THE BLACKDOWN H LLS TRUST

The Blackdown Hills Trust is looking for local volunteers to help check stock fencing around the grazing units in the Neroche Forest area. These sites are managed by the Blackdown Hills Trust in the Blackdown Forest for grazing conservation : they are a magnet for rare butterflies such as Wood White and Duke of Burgundy and an array of plants, insects, birds and mammals. The areas are part of a Higher Level Stewardship and are grazed by English Longhorn cattle in the summer months

What will the volunteer role involve?

The role will involve walking the stock fence twice a year during the spring and autumn in the grazing compartments to check for any rotten posts or damage to the wire, and reporting back to the Trust. There may also be opportunities to get involved in practical conservation work, for example clearing conifer re-growth to allow native flora to thrive

Full training will be provided for the role, including maps of the sites, appropriate contact information and information on what to look out for

Clergy comment

I write just after the assassination attempt on Donald Trump at a rally in Pennsylvania. In the recriminations, soul-searching and conspiracy theories which are emerging, a thread running through all of it is the power of words. Power to inspire, to inflame, to mislead, to spur or goad into action.


One reason that many people have turned their backs on religion is the perception that beliefs strongly held lead to the believer becoming both self righteous and intolerant, and we see this borne out I guess in every religion. In this country we know of the bloody history of Catholic and Protestant persecution of each other in the sixteenth century. But where religion

is thrown out of the window, another equally powerful and potentially destructive force comes into play - politics. And when the two combine it can be toxic and often lethal. But each sphere of belief can instead lead to great good.

In all this it is important to recognise the power of words. As a priest conducting wedding services I see the power of words to transform two people from individuals to a married couple. As bride and groom make their vows to each other their words, witnessed by others in a legally recognised context, effect that change. The words of the judge in a law court have the power to send the defendant to prison or to release him. We take words so much for granted we can forget how powerful they are.

What we believe about ourselves and others does matter. And when we express those beliefs our words have power to harm or heal, to build up or tear down.

> When Jesus was asked by a group of lawyers to say which was the most important of all their religious laws he famously cut through all the rhetoric and hair-splitting, the politics and religion, by saying simply, There are just two laws: love God with all that you are and have, and love your neighbour as yourself.



What we believe about ourselves and others does matter. And when we express those beliefs our words have power to harm or heal, to build up or tear down. In the Christian tradition there is great emphasis on committing particular words to memory so that they can continue to shape our thinking, outlook and

> approach, both to life in general and, in particular, to other people. The words of the liturgy of the services we use week by week focus our minds on God's goodness and his loving commitment to us. They invite us week by week to examine our own motivations and actions in the light of God's goodness. And offer us the chance to recommit to the core values of loving God and our neighbour.

When these words are lived out in daily life, in our politics and in our religions, they lead to all that is creative, life-giving and world enhancing.

The Blackdown Practice will be offering Flu vaccinations in line with NHS guidance to:

- patients aged 65 years and over
- patients aged under 65 years in defined clinical risk groups
- patients who are residents in care homes ٠
- patients who are carers
- close contacts of immunocompromised individuals
- pregnant women

We will have plenty of Flu Vaccines available and will be able to arrange appointments for all of our patients who are eligible.

We do not yet have details of the Autumn Covid vaccination plan - but we hope to offer eligible patients their Covid boosters during the flu clinics.

Our booking process will open during mid-September and we expect to start vaccinating from early October onwards. We will hold vaccination sessions across all three of our surgeries.

Bookings will be a combination of direct to mobile text booking, online booking, and by telephoning the surgery flu line number. The easiest way to book an appointment if you have a smart phone is by SMS booking – but we cannot send these if you have declined SMS messaging.

Further details of the booking process will be made available at the beginning of September-please do not contact the surgery with queries regarding flu until this information has been made available.

RSCM MUSIC SUNDAY

he Upper Culm Valley Mission Community on the eastern edge of Devon is blessed with a number of highly talented musicians - singers, instrumentalists, conductors, music directors and music teachers. RSCM Music Sunday afforded the ideal opportunity for five of these to collaborate on launching our 'Music Round the Parishes' initiative, a drive to bring high quality music to the three churches in Culmstock, Hemyock and Clayhidon, giving opportunity for our churches and wider communities to benefit from this wealth of talented local musicians.

