council.

We are trying to get on top of the pothole/defect position, the weather has not helped. To give you an understanding of the current level of resources, at present there are up to 26 defect gangs across the County undertaking pothole repairs, supported by 2 additional sub-contractor gangs. With regards to serviceability repairs, we currently have around 8 internally resourced Milestone gangs carrying out larger scale repairs across the County. In addition to this they are being supported by two externally resourced gangs and further work is underway as we speak in potentially bringing in one or two further sub-contractor gangs. Lastly, all four dragon patching gangs are on programmed work this week and will continue whilst the weather remains favourable

a picture of people made to be in relationship with the God who loves them. When our sin enters the equation that relationship is fractured, but because of God's deep love, he does not give up on us. God has always had a plan to deal with our fractured relationship, to make a way for us to come back into his presence and enjoy the fulness of a living relationship with One who loves us, One who will never leave us or forsake us.

Recent weeks have reminded us of God's great plan for our salvation and restoration. God sent his Son who was to be given the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sin (Matthew 1:21). He came to deal with the very thing that brought about our separation from God. He came to bring us back into relationship. He did this by dying on a cross to bear upon himself the sins of the world. Rising on the third day he now lives, the Good Shepherd, leading his people into the presence of God.

But how are we to understand this relationship? Why is this relationship so greatly treasured by so many, myself included? Well, Jesus teaches us the answer to this question in his own life and ministry. In each of the Gospel accounts, when Jesus speaks about God, he characteristically refers to him as his Father. And when Matthew, Mark, Luke and John provide an insight into the prayer life of Jesus, we hear him addressing God as Father. This was more than a term of endearment. As Jon Bloom writes, 'God as his Father was a fundamental relational reality to him.' Perhaps nowhere is this more clear than in the Garden of Gethsemane when, with the brutality of the cross before him, he cries out, "Abba, Father" (Mark 14:36). The Son loves the Father and the Father loves the Son.

We are invited through the Gospels to see the love that exists within the Godhead, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. But astoundingly, Jesus' heart is not only for us to see this love, but to know and experience it for ourselves. It is the deepest heart of the Father and of the Son, for us to share in this love. And so, when Jesus teaches his disciples to pray, he invites them to pray like this, "Our Father in heaven" (Matthew 6:9). Jesus invites us to know and experience and enjoy the Fatherhood of God over our lives, and he makes this possible through dealing with all that once separated us from this most treasured relationship. The Lord God Almighty, King of Kings, He who is Holy, Holy, Holy and dwells in unapproachable light, this God invites you to know and experience and enjoy his Fatherly love through Jesus the Son.

God made us for relationship, to love one another and to love God. To know and experience and enjoy his Fatherly love. John, in his Gospel account and in his letters, was deeply taken by this most wondrous gift. I pray that his words, inspired by the Spirit, may stir our hearts to consider God's great love for us, that he longs for us to be his children and know him as Father.

See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are! 1 John 3:1
