

birdsong and Blackdown Hills quiet.



### THE BLACKDOWN H LLS TRUST

The Blackdown Hills Trust is looking for local volunteers to help check stock fencing around the grazing units in the Neroche Forest area. These sites are managed by the Blackdown Hills Trust in the Blackdown Forest for grazing conservation : they are a magnet for rare butterflies such as Wood White and Duke of Burgundy and an array of plants, insects, birds and mammals. The areas are part of a Higher Level Stewardship and are grazed by English











#### What will the volunteer role involve?

The role will involve walking the stock fence twice a year during the spring and autumn in the grazing compartments to check for any rotten posts or damage to the wire, and reporting back to the Trust. There may also be opportunities to get involved in practical conservation

Full training will be provided for the role, including maps of the sites, appropriate contact information and information on what to look out for

#### **How Time Flies!**

I think as I get older the years seem to go past more quickly, and I suspect that I am not alone in that. Certainly 2025 seems to be going past very quickly indeed. Here we are already at the mid-point of the year, which this year ushers in one of the great turning points of the church year, beginning with what I think of as the 'Forgotten Festival.' Sunday 8th June is the festival of Pentecost, when God sent the Holy Spirit to the Apostles with what sounded like the roaring of a hurricane force wind, and the appearance of tongues of flame settling on the heads of each of the Apostles. When I was growing up Pentecost, or Whit Sunday as it was known, like Easter, had a Bank Holiday associated with it. In 1971 the government decided to replace that Bank Holiday with the Spring Bank Holiday which is always on the last Monday in May. So unless you are a churchgoer, Pentecost or Whit Sunday could pass you by completely unnoticed. Then the following Sunday, 15th June is Trinity Sunday, when we concentrate on the great mystery of God having revealed himself as three persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, yet remaining one single God. These two Sundays taken together form a particular turning point in the church year.

For more or less the first half of the year, up until Trinity Sunday (which is always somewhere between 17th May and 20th June) the church is concentrating on the major events in Jesus' life. We celebrate his birth in Bethlehem at Christmas, and his recognition as God's son by all of humanity, represented by the three Wise Men at Epiphany. We commemorate his death on the cross on Good Friday and we have the great celebration of his resurrection on Easter Sunday. Then finally we celebrate the fulfilment of the promise that God would send the Holy Spirit to the apostles at Pentecost. After Trinity Sunday our worship changes course to concentrate on what happened during the course of Jesus' preaching, teaching and healing ministry.

Each year we work our way through one of the first three gospels in turn. This year we are using St. Luke's gospel, and we look in detail each week at some particular incident or piece of teaching in Jesus ministry. In July, for instance we shall be looking mostly at teaching, either through parables, through the way people reacted to Jesus, or by his answers to the questions he was asked. In this way between Trinity Sunday and All Saints' day at the beginning of November we get a really comprehensive look at what Jesus did. The fact that each of the gospels we use was written for a different section of the society of the time, by evangelists who each had a different outlook on life, helps us to come to some understanding of how we might apply the lessons Jesus taught, in the situations we encounter in our 21st century society.

It could also be that the fact that we are in a vacancy is another of the factors which is making this year seem to disappear so rapidly - at least for me. A couple of days before I sat down to write this the Ministry Team were meeting with an agenda which included putting the names of musicians and service leaders into the blank slots in the August rota of services! We have to work well in advance because we rely mostly on retired clergy to take our communion services and their diaries fill up remarkably quickly. I have no doubt that by the time you are reading this we will have the September service rota well in hand. This year really does seem to be going past very quickly!

#### Lent Course at St Mary's

eading up to Easter this year, many of us from the Benefice met in Hemyock church rooms for supper and a bible study on Wednesday evenings. Numbers this year set a record! About thirty came the first evening on March 12th.

We met to discuss a Lent Course called Images of Grace. Based on the book by Amy Scott Robinson we discovered week by week key Christian concepts through biblical imagery. We all love a story and the first week we explored Jonah's narrative in the context of Lent. How Jonah, like us, has a human tendency to resist divine direction! However, the fascinating ordeal he went through and the eventual compliance highlight a journey to repentance, showing that even Nineveh was forgiven, even Jonah was pursued and even we are not beyond grace.