The 'Music Round the Parishes' project began in May with the first in a series of monthly Choral Complines in All Saints', Culmstock sung by the newly-formed Ad Hoc Voices, a handpicked ensemble of singers directed by local freelance musician, Andrew Trewhella.

This has already proved to be a popular and successful initiative with the local community, with each service combining the ancient yet timeless plainsong order with complementary atmospheric choral pieces by composers from the 16th century to the present day. It is offered to the local community as a time for prayerful 'winding down' at the end of a busy week before the pressures of the new week start up.

The Music Weekend's events began on Saturday evening with a Choral Concert in All Saints', Culmstock given by Ad Hoc Voices. Conducted by Gareth Dayus-Jones, Director of music at Wellington School, the programme explored the history of sacred choral music from Hildegard of Bingen to Henry Purcell, via Byrd, Gibbons, Victoria, Palestrina and Monteverdi. Reflecting both Catholic and Protestant traditions, the music included anthems, motets, mass movements and canticles. The following morning saw the largest church in the benefice welcoming Ad Hoc Voices, and an orchestra of able local instrumentalists to lead the music of a joyous and uplifting Choral Eucharist.

The service was led by the Rector and the music conducted by Laurence Blyth. Haydn's Missa Sancti Nicolai formed the framework of the music, with Mozart's Ave Verum and Locus Iste by Bruckner. The hymns were accompanied by organ and orchestra, with appropriately exhilarating descants written specially for the occasion by musical directors Laurence Blyth and Andrew Trewhella. The sermon and intercessions further orchestrated the theme of celebrating the role of music in worship and thanking God for its ability to enhance our lives more generally, as expressed in words from the hymn 'Angel voices' - 'craftsman's art and music's measure for thy pleasure all combine'. The choral weekend closed with a serene sung Compline by candlelight in Culmstock, featuring sublime choral pieces by Purcell and Ben Parry and led by Andrew Trewhella.

It was the RSCM's designation of 9 June as Music Sunday which prompted this collaboration of local musicians. The choral Eucharist was a completely new experience for the benefice but was so much appreciated that there were many calls from the congregation to celebrate the Eucharist this way at least annually. By the same token a number of the singers commented on how refreshing and illuminating it was to sing the Mass in its intended setting, rather than as a concert item.

Following the Music Weekend this group of musicians continues to meet to plan ways of bringing high-quality music to the churches - and through them to the wider community - through the key festivals of the church year. We look forward to experiencing many more good things to come!

If you've 'put your foot in it' recently, here's something to cheer you up. Back when Judi Dench was a young up and coming actress, she played the part of Juliet at the Old Vic. Crouching over the dead Tybalt, she cried: "Where are my father and my mother, nurse?" At this point her father, who was in the audience and suddenly seized by a senior moment, stood up and said: "Here we are, darling, in row H!"

You might recall the story of two glider pilots in Scotland who began to lose altitude. They spotted a 'nice-looking field' close to the River Dee and decided to put down. On doing so, they found themselves surrounded by armed police officers. It turned out that the field was the cricket lawn at Balmoral, and the whole incident had been watched by the Queen and other members of the royal family, who were taking afternoon tea. MIST UPON THE MEADOW


Each day I take the meadow way, I never tired of what I see, For every day will run it's way, It not having been that day before.



Hemyock Parish Council update

ur AGM was held in May and it was good to see so many residents attend. Our Chairman Paul Doble gave an update on work that the Council had done over the previous year, such as emergency drainage at Longmead, mending the decking on the footbridge, dealing with the overgrown trees by BHLAC to improve safety. This is as well as supporting various clubs and groups within the vilage- the Cricket club, Junior and Senior football, BHLAC, the Community Larder and many others.

Paul also gave an insight to projects which the Council are looking to support and work on this coming year such as the fitting of cameras at Culmbridge and at the Old Milk Factory footbridge to be used as early flood warnings which have been kindly funded by ANOB, as well as receiving the Community Land in the Autumn, we will also continue to support the Community Larder as this grows.

