

THE BLACKDOWN H LLS TRUST

The Blackdown Hills Trust is looking for local volunteers to help check stock fencing around the grazing units in the Neroche Forest area. These sites are managed by the Blackdown Hills Trust in the Blackdown Forest for grazing conservation: they are a magnet for rare butterflies such as Wood White and Duke of Burgundy and an array of plants, insects, birds and mammals. The areas are part of a Higher Level Stewardship and are grazed by English Longhorn cattle in the summer months.

What will the volunteer role involve?

The role will involve walking the stock fence twice a year during the spring and autumn in the grazing compartments to check for any rotten posts or damage to the wire, and reporting back to the Trust. There may also be opportunities to get involved in practical conservation work, for example clearing conifer re-growth to allow native flora to thrive.

Full training will be provided for the role, including maps of the sites, appropriate contact information and information on what to look out for.







A Farewell message...

Dear friends

In January I will retire as Rector of the parishes of Hemyock with Culm Davy, Culmstock and Clayhidon, so wanted to put pen to paper to you for the last time.

I want to thank you so much for your welcome of me here over these past five years, and for the very ready way in which so many of you have given support to the churches and their activities even if not regular attenders. The church is here for you, and its continued life within a village community can only be sustained with the support of that community. So thank you for all you continue to do to help us thrive together as church and community, across all age groups.

I have found ministry here in these parishes an absolute delight. It has been a joy to get to know so many of you and engage with so many different community groups. It has been a privilege to be alongside you in those key turning points of life such as weddings, funerals and baptisms, and to share in village life and its events.

During my time in these parishes, I have been struck by two things in particular.

The first is the robust community spirit in each of our villages. People keep an eye out for each other and, with the underlying safety net of the BSG, relatively few of us fall through that net of care when in need. There is always more we can do to support one another through times of crisis though, and I know you will continue to do so.

The second is the extraordinary creativity to be found in these villages. Musical, artistic and culinary talent abounds and greatly enriches the life of our communities - as well as craft skills of all sorts. And these are all things which bring people together. I hope and pray that they will continue to flourish and find

a home and expression in our church buildings and church life as well as in the wider community.

During my time here our churches have sought to be 'communities of faith, hospitality and inspiration, loving God and loving our neighbour'. We believe in a God who is the author and artist behind the rich pallet of life that we have been born into. And that he invites us to get out our own paintbrushes, our special skill set, and the musical instruments that are our lives, to continue creating a world that is good, caring, fruitful, and to his glory. I wish you joy and fulfilment as you live your part in that.

My last day of ministry in the Benefice will be Sunday 12th January 2025 when there will be a Benefice service at St Mary's Hemyock at 11 am. Everyone is warmly invited to come along to that.

It will probably be about a year before a new Rector is appointed. In the meantime the church wardens will keep you informed as to what is happening, and the Benefice ministry team will continue to offer all that our churches currently do and will sustain the links between the churches and our wider community.

If you look closely as you walk through the woods kicking up the caramel carpet you will see where the squirrels have been hiding the beech nuts in little stashes in the ground as they prepare for winter, they dig quickly, look nervously around and then bury their nuts covering over the little hole and sprinting off, trying to remember all their valuable hoards. Ahh another sign, winter must be coming, soon when it gets cold flocks of pigeons from the east of the country will be driven west looking for food and will fill our woods with flutter, searching for the beechnuts left behind by the squirrels.

With the change of the clocks and the winter dark nights and mornings, pedestrian safety is a priority. Please could drivers take care when driving especially where there are no pavements and lighting is poor. Pedestrians please make sure that you can clearly be seen by drivers by wearing light coloured clothing.

At the end of October the flood warning cameras donated by DRIP (Devon Resiliance Innovation Project) were fitted and is funded by the Environmental Agency. The project aims to help communities like Hemyock which are subject to flash flooding, by working with landowners and community groups to slow down and store water upstream of at risk communities during periods of heavy rainfall. The original Trustees were Dr Jonathan Meads, Mrs Chapman and Sir Christopher who, at that time, was senior partner with Ashfords Solicitors and one time president of the Law Society. The Trustees were, at this time, all volunteers not drawing any salary or expenses, and this remains the case to date.