We went on in subsequent weeks to explore images of cleansing, protection, forgiveness, atonement and restoration. We found the themes deeply relatable as we can all feel shame, regret, longing and hope. In our small group discussions, we made sure all our different voices and opinions were heard and understood.

The book does not shy away from human weakness and we could say that "we are not alone in this". By the end of the four weeks, and ready for Holy week, we could see the gentleness and generosity of God's grace and were reassured of His unconditional love.

Sometimes, even many times, what seems like a complete mess in our lives, God can reach into the mess and begin His gentle work of cleansing, restoring and renewing.

Look out for "Summer walks" which we hope to arrange with a reflective theme and hopefully good weather!

Did you ever walk into a room and wonder what you went in there for? I'm glad it's not just me! Maybe we could learn a thing or two from Jonathan Hancock. At age 16, Hancock set the world record for memorising six shuffled packs of cards (312 cards in total). He went on to break the world record for memorising cards in the fastest time at two minutes and five seconds; and has authored books offering ways in which lesser mortals like you and I can learn to store and retrieve information in that oldest and most reliable of all computers, the brain.

Sadly, memory damage for some goes far beyond the frustration of forgetting names or shopping lists. So many of us have nursed a friend or relative whose mind is damaged by disease, and we know how painful that experience can be; and we can only begin to imagine the depth of despair felt by the sufferers themselves.

Yet there is another type of memory loss that's not often considered. When human beings forget their creator, we exhibit selfishness of the worst kind. Consider these words from the famous US President, Abraham Lincoln. In 1863, a National Day of Prayer and Fasting was called and the President himself wrote the official proclamation announcing it:

"We have been the recipients of the choicest bounties of heaven. We have been preserved these many years in peace and prosperity. We have grown in numbers, wealth and power as no other nation has ever grown. But we have forgotten God. We have vainly imagined, in the deceitfulness of our heart, that all these blessings were produced by some superior wisdom and virtue of our own. Intoxicated with unbroken success, we have become too self-sufficient to feel the necessity of redeeming and preserving grace, too proud to pray to the God that made us."

These words are surely just as relevant today, and serve as a timely reminder to us all... May we never be guilty of forgetting the things that truly matter. **Pastor Steve Williams**

# Former Tiverton School Staff Lunch Group Thriving

embers of staff of a former school in Tiverton are meeting each month for lunch in a different pub or restaurant for lunch - but there are still teachers and non-teaching colleagues that the group have been unable to contact. Can you help?

Tiverton School was created by the amalgamation of Tiverton Grammar School, Heathcoat Secondary School and Bampton Secondary Modern School in 1977 with an age-range of 13-18 (including a large sixth form). As Tiverton's first comprehensive school it operated as Tiverton's upper school in a three-tier system, being fed by pupils from five 9-13 middle schools; the youngest pupils attended first schools (5-9) until 1992, when the area changed from its three-tier, middle school system back to the current two-tier primary/secondary system and Tiverton School became Tiverton High School with its 11-16 age range.

The group, which includes non-teaching colleagues as well as teachers from Tiverton School and its predecessor schools, has almost forty members, mostly living locally but some travel greater distances to attend. The day the group meets rotates each month to enable everyone to attend whenever they can.

Most of the living former staff have been invited but the group, which includes teaching, support, administrative and premises staff, is still trying to locate these colleagues (and maybe others) if they are still alive:

The Violet Chapman Charity (Charity registration number 299996) was established in 1986 after Mrs Violet Chapman, who was a patient of the Blackdown Practice, gave a substantial gift to the doctors, which was intended to provide patients with services and help that were not available under the NHS.

The original Trustees were Dr Jonathan Meads, Mrs Chapman and Sir Christopher who, at that time, was senior partner with Ashfords Solicitors and one time president of the Law Society. The Trustees were, at this time, all volunteers not drawing any salary or expenses, and this remains the case to date.