We were pleased that many of the clubs which we support in the village came to the evening and provided us with updates and plans on what they wish to achieve in the coming year too. We had a very interesting presentation from the Repair Cafe team, as well as reports from the Garages, Tennis club, Football clubs, Longmead Environmental group, Blackdown Hills Parish Network and the Skateboard Park group. Our District Councillors, Bradshaw and Clist gave their report from MDDC.

The need for more housing is ever growing, but is very dependant on the Cullumpton relief road, without which the Culm Garden village to the east of Cullumpton could not be built. The MDDC is looking to provide a further 500 affordable or social rentable homes over the next 5 years and would be working with the Coummunity Land Trust to move this forward.

The Parish Council also used the evening as an opportunity to recognise individuals who had made a significant contribution to the village. Presentations of flowers were made to Karen Pinder for her work at the Garages, used by the Youth club, Scouts and other village groups, Sarah Bitmead for her work in setting up the Community Larder, and also to Heather for her many years of work as a Parish Councillor.

The evening was a great success especially with the wonderful burgers supplied by Ellishayes!

The Violet Chapman Trust

The Violet Chapman Charity (Charity registration number 299996) was established in 1986 after Mrs Violet Chapman, who was a patient of the Blackdown Practice, gave a substantial gift to the doctors, which was intended to provide patients with services and help that were not available under the NHS.

The original Trustees were Dr Jonathan Meads, Mrs Chapman and Sir Christopher who, at that time, was senior partner with Ashfords Solicitors and one time president of the Law Society. The Trustees were, at this time, all volunteers not drawing any salary or expenses, and this remains the case to date.

The Trust has discretion to give grants for medical equipment and treatments as well as giving financial assistance to patients of the Blackdown Practice for numerous purposes.

All grants are given for the physical and mental wellbeing of the patients, and many will gain support by the help the Trust gives in supplying counselling where the NHS is unable to supply.

There are many examples that we could give of the patients we have helped recently and would cite one that required

their bathroom to be modernised to enable them to continue to live at home; another patient who needed a chair that would help them in getting in and out without assistance. Another example is a patient who had severe back pain and a grant was given for them to have remedial massage.

If you feel the Trust can help you we would suggest you talk to your GP or any person who gives you support and submit an Application form which can be found online or pick one up from any of the Blackdown Practice surgeries. The Trustees are proud of the speed with which they are able to help patients and in many cases are able to provide financial assistance within two weeks.



Around Hemyock

he last few weeks has seen many events taking place, not least a general election, and it is a pleasure to note some here. Early June saw the commemoration of D-Day 80.

Sarah Folland sends the following: -

Sarah was very privileged to accompany her cousin, Patricia Owtram, a WW2 veteran, to the Ceremony at Portsmouth on June 5th. Pat was a WREN working with the naval Y service during the war. Pat was based on the South coast of England and would intercept German messages from German aircraft, ships and U boats, deciphering these where appropriate and sending these across to Bletchley Park.

Sarah said, 'We were very fortunate to meet King Charles, Queen Camilla and Prince William as well as the then Prime Minister and his wife.' They were all very generous with their time speaking to all the veterans and joining in a lunch afterwards. It was a very colourful occasion but there were some very moving and welldeserved tributes to many who landed in Normandy, many of whom did not survive for more than a few hours or days. We must continue to remember them all and work to honour their sacrifice and contributions, many sadly died at such a very young age.'

There will be those with their personal memories, but we mention that locally a short Act of Remembrance took place at the War Memorial led by the Rector with David Bawler laying a wreath.

We are also able to recall that the late Sam Mather had been awarded, as a Chevalier, The Order of Legion d'Honnuer having been involved at the D-Day landings at Arromanches. Geoff Pike remembers how everyone was glued to their radios at the time and that a week beforehand a convoy of around 900 vehicles passed through Hemyock via Ridgewood Hill on their way to the south coast. He says the area seemed very quiet as the American Forces stationed at Culmstock had left.