The Trust has discretion to give grants for medical equipment and treatments as well as giving financial assistance to patients of the Blackdown Practice for numerous purposes.

All grants are given for the physical and mental wellbeing of the patients, and many will gain support by the help the Trust gives in supplying counselling where the NHS is unable to supply.

There are many examples that we could give of the patients we have helped recently and would cite one that required

their bathroom to be modernised to enable them to continue to live at home; another patient who needed a chair that would help them in getting in and out without assistance. Another example is a patient who had severe back pain and a grant was given for them to have remedial

If you feel the Trust can help you we would suggest you talk to your GP or any person who gives you support and submit an Application form which can be found online or pick one up from any of the Blackdown Practice surgeries. The Trustees are only too happy to consider any applications. Alternatively for more details please contact the secretary, Mrs Judy Barton on 01823 680975 or j.h.barton@hotmail.com.

The Trustees are proud of the speed with which they are able to help patients and in many cases are able to provide financial assistance within two weeks.

Bygone Christmas Memories in Hemyock

he last Saturday in November saw the members of the Roman Catholic Church hold their Christmas Fair at the Parish Hall signally seasonal festivities in Hemyock had begun.

Whilst most will enjoy the Christmas and New Year celebrations, we remember those who are unwell and families who have lost a loved one thinking particularly of the family of **John Andrews**, **Peter Dearsley and Joan Palmer**, mother of Jacky McCulloch. Condolences, love and prayers are sent their families and friends.

Joan Helen Palmer

Joan was born on 28th November 1926 and family lived at New Malden, Surrey. In 1939, Joan was evacuated to Herefordshire and the family she stayed with involved Joan in art and music When she was 16 Joan joined the Womens Junior Air Corps, learning morse code and how to change a fuse or a tap washer. After the war, she joined the International Exchange in London as a telephonist.

In 1946 she met and married Raymond Palmer: as both were under 21 they had to gain parental approval. In 1947 Michael was born, in 1950, Jacky was born, followed in 1952 by Mark.

The family moved to Stevenage New Town, where both parents worked for the English Electric Company. A move to Biggin Hill saw Joan ballroom dancing, with the Shirley Cox School of Dance. She became a teacher with Shirley Cox and counted Len Goodman, from "Strictly" fame as one of her many contemporaries.

Joan learned to fence and began horse riding, which she really enjoyed. In 1969, she began going to Covent Garden Opera House, where she fell in love with the music of Puccini. Jacky and Joan would often have a box and smuggle in a bottle of sherry for the performance. Joan moved to Wellington, with Ian & family her neighbours, beginning a long lasting friendship, with Jacky joining that family in 1986.

Whilst in Somerset, Joan began breeding and showing Bearded Collies, achieving a 2nd place in her breed at Crufts. Joan and Ray bought a cottage at Winkleigh, Devon. Ray commuted to London Monday to Friday, visiting Devon at weekends.

She began spinning and knitting, using the wool from her small flock of Jacob sheep, making many lovely garments and going to the local agricultural shows, demonstrating spinning and made mittens out of the hair from her Beardies: at one time most of the staff at Lloyds Bank Exeter owned a pair of Beardie mittens!!

In 1985 Joan started painting again using oils, acrylics, pastels, charcoal sketching, but water colour was her favourite. She even swapped the paint brush and paint for the knife and wood veneer, producing amazing pieces of marquetry work.

Joan moved from Winkleigh to North Tawton, then to Honiton in 1991, where she remained until 2022. During her time in Honiton, she taught art at Honiton Community College into her 80's and had her own art class at Upottery. Her other interest was her garden, and she became very knowledgeable about the plants and trees.

She was an excellent driver, driving up and back to Scotland with a friend in her late 70's, for a 2 week holiday. In 2022 Joan

had her second heart attack and had to be looked after, latterly at Abbeyfield Hill House, where she had a room that overlooked Honiton and the surrounding countryside.

Joan joined in the many activities that were on offer and thoroughly enjoyed the good food that was served each day: if food was not to Joan's standards, she would happily give her opinion!!

We know Joan has now found peace, but during her lifetime has embraced the many pastimes she undertook with skill, dedication and talent. A life well lived: she is much loved and will be greatly missed.