The Trust has discretion to give grants for medical equipment and treatments as well as giving financial assistance to patients of the Blackdown Practice for numerous purposes.

All grants are given for the physical and mental wellbeing of the patients, and many will gain support by the help the Trust gives in supplying counselling where the NHS is unable to supply.

There are many examples that we could give of the patients we have helped recently and would cite one that required

their bathroom to be modernised to enable them to continue to live at home; another patient who needed a chair that would help them in getting in and out without assistance. Another example is a patient who had severe back pain and a grant was given for them to have remedial massage.

If you feel the Trust can help you we would suggest you talk to your GP or any person who gives you support and submit an Application form which can be found online or pick one up from any of the Blackdown Practice surgeries. #### **Mavis Clist**

Mavis was born in Plymouth on March 10th, 1932. Her father passed away when she was only 7 years old. When she was 11, after sheltering from a sustained German bombing raid, the family emerged from the air raid shelter, only to find that their house had been obliterated, but they found the family cat sitting on top of the rubble!

Mavis was then reallocated with her 2 brothers, sister and her mother and yes, the family cat as well to Saltash to stay with a friend. The family then had to move to Cullompton to stay with relatives. Mavis had to change schools as well. She attended Tiverton Grammar School and from there went to Bath teacher training school for 3 years.

After qualifying as a teacher, her first job was at Hemyock Primary School in 1952. For a while, she caught the bus from Cullompton to Hemyock, then found accommodation in Hemyock. The house was called Ingledale, Culmstock Road.

She met Brian through the Headmaster, Mr Jack Reed, who was conducting a farm project with her class. Mavis famously told him that she knew nothing of farming and Mr Reed's reply was that he knew of a gentleman who did! Romance blossomed, and both got married in 1956. Their love lasted for 63 years until Brian's death in 2019. They had 2 sons, Simon who was born in 1962 and then in 1964, Julian was born. Both sons got married and Brian and Mavis became grandparents, and Mavis became a great grandmother as Alex's wife, Suzy, had a son called Arthur.

Mavis and Brian shared similar interests such as classical music, French holidays, second hand bookshops, antique shops and also quiz shows (which there was a lot of competition between them). After a short maternity break, Mavis went back as a supply teacher at Burlescombe, Culmstock, Broadhembury and Hemyock. She would give the children a good start with their education and also gave extra tuition, either in their homes or at Mountshayne, where she lived. Mavis made many friends through her teaching as well. Mavis would also teach on a Saturday morning at the Methodist Sunday school and was very popular with the children. She attended Church on a regular basis, first at the Methodist and when it closed at St Mary's Church. Mavis was a member of the Friends of St Mary's Church for many years and also on the Parochial Church Council. Mavis, for a while was in charge of decorating the Church with flowers and would do a display near the pulpit, this would keep her until late evening much to Brian's dismay! She also crocheted some of the Church kneelers. Due to her occupation, she was also a Governor on the Primary School Council. Mavis and Brian were also regular visitors to France in the early days of the twinning.

In 2009, family noticed that Mavis was not keeping up with conversations and she was diagnosed with vascular dementia, a couple of years later. Unfortunately, she became worse, and on May 6th, 2025, after battling with this condition for 16 years Mavis eventually succumbed to this awful condition. Fortunately, Mavis was able to stay at home with her family around her and also with carers

#### Helen Mary Tarr

Mary was born on the 26th of November 1928, in The Globe Inn, Appley, to Bertha and Charles Enticott, who ran the local pub. Life in those early years was very different from today—there was no electricity, indoor plumbing, or modern conveniences. The family relied on oil lamps, candles, and outside toilets. By the time she was 10, Mary had two sisters, Jean and Peggy, and a brother, Gilbert. She attended Stawley School and was an active member of the

Baptist Sunday School, where she excelled and received many awards for her efforts.