Some villagers will remember Jan Richardson, wife of Clive who had been a Headmaster here. Jan worked with SOE as a radio operator stationed in Greece.

Like many Jan made no mention of her secretive war work until the couple, who emigrated to Australia long after retirement, was convinced by a daughter to speak of her experiences to local groups.

No doubt there will be an article elsewhere, but Hemyock Day held at Longmead, proved to be a huge success and congratulations go to everyone involved. Someone was overheard saying it brought back memories of similar events that have been held in the village.

The school and parish church have held their traditional summer fetes as always attracting all ages and provided much needed funds for both and by the time you receive the Pump a doorstep car boot sale will have been held (weather permitting!)

Whilst the school fete has grown in size St Marys is somewhat smaller. When held at The Rectory Garden competitions included knobbly knees, dainty ankles, fancy dress with skittles being popular. Report of Hemyock Twinning Visit to France 29th May to 2nd June 2024

T t's been heartening recently, to have fielded a number of inquiries from people asking how they can get on the courts and play a game L of tennis, and for details on how they might join as a member and possibly access coaching, either for themselves or for their children. Hemyock Tennis Club has always been a friendly and welcoming club, and whilst we are always keen to see new members joining and swelling our ranks (no point denying that the funds are always welcome), we are also aware that folk could feel a little self conscious when joining club members at our social sessions for the first time.

Mid afternoon of 29th May found us all gathered in Longmead, Hemyock ready to board the coach for France. A lovely mixed group - some new to France althogether, some going Twinning for the first time and others involved for many years. We experienced no delays at all passing through customs (nor, incidentally, on the return journey) and we boarded the overnight ferry from Portsmouth to Caen Ouistreham.

We were back on the coach in the morning after docking at the unearthly hour of 6.45 (5.45 English time!) so stopped en route for a coffee and breakfast break before continuing to Le Mans where we spent a few hours for a look around and lunch. Le Mans was a revelation to those of us who just associate the town with a certain annual motor racing event (Le Mans 24 Hours). What a beautiful city with a rich history and ancient cathedral and interesting buildings in the old citadel part.

We arrived at our destination - Saint Herblon in the Loire Valley early evening and were met and warmly welcomed by our hosts and greeted with wine (of course!) and cakes and given a brief outline of our visit. The evening was spent with our host families.

We rendezvoused the next morning back on the coach not sure what the day's trip would entail - we had been advised to bring shoes suitable for walking. Would there be a hike in the countryside or a walk along the banks of the Loire? Neither of these - it turned out to be a delightful amble around a nature reserve which was a mixture of mixed woodland, wild meadows and beautiful lakes buzzing with dragon flies. We were accompanied by the owner who talked about the history of the area going back to neolithic times. We had a most enjoyable picnic under an ancient tree in a sunny glade.

Feeling replete and relaxed from the excellent meal (with wine, of course!) we found our way back to the coach for a visit to the pretty coastal village of Piriac. Some of our party braved a dip in the sea while the rest of us enjoyed the magnificent sweeping view of the coastline and a gentle wander around the very attractive village and sheltered marina. Ice creams were had sitting in the shade of a tree in the village square with the strains of a saxophonist playing nearby.

That evening was spent with our hosts. Some got together with other twinning host families whilst others enjoyed a quieter evening getting to know their hosts and coming to the conclusion that it really doesn't matter if you don't speak French and your host knows only a few words of English - you can manage very well with a bit of sign language and good old Google Translate!

The next morning we piled into 2 boats for a trip on the river Loire. This is a beautiful wide river with water levels varying hugely depending on the weather and time of year. After months of wet weather (similar to our English spring) and quite severe flooding

After a free afternoon with our hosts we attended the evening reception in a large village hall where we enjoyed aperitifs and a huge array of canapés set out on long trestles while we chatted together about our visits. We then sat down to a meal of poulet basquaise followed by a cheese course and later some patisserie. In between we were entertained by a group playing traditional Breton music. The committees on each side presented gifts to the other with (happily) short speeches of thanks and looking forward to next year's visit of the French to Hemyock.



in parts, the river was still in full force and very fast flowing. The journey up river took one and half hours whilst only half an hour on the return. It was very windy and with partially open-sided boats we were all rather cold by the end but had enjoyed vistas opening up all around as we chugged along whilst learning about some of the history of the trades along the banks of the Loire.