The Community Larder/Fridge continues to be well used helping to reduce landfill and save a few pennies. Whilst throughout the village new groups keep popping up inviting folk to continue or start a new interest.

We are all aware of the various trouble spots in the world and as we remember them may this Christmas season wrap us in love, warmth and gratitude and may the coming year bring us peace and happiness.

1st Hemyock Scout Group

The insect hotel is looking much more established now that the sedums, houseleeks and other roof growing plants have taken hold. Thanks to all who so generously contributed plants.

Fruit did well this year- the rhubarb grew strongly, there were a few more apples on the trees by the raised beds and the blackcurrants proved popular for the village jam makers.

A good tidy up session took place on Thursday 7th November when we had the Green Days adults and three super enthusiastic volunteers . We have started on a staged coppicing of the willow around the pond, which will be on a three year rota. This will open up different areas around the pond. Willow is one of those key species that has huge benefits for wildlife. Early to flower, it is great for the bumble bees and other pollinators searching for Spring nectar when they emerge from hibernation. By coppicing the willow, we are rejuvenating it.

The grassy area next to the bug house was strimmed and this will become an open sunny glade to encourage butterflies and other pollinators next summer. A mixture of donated spring bulbs were planted next to, and opposite the bench by the raised beds. Look out for them next Spring. Even though they have previously been planted, they have a second chance to flower and give pleasure.

Raised beds have been weeded, covered with cardboard and bark mulch. The fruiting hedge by the pond has been pruned quite hard to encourage it to fill out next year.

The next session will be on Thursday 5th December, (10.30-1pm) so please join us if you can spare a little time. We shall be adding to the dry hedge, pruning the second fruiting hedge and marking the end of this year with mince pies and mulled apple juice or perhaps something stronger. All welcome!

Dear Residents

his is just a flavour of what has been happening at County. We will be getting into the budget preparation within the next two months, we have to have the budget agreed by Feb.

At Month 6 it is estimated that budgets will overspend by just over £4 million an improvement of £2 million on the month 4 position. However, it is important to note that this excludes the Dedicated Schools Grant (DSG) deficit.

Financial risks within Integrated Adult Social Care and Children and Young People's Futures are still being experienced, but the work underway across the whole authority to support these pressures continues to ensure the whole organisation is focused on achieving a break-even position for the end of the year.

Pressures continue to be felt within the Dedicated Schools Grant (DSG) around demand for Special Educational Needs services both locally and nationally. As part of the Chancellor's Budget on 30th October, the Government has recognised these pressures and has allocated an additional £1 billion to support Special Education Needs and Disabilities (SEND).

More than 1,600 primary school children from across Devon got 'Farmwise' this month and saw for themselves where our food comes from and how it's made.

We invited Key Stage 2 primary school children from 40 primary schools and they rolled up their sleeves and got stuck into a range of activities

It's the 11th time this annual event has been held and teachers and children tell us it's the absolute highlight of their year.

The event is a collaboration between South West Norse, Devon County Agricultural Association, Mole Valley Farmers and us and takes place at Westpoint.

This year it was attended by our Leader, Councillor James McInnes, Chair of the Council, John Hart and members of our Strategic Leadership Team; Maria Price and Maria Chakraborty.

The Council's Revenue Budget for 2024/25 was £743 million, which was 6.3% higher than the previous year (£699 million) and made provision for £48.5 million or inflation and national living wage (NLW), £44.8 million for growth and other pressures and included savings, alternative funding or additional income of £49.5 million.

- For the Children and Young People's Futures
 Directorate, the Budget was set at £227.7 million, an
 increase of 10.4%. This excludes the Dedicated Schools
 Grant which is allocated directly to schools.
- The Council receives funding for its services in a variety of ways. This includes general funding through local taxation including council tax and a share of business rates; general grants from Government through the annual finance settlement for example revenue support grant, rural services delivery grant, social care grant; and other grant funding specific to services such as the Dedicated Schools Grant. The Council also receives income directly from service users in some cases, for example in contributions towards social care.

• The additional £21.5 million investment in Children's Services was made up from £30.6 million in inflation, national living wage and other pressures, £8.5 million in savings and £564,000 in alternative sources of funding and additional income.