In her teenage years, Mary's family grew with the addition of two more brothers, John and Tim. She was an avid reader, often escaping the hubbub to lose herself in a book. She was also passionate about puzzles and quizzes, and loved learning poetry—her favourite being The Brook. A bright student, she passed the 11+ exam and earned a place at Bishop Fox's Grammar School in Taunton. Since there was no public transport from Appley, she lodged with a butcher in Rockwell Green, though she hated it and was homesick. This experience led her to give up the opportunity and instead attend Courtland Road School in Wellington, where she thrived and became Head Girl.

When she was 14, Mary had secured a teaching position at a local primary school, but this had to be put on hold when her mother needed a major operation. Mary stepped in to help care for her younger brothers, and her sister Jean, who was just a year younger, took on the teaching role. Despite the challenges, Mary found time to enjoy socializing, singing, and acting at the local youth club. She also loved dancing, particularly jitterbugging, and cycled to many of these events. She made lots of friends when she served in the pub – local customers, paying guests, refugees, and even American soldiers stationed nearby.

At the age of 16, Mary joined the Women's Institute, where she was chosen to represent the Appley group at the Albert Hall. This experience was a magical time for her, as she stayed with family friends in London, visiting the famous sights and experiencing the excitement of the city.

During Mary's teenage years she fell for Gerald, who she had known all of her life, although, she hadn't been keen on him at school. Mary's Mum definitely did not approve and according to her auntie Beat he was "too good looking for his own good"! Gerald, keen to fight for his country, enlisted to fight in World War II. During his absence Mary nearly lost her life to an eye infection that turned into sepsis. Without antibiotics, her treatment consisted of bed rest and hot poultices, but she recovered, much to the relief of her family. When Gerald returned from the war, they cemented their love and married in May 1947 at Stawley Church. Mary made her own wedding blouse using a parachute that Gerald had brought home from the war. The community came together, contributing their rations for the wedding cake. Mary finished serving behind the bar, then went off to be married and enjoyed a reception at Stawley School; and in November their pride and joy, Mike was born!

In the early years of their marriage, life was a struggle, but through hard work and perseverance, they were able to improve their circumstances. Gerald changed jobs, they moved house and became more established, even manging to invest in a motor Bike and sidecar, Mike as a young boy used to ride pillion whilst Mary was in the sidecar.

Mary was an extraordinary mother who made birthdays and holidays special for her children. Mike's birthday always coincided with Bonfire Night celebrations and Christmas was always filled with magic, with an unforgettable large family gathering at The Globe Inn.

In 1960, the family purchased their first black-and-white television, and Mary enjoyed watching The Forsythe Saga. Mary worked hard, even taking on additional jobs at Cothay Manor, so that Caroline could attend St Joseph's Convent to ensure she passed her 11+ exams. At this time Michael joined an engineering firm as an accomplished draftsman, where he met Susan, and they later went on to marry in 1969.

Mary always helped her Mum in the pub, cleaning every Tuesday until Caroline started school when Mary became the School Secretary which she did for 15 years. Mary passed her driving test, and the family invested in a new car from Stan 'Happy' Doble in Hemyock, a mini! Which then allowed them to take the children on family holidays to Cornwall.

All Mary and Gerald's hard work paid off in 1970 when their dream came true, they could afford a mortgage on a bungalow next to the Globe, it had a beautiful garden, storage heating and a telephone! In 1977, Caroline married George, and Mary poured her heart into making their wedding day special, including sewing the beautiful bridesmaids' dresses with care.

Mary's 50s were a happy and fulfilling time, she found her ideal job as a practice manager at Wiveliscombe Surgery. She enjoyed being part of the team, interacting with the patients and was very interested in the pharmacy, an interest and curiosity that continued with her own medications for the rest of her life.

She liked socialising, dressing up and going to hunt balls with friends and dancing the last waltz with Gerald to Englebert Humperdink.

Mary and Gerald had some good holidays with John and Kathy and Jean and Judy, often in Bournemouth.

Four grandchildren came along, Michael and Susan had Joanna and Luke and Caroline and George had Andy and Ross. Mary was absolutely delighted with this, as she loved cuddling babies and playing with children.

In 1990 Caroline had Lorna, by this time Mary and Gerald had retired; they loved looking after them all.