All too soon early next morning we were back on the coach after a lot of hugs and thankyou's to our hosts and shouts of 'à l'année prochaine' and we were off - laughing as the French demonstrated a lively Mexican wave either side of the coach as we left for Roscoff and the ferry home.

As always, we experienced amazing hospitality from our hosts and came away with the knowledge that we all share the same hopes, fears and joys. That is what Twinning is all about!



Dear Residents

Thaven't got much to report about in and around Hemyock/Culmstock/ Uffculme areas, if there are any pressing issues, please report them L and copy me. I meet with our Highways Officer quite regularly, over highway issues, and I can make him aware of local concerns.

I would like you to know that I have funding available for any club/ organisation/Group from my Locality Budget, if you hear of any, please let them know and to contact me, it can only be relatively small amounts.

This week, a major announcement is on the horizon that promises to revolutionise affordable housing in rural areas. An upcoming launch will transform the way we approach housing, fostering the development of beautiful, sustainable homes and thriving communities. It's a true game-changer that we can't wait to unveil! Stay tuned for more details as the week progresses. we assure you that what's coming will have a profound impact on the future of rural housing.

The Minister for Local Government wrote to local authority chief executives on 16 April 2024 requesting the preparation of a "Productivity Plan" and its submission to the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities (DLUHC) by 19 July 2024. DLUHC officials confirmed that that deadline remains in place despite the change of Government. The Secretary of State for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities announced in January 2024 that the Government would be asking local authorities to produce productivity plans which "set out how they will improve service performance and reduce wasteful expenditure to ensure every area is making best use of taxpayers' money.

The County Council's Highway Term Maintenance Contract with Milestone Infrastructure terminates in March 2027 with no options to further extend the contract. The current contract through which the Council commissions routine, reactive, emergency, and some planned highway maintenance work, started in April 2017 and over its 10 years will have had a value of over £400 million. As such it is one of the largest contracts the County Council commissions. The County Council's current Delivery Model for the Highway Maintenance Service is a combination of the Term Maintenance Contract, complementary Frameworks and Termed Contracts delivering planned works, and an In-House Design Service.

Work that has been undertaken on how the overall Highway Maintenance service could be delivered beyond March 2027, considers the short list of 5 Delivery Model options, and recommends that the Corporate, Infrastructure and Regularity Services (CIRS) Committee advises Cabinet of its views on the short list of options.

This work has identified a clear, short list of 5 Delivery Model options to be considered further. The identified short list of Delivery Model options is The Teckal exemption and a legal principle that allows public authorities to award contracts to separate entities without following public procurement rules.

To continue the current Delivery Model option would entail competitively procuring a new Term Maintenance Contract, with complementary Framework Contracts for specialist and planned works. Alternatively, the County Council could form a legal Joint Venture Company with a contracting partner selected through competitive procurement and negotiation. Options that would

Options that would provide the County Council with full control and responsibility for delivery would be forming a Local Authority wholly owned and controlled Arms-Length Company or creating an In-House Direct Labour Organisation to deliver all of the Service.

Through the option assessment workshops, liaison with other highway authorities, and advice from County Council support services, an assessment of the Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats of the 5 identified options has been made as summarised. The CIRS Committee is invited to advise Cabinet of its views on the short list of 5 Delivery Model options. Our next meeting to consider this will be on 25th Sept.

One of my other duties is to be on the Devon & Somerset Fire & Rescue Authority (DSFRS), on that Authority I am on the board of Red One, a wholly owned Company. I can tell you that this Company is doing very well after a very difficult time with debts, but now it has turned around and will be contributing dividends to DSFRS to help keep Council Tax down for the future.

Some of you maybe aware of issues with Airband's rollout of fibre to the premise delays. At present Airband is undergoing a review of their operations, which alas will include some areas being dropped from service delivery. At this point I do not know the detail but in time I will find out more