In 2023-24, the average recycling rate (N192) for Devon's WCAs was 50.1%, an increase of 1.3% on the previous year. For authorities signed up to the mutually beneficial 'Shared Savings Scheme' (SSS), the average rate last year was 54.3%, with founding SSS member East Devon returning to 60%+ performance which it first achieved in 2019-20. During 2023-24, East Devon (60.1%), Mid Devon (57.9%), Teignbridge (54.2%), West Devon (53.7%), and Torridge (53.5%) all achieved recycling rates over 50% which places these authorities in the top 20% of English WCAs. With the exception of West Devon (-0.2%), all DASWC authorities increased their recycling performance. Devon's rate, as Torbay, also includes Recycling Centres, and achieved a recycling rate of 54.5% (+0.5%) following consecutive reductions in performance since its peak performance (56.6%) achieved in 2019-20. Torbay also showed a welcome return to performance growth at 40.1%, but this is 4.6% lower than its highest rate achieved in 2012-13 (44.7%)

Homes England: Mid Devon District Council has recently announced securing £34m towards the Cullompton Eastern Relief Road, which will relieve congestion in the town and open up opportunities for improved walking, cycling and more reliable bus routes. Devon County Council has been a key partner in securing these funds, being the lead on the planning, design and will likely be responsible for delivering the scheme.


History Group Report

ollowing on from the wonderful display in St Mary's around Remembrance Day and the coffee morning in aid of the Church and The British Legion we had a good group of members who turned up to our meeting on a cold winters evening to discuss the 2 books published by our community on the two world wars. We also played several videos of local residents talking about their experiences living in Hemyock during WW2 with AI generated images of typical scenes in the area with typical country folk.

We also had pages from our Great War book shown on a smart TV using a memory stick so that we could step through the very moving stories of our residents who served in the military during that terrible conflict. The main battleground was the Western Front but our people also served in Turkey, Gaza, Palestine, Egypt, Mesopotamia, Sinai, Persia and India (much larger pre partition). The book and memory stick show these locations with their stories written up due to the support we received from their families and the research of the team back in 2014. We were supported by the Heritage Lottery and organised by the SW Heritage Trust. In addition to the Book we produced a booklet of resource for local schools and groups. We also arranged an exhibition with dramatic monologues played by our members of some of the most remarkable stories. We have a film recorded at the time of these monologues. The discussion at the meeting on the 14th November mentioned a series of monologues staged in Hemyock Village Hall at the centenary of the Great War in 2014. These monologues were filmed at the time and the DVD of the Hemyock people presenting the dramatized stories include Tim Barton with the story of his grandfather Reg Barton, Paddy O'Boyle with the story of Clifford John Sanders, Mo Anderson with the story of Mary Corner, plus filmed interviews with Brian Clist, Barbara Lowman, Barbara Bowden and Joan Cooper interviewed by Marion Churchill.

The groups who produced both the WW1 book and the WW2 book are proud of capturing the stories in these documents and protecting the stories on memory sticks that can now be made available to interested parties. It would be wonderful if the new generation of families in the area could become involved in protecting this heritage. This area of the country has an amazing history that luckily has been protected over the years and safely stored in document and electronic archives by the History Group and the Castle owners. History teaching in the country is not as prolific as it has been in the past due to various sensitivities but the material we have saved will allow for much research by whoever would like to become involved in a controlled way through the normal channels. Perhaps we should plan to show the DVD of the exhibition and monologues and interviews from 2014 on the 2nd Thursday of December at the Church Rooms at 7.30pm with some wine punch and mince pies. There will also be a meeting on Thursday 9th January when Alasdair Morrison will be talking about Military Organisation.

Hemyock Castle own the rights on the WW2 YouTube videos and the Kindle WW2 book and they can be accessed via the Castle web site with the following link www.hemyockcastle.uk/hem/ plus other stories including the late Bill Granger from Churchills and Eastlands building the platform on which the Japanese Generals offered Japan's surrender in Singapore in 1945. All proceeds from the sales of the Kindle WW2 book go to the Blackdown Support Group. And also Youtubechannel@richardsheppard1. If anyone has any memories or documents related to the end of WW2, both VE day and VJ day for the 80th anniversary next year, could they provide some of these memories to the History Group or to Hemyock Castle who are coordinating the anniversary next year.