They went on family holidays to the Isle of Wight, where Mary, much to the grand children's delight, won the glamorous Granny competition at the holiday club. Mary and Gerald had never been on an aeroplane, so Caroline and George took them to Portugal, they had a lovely time and really enjoyed the adventure.

In 1997 Mary and Gerald celebrated their golden wedding anniversary, with a family get together and meal at Churchills and they were lucky enough to be chosen to go to a garden party at

Buckingham Palace hosted by the Queen and Pince Phillip, who also had been married 50 years.

Mary and Gerald moved to a bungalow in Rockwell Green, it was adjoining Jean and Judy's, they spent some lovely times together, but Gerald's health started to fail, and he passed away in 2006, Mary had looked after him and was devoted throughout. In 2008 there was another tragedy when Mary lost her lovely Lorna.

However, Mary summoned up strength and fought for her independence. She bought her own little automatic car to drive into Wellington were she started volunteering for the Red Cross.

Mary enjoyed a roast every Sunday at Churchills with Gran Pinder also joining in on some Sundays; they liked to chat about old times and the grandchildren. Gran Pinder lived in Hemyock and was always telling Mary about all the excellent things on offer and eventually, at 86, Mary decided to buy a bungalow in Castle Park.

She loved her bungalow, and had some very happy times in Hemyock, she went to the luncheon clubs, tea clubs, the Brightside, the Acorns and loved seeing Caroline in the annual pantomime after she helped her to learn her lines, right up until she was 95! She enjoyed meals out with Peggy, Margaret and Caroline often calling in on Jean and Judy.

At 88, Mary fell in the garden and broke her hip, she recovered, but her mobility was never quite the same. She bought a smart television and an ipad and went to IT classes. Mary cherished the time spent with her great-grandchildren, Luke and Sophie were blessed with Alfie and Arthur and Ross and Kirsty with Harry and Martha. Mary was delighted to have her bungalow filled with children's laughter and more baby cuddles.

Now in her 90s, Mary was most comfortable at home in her bungalow. Kirsty and Ross had another little boy, Rupert and Rach and Andy were blessed to have Orla and Rory, all bringing Mary much joy at another tragic time as her beloved Jo passed away. To outlive both of her beautiful, talented and clever granddaughters was one of the saddest things in her life. But Mary was truly grateful for all her blessings especially her devoted family, she thought she was so lucky to have a lovely home, carers, gardeners, friends and neighbours. She spent her last few weeks at the Hummingbird care home, where she was very well looked after and pampered, made a few more friends and even took her ipad to face time and message Caroline!

Mary was a remarkable woman seeing so many changes in her lifetime. She had a strong determination, a lovely smile and a wicked sense of humour; she was a devoted, wife, mother, granny and great granny. She loved a sherry and would always try to persuade visitors to join her, so "cheers" Mary you will be greatly missed!

On a personal note - many thanks to all those who continue to donate goods to crzee. The charity continues to take humanitarian aid to Ukraine and Moldova. Hugh, a trustee, who many may remember has recently made another visit to both countries to ensue all we send is exactly what the people need.

#### **Hemyock History Group**

ur speaker at our April meeting, which is always the second Thursday of the month, was Alasdair Morrison who has lived at Culm Davy for many years while travelling the world on the King's business providing legal advice to the King's representatives in a variety of troublespots.

Some of us may remember Blackadder's court martial for the shooting of General Melchett's pet pigeon "speckled Jim" or Rumpole of the Bailey appearing for the defence in a court martial in Germany, but very few would have been aware of what Alasdair got up to out in Hong Kong when Thatcher handed over one of our Empire's gems to the Chinese. Luckily she had none of the negotiating skills of a certain Mr Trump. That was handled by a certain Major Morrison. The journey to these illustrious heights started when he found himself very much a junior graduate apprentice in a rural solicitor's office in Scotland when the attraction of travelling the world on important secret missions in far flung corners of the Empire had its allure. In those days the USA was a close ally and so one of the training establishments he attended was Charlottesville, Virginia followed quickly by the centre of Nato activities at Bielefeld in Germany, a place whispered about in military circles. As a new member of the Army Legal Corps Alasdair had to direct hot headed Commanding Officers in the intricacies of Military Law with a General influencing matters every step of the way. When the people you are dealing with appear at meetings with rifles slung over their shoulders things can get quite scary. Think of the troubles in Northern Ireland and serving one's country in Afghanistan, protected by a little card stating the Rules of Engagement. A solitary soldier, who has no idea how many guns are pointing at him from the bush will, you can be assured, always check that little yellow card before he takes action. And if any gun is fired someone from the ALC will hotfoot it from HQ to be at the side of the soldier as he is being interviewed by the civilian police or the local Taliban. Of course more mundane legal matters were handled by the Divorces for the Forces group.