On 8th December at 4pm the children in particular will thoroughly enjoy the Christingle service which is always a delight to them.

Clayhidon Parish Council October meeting

In the absence of the chair and vice chair Lee Saunders and Richard Drew, the chair was taken by Alison Weekes. Items raised by the public at the start of the meeting included the large number of road signs left behind by contractors in the parish, footpath clearance and road flooding at Lilycombe on the road to Brimley.

The council resolved that it had no objection to a planning application for the erection of a general purpose agricultural building at Parklands, Battle Street. Clayhidon.

District Councillor Simon Clist advised that Mid Devon had more than 600 enforcement issues and currently only one enforcement officer. He undertook to ascertain the position about Poachers Rest. Payments approved included £795.00 to Chris Houghton, £852.55 to the clerk. She reminded councillors the importance of authorising online payments. The council were told that a new village sign from the county council locality budget was in position.

The clerk said she would be meeting with Devon Communities Together to discuss the Hemyock Emergency Plan and this information would help with preparation of a Clayhidon Emergency Plan. A talk is being arranged for several Mid Devon parishes to talk about formulating a neighbourhood plan.

The clerk raised public consultations on the Devon Countywide Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan and the Devon and Torbay Local Transport Plan that sets out priorities to 2040. It was agreed Councillor Weekes should look at the information and comment at the next meeting.

Councillor Ray Radford's report had been circulated which raised the above mentioned consultations, the possibility of bringing Highways maintenance in house from 2027, and that the largest spend in the county budget was on adult and childrens social care. The district council report from Councillor Clist said Home England providing the funding for the Cullompton Relief Road would open up the Culm Valley Garden village and 5500 homes.

He reported more social housing was coming online, and on the campaign to encourage eligible pensioners to apply for pension credit following the cut in winter fuel payments. Recycling rates had increased again and there was a public consultation on the Blackdown Hills National Landscape management plan.

The council agreed to make up any funding shortfall in the purchase of a whacker for use in highway repairs in the parish after Highways only paid for a tamper. County Councillor Radford said he would

Councillor Weekes asked the clerk to ask for a meeting with Devon Wildlife Trust to discuss the Clayhidon Turbary which they hold on a long lease. The clerk was also asked to send a letter to to Taunton Vale hunt about using that land.

The chairman also asked the clerk to take up safety issues at the Ford Street crossing into Clayhidon. She said it gets ignored because it is the county and parish boundary.

Councillor King was concerned at the cost of broadband connection to Gigaclear given that all the lines were in place and that Airband also had lines in place.

The Clayhidon Charity

The Clayhidon Charity is looking for two volunteers to become trustees along with three parish councillors.

These three are Jamie Blackmore, Nick King and Richard Drew. Once the new trustees have come forward for the vacancies outlined in the constitution, an annual general meeting will be called which requires 21 days notice.

Clayhidon Parish Council November meeting

Lucy Ball of the Blackdown Support Group told the council of plans to buy a bungalow in Hemyock to create a new home for the charity. She said between 50 and 70 Clayhidon residents used the regular services of the support group with 29 accessing transport and 19 the lunch club. Mrs Ball mentioned the planned closure of Dunkeswell and Churchinford surgeries during afternoons from December and the charity are looking to expand their services and is working with Devon Community Trust to produce a business plan. Councillors expressed their support for a grant of financial support at the December meeting from the Clayhidon Charity.

The council resolved to support a planning application for a self build rural workers' dwelling on land at Higher Acre Ridge. An agent said the applicants had worked with MDDC to produce a modest dwelling that was sufficient for the needs of the agricultural smallholding. On another proposal for the erection of a reception/welfare building, enlargement of the toilet block improvement of the internal access track, provision of parking areas and a bird hide by the John Griss Charity, the council decided it should not comment as the parish council is the sole trustee of the charity.

The council noted prior approval was given for an agricultural storage building on land at Dunsgreen.

On finance the council agreed to pay an increase to the clerk following NALC recommendations. A grant request was received from CHAT which will be considered at the December meeting. Figures were discussed for the next precept for the parish and the clerk had worked figures for a 41% rise or a 10% rise. Reworked figures will be presented to the next meeting.

The clerk reported that the planned rollout of broadband in Clayhidon under the Connecting Devon and Somerset programme is now not going ahead. The Blackdown Hills Parish Network is one of the bodies protesting at another failure by CDS.

The clerk said she had met with Devon Communities Together to discuss the Hemyock Emergency Plan and would start work on the Clayhidon version with a view to a public meeting in the New Year. A talk is also being arranged for a possible Neighbourhood Plan in the New Year s well.

Councillor Weekes had considered both the Devon and Torbay Local Transport Plan that sets out priorities up to 2040, and the Devon Countywide Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan and reported neither had anything in them for Clayhidon. It was agreed she should complete the consultation papers on behalf of the council.

The council has use of a thermal imaging camera to show parishioners the heat loss from their homes and needs a volunteer to undertake the minimal training needed to use this. Clayhidon's parish lengthsman has purchased his own wacker to use in mending potholes. There was discussion on the lack of white lines at Clayhidon crossroads. The clerk was asked to find out if the parish council could paint lines or buy signs.

Councillor Radford had said the Neighbourhood Highways Officer would comment on how the situation at the Ford Street junction could be improved.

The council said it was happy with the proposed diversion of the FP8 at Smiths Farm.

Reflections From Rosemary Lane Chapel

o here it is... Christmas approaches once more, laden as it is for many, with excitement and anticipation. In this regard, I am a big kid, which will be well testified to by my family. My wife's eyes almost rolled out of her head when she discovered in early November that I had already tuned the car stereo to pick up the Christmas radio station. I promise you, as I promised her, it was just in preparation for the Christmas season, and I wouldn't listen to it before December. In a season so rich with sounds, sights and smells, our anticipation is only heightened for the day itself. Reminders are all around us! Some of those reminders have been filling the shops since September. And yet, for many others, this season, so rich in anticipation, is actually a time of sadness, despair and maybe even dread! It can be a time that only serves to highlight the people we miss in our gathering. It can be a time that makes more confusing the depression we feel. It can be a time when we find ourselves, already struggling, with pressures piling up.

I hope you'll forgive me. I'm not trying to sap the joy from this season of advent, far from it. But I am trying to acknowledge that amongst all the merry making, many people are struggling, both near and far.

Even those for whom this season remains rich in anticipation and excitement, there may still be a sense in which you know what it is to feel an emptiness, even a disappointment when the wrapping paper lies strewn on the floor and the celebrations are over. In truth, we realise that Christmas, and what we've made of it, doesn't deliver what we really long

for: A hope that doesn't diminish, even in the face of sadness, and a happiness, a joy that doesn't end.

"And this is the point for all of us, whether rich in anticipation, or struggling in despair, Christmas points us to God and the hope, joy, peace and love he longs for us to know through Jesus His Son."

Instead, and perhaps surprisingly, as the writer Jon Bloom reminds us, 'this is how our Christmas celebrations might actually serve us best: as pointers to, not providers of, lasting Joy.'

It is here, even in despair or disappointment, that we discover what God really longs for each of us to know this Christmas. Make no mistake, the gifts can be enjoyed, the food can be savoured and the songs sung... but as with the gift, let's not miss the point. The real treasure, the real joy, is not found in the gift but the giver of the gift. I remember one Christmas, many years ago, as a child, taking my pocket money into Argos with my big sister and using it to buy my dad a Helix Treasure Chest Money Box. I'm not entirely sure what made me determine this is what my dad needed, but even now, over 30 years later and looking slightly tatty, it is still sat on his bed side table. I'm going to make a suggestion that it is not because the present was precious to him, but rather the one who gave it. And this is the point for all of us, whether rich in anticipation, or struggling in despair, Christmas points us to God and the hope, joy, peace and love he longs for us to know through Jesus His Son.

When God sent his word to his people through the Prophet Isaiah, it was to a people struggling, a people who knew pain and distress and disappointment. It is a word of hope and peace and joy, and It is a word that finds all its fulfilment in Jesus Christ, the Messiah (Isaiah 9:2-3,6).


The people walking in darkness