Conversations with Alasdair can be fascinating since he is restricted in stating the facts of a case he has been involved with, so one has to imagine a scenario that we have all read about and add suitable names and places that fits his story.

Robert Garrett was the speaker at our May meeting when he brought a number of historic pottery pieces on which he gave a wonderful talk about the different types of pot style with a variety of decoration. As we all know, the pottery industry, which has always been very strong in this area, is under great pressure nationally. We have had large scale pottery production from mediaeval times right through to the present with Honiton pottery, on which Robert gave many examples. Emma Bridgewater, queen of pottery is publicly warning about the plight of this industry at present with companies ceasing operations and laying off staff. Robert also warned about the future of such production companies.

We have recently been involved in the VE celebrations during which we had displays of WW2 memorabilia at Hemyock Castle and St Mary's on Bank Holiday Monday plus on VE day itself, the Thursday 8th May. We have in our collection the photocopied A4 booklet entitled Recollections of 1939 to 1945 produced by Margaret and Richard Shepard some time ago. To coincide with this year's 8oth celebration of VE day Richard and Margaret have produced, under Amazon auspices, a glossy version of their book with added stories of those war years, from local Upper Culm Valley families. This book is available as a Kindle Version, normally £3.99 and the new paperback Version at £11.99 with a web site offer at https://www.amazon.co.uk/dp/B071783LLK.



#### **LEAP News**

he year is marching on and the Longmead environmental area is lush with grass. The trees are almost in full leaf, some are in • flower including the eating and cooking apples which promise a good crop come the autumn. In the raised beds there are broad beans, onions and beetroot, and we recently planted chard and black kale for later in the year. There will be a great crop of black currants for the jam  $makers, and \ a \ few \ strawberries \ for \ picking \ as \ they \ ripen. \ Rhubarb \ can \ be$ harvested until July and there are plenty of herbs ready now.

Over the last few months we have been fortunate to have volunteers who have continued to look after and improve the area. A great show of donated spring bulbs cheered up the drab days of February and March. A second dry hedge has been created to take prunings from the fruiting hedges, coppiced willow and established trees. Hopefully, the dry hedges will become wildlife habitats - we have already seen our first wren's nest within the dry branches. The pond was overflowing with flood water in January, and then full of frogspawn in March. It survived despite the cold weather that froze the pond water to a depth. Now we have had drought over the last six weeks, and the pond is looking grassy- it will not fill again until we have a flood when St Margaret's Brook will burst its banks.

The vagaries of our current climate make all growing very uncertain. Pity the poor farmers who must make a living from it, and the wildlife that has no option but to cope with it.

You may be a little disconcerted by the swathes of nettles in the area, but nettles are good for wildlife. Stinging nettles are great wildlife attractors: caterpillars of the small tortoiseshell and peacock butterflies use them as foodplants; ladybirds feast on the aphids that shelter among them; and seed-eating birds enjoy their autumn spoils. During WW2, nettles were collected to be used as natural dark green dye to camouflage cloth, and the long stalks can be 'retted' and used to make a fibrous string that can be plaited or spun to make twine and cloth. Nettles are a good source of vitamin C and B and make a nutritious tea. Let's hear it for the humble nettle!

Unfortunately the area has been subjected to increased littering and some vandalism. This has resulted in us needing to repair the compost bin and the insect house, and remove the corrugated iron that was used to provide an habitat for slow worms. Thanks goes to our great volunteers who helped to tidy up and repair the damage.

On a brighter note, many people donated plants such as sedums and stonecrops to make a living roof for the insect house. They are becoming established, and the good news is that we have a few insect residents, including some red tailed bumble bees. They made their presence felt when we tried to repair the side of the roof. They didn't like being disturbed and we had to make a sharp

We are always looking for extra volunteers and if you feel that you would like to take part, or even lead the project, it would be great to have your input. The area has great potential to be a sanctuary, to enhance the local wildlife and give pleasure to the locals who visit it to get a breath of fresh air, picnic or walk the dog.

#### **Reflections From Rosemary Lane Chapel**

hese days we see far less of our postman than we used to. Most of our communication has shifted to 'paperless'. When post does come through the door it is often 'junk mail'. But very occasionally, we encounter a sense of excitement when, there on the doormat, we see a letter with a handwritten address on the envelope. I'm sure I'm not alone in this. These letters stand out from the junk and the franked mail that often pours through our doors. And the reason these handwritten envelopes and letters spark such curiosity and excitement is that it is likely from someone we know, someone with whom we have a relationship. Not only this, but in a world of instantaneous communication, there is often some great encouragement when we consider how someone has taken the time to convey to us a message in this way.

I was struck by this when I considered the context to the Apostle Paul's first letter to the church Thessalonica. Paul, Silas and Timothy had spent time in Thessalonica sharing the gospel – the good news of Jesus Christ who offers us forgiveness, freedom and life through His own death and resurrection. Many received this good news for what it was, the word of God and the revealing of His heart for them. A church formed in that place, but much sooner than they would have liked, because of persecution, Paul and Silas were forced to flee Thessalonica by night. This left Paul distressed. There was more he wanted to tell them about Jesus. He wanted to encourage and strengthen them in their faith. Instead, with sadness, Paul was left wondering how these new believers were getting on.

Eventually, his desire to know how they were, could be abated no longer. He sent Timothy, his friend and co-worker, back the Thessalonica to find out how they were coping. Despite the pressure and the persecution in Thessalonica, Timothy finds a church thriving as they continue to trust in Jesus and love one another. This news, when it finally reaches Paul, causes him such delight. He is so overjoyed that he writes a letter to them, not only expressing his thankfulness to God for the news he has received, but now sharing with them some of the things he most wanted to tell them about their faith in God through Jesus Christ.

This is the basis for Paul's writing this letter: His love for these people and a desire to encourage them in the Lord. Paul takes the time to put these things in writing and send them with a messenger to be read out among the believers in Thessalonica. Knowing this, these words come to life in new ways. Even more so when we consider how these words are God inspired. In other words, this isn't only Paul's heart for the church, this is God's heart for the church. We realise that this Word is a word that speaks to us today; God's letter to us revealing His heart for the church today. I wonder whether you've ever considered the Bible in this way?

Like a letter, it is a word for you. A word in which God reveals to us who He is, and His deepest heart for us. When we think about it like this, maybe it will change the way we see this word. Consider then, these words of deep joy, love and affection in Paul's letter. Consider how they are not only an expression of Paul's heart, but of God's heart also (1 Thessalonians 2:7-8,11-12):

Just as a nursing mother cares for her children, so we cared for you.

Because we loved you so much, we were delighted to share with you not only the gospel of God but our lives as well...

For you know that we dealt with each of you as a father deals with his own children, encouraging, comforting and urging you to live lives worthy of God, who calls you into his kingdom and glory.

These words are rich in love. They speak of the love that Paul had for the Thessalonians. Moreover they reveal God's love for you and me, the God who longs to call us into his Kingdom through His Son, Jesus

Where am I heading with this? Simply put, the Bible is much more than just a collection of writings, it is God's letter to us, the revealing of who He is, and His heart for you and for me. May this thought take a hold of us and cause us to open this Word with a sense of anticipation to discover what's inside. I pray we would find this Word becomes to us what it was to the Psalmist (Psalm 119:105):

Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path.
