THE BLACKDOWN H LLS TRUST

The Blackdown Hills Trust is looking for local volunteers to help check stock fencing around the grazing units in the Neroche Forest area. These sites are managed by the Blackdown Hills Trust in the Blackdown Forest for grazing conservation : they are a magnet for rare butterflies such as Wood White and Duke of Burgundy and an array of plants, insects, birds and mammals. The areas are part of a Higher Level Stewardship and are grazed by English Longhorn cattle in the summer months

What will the volunteer role involve?

The role will involve walking the stock fence twice a year during the spring and autumn in the grazing compartments to check for any rotten posts or damage to the wire, and reporting back to the Trust. There may also be opportunities to get involved in practical conservation work, for example clearing conifer re-growth to allow native flora to thrive

Full training will be provided for the role, including maps of the sites, appropriate contact information and information on what to look out for





Your Prayers Would Be Welcome

The Church of England has come in for a lot of criticism in recent years, not least for its mishandling of cases where people with authority within the Church have abused their privileged position to the detriment of the wellbeing of vulnerable people, both children and adults. Despite these headline-grabbing occurrences, most ordinary members of the Church are simply doing their best to follow the teachings of Jesus, striving to love God and to love their neighbours, and we all share a sense of sadness when the good work that is done in communities up and down the land is eclipsed by such sensational and damaging revelations.

One of the prime purposes of the C of E is to offer a presence in every community in England. It is hard to miss the ancient Church buildings in Clayhidon, Culmstock and Hemyock, but the Church is more than the buildings. It is the body of people who come together regularly for worship and witness. That is particularly so when our Churches are, as at the present time, without a vicar (or more properly, a rector) – an ordained minister who provides leadership to the Christian community, and is available to support people within our parishes in times of crisis or difficulty, or to share in joyous occasions such as weddings and christenings.

For anyone who is anxious that there should be a vicar to lead and sustain our Churches there is some good news. The vacant post has been advertised and, God willing, we hope to be in a position to appoint a new incumbent before the end of August, although it is likely to be several more months before an appointee can be expected to take up the role.

It is now six months since our last Rector, Revd Becky, retired but, despite the absence of a clergyperson in Hemyock Rectory, the pattern of worship, pastoral care and spiritual development has been maintained by a group of amazing retired clergy and a host of lay members of our Church communities.

At this critical time, I invite all people of goodwill to join with us in our prayers that someone will feel drawn to minister within these communities, and that those who are charged with selecting and appointing our next Rector are given the wisdom and discernment to choose the right person for the job. I hope that the next time this magazine is published we will be able to tell you who that person is!

As another academic year concludes, I'm reminded that those turbulent, growing years are often a vital time for change. Opinions are formed, attitudes are shaped and directions for life are set.

A group of students chose to spend a gap year working in a Third World country. The purpose of their time abroad was not sightseeing or lazing on a beach in the sun. These British students had chosen to work with a development team based in a large slum in an Asian city. They were teaching in a makeshift school, manning a creche, assisting in developing cottage industries and helping to build a safe house for children who would otherwise live rough on the streets. They earned no wage for their efforts. On the contrary, they had needed to raise money to cover their fares and living costs from friends and family here at home. They were asked what they had gained from the learning experience thus far. "Getting a new set of values," said one. "Realizing how much you get back when you give," said another. "The sense of belonging in a team," said a third.

It wasn't all plain sailing for them. Homesickness, adjusting to the inevitable culture shock and learning some hard truths through living in close proximity to others were just a few of the tough lessons they had. But none regretted the decision to spend time abroad; they recognized that the experience would live with them for years to come. You couldn't meet a livelier crowd, full of noise and laughter. In a few years they will be bankers, teachers, engineers and nurses, with a growing family and a mortgage. But for now, some vital learning years are being invested in building character and responsibility. They will never be the same again. At least, I sincerely hope not.

All this reminded me of the parable of the good Samaritan - how loving our neighbour means looking beyond the colour of people's skin and their social status. Jesus concluded the famous parable with the words, "Go and do likewise" (Luke 10:37). It's both refreshing and humbling to realise that to this day, some people are doing exactly that. 

Hemyock Parish Council update

Our Annual Parish Meeting was held on 14th May at Longmead, it was great to see a good turnout of residents and local organisations and groups. Our Chair, Paul Doble gave an update on what the Council has achieved in the past year such as starting the extension of the cemetery, the flood cameras installed at Culmbridge and on the footbridge by the old milk factory. He also outlined projects which we aim to support over the coming months, such as the new Primary school playground, extending the carpark at Longmead, continuing to support the Community Larder, as well as outlining our long term goals such as protecting our assets for example the Blackdown Healthy Living Centre and Longmead. Councillor Doble then made presentations to the following residents on behalf of the Council::

Ian Pike for his work maintaining the village and the cemetery, Andy Brooke for his work on the Longmead Committee and refurbishing the pavilion, Peta Dayus-Jones for her work at the Blackdown Healthy Living and Activity Centre and Penny Lawrence for her outstanding service as a member of the Parish Council for many years, her wealth of knowledge of both parish council matters and the history of the village will be sorely missed. Each received a voucher for the Catherine Wheel which supports local businesses.

We were grateful to Councillor Natasha Bradshaw who addressed our meeting on Climate Change and Biodiversity Net Gain within the Mid Devon area and the plans for the future, with Mid Devon District Council aiming to be at net zero by 2030. Councillor Bradshaw outlined the Council's strategies over the next few years to include Land space, Renewable energy, Carbon footprint, how MDDC is contributing to climate change, what actions could be taken to mitigate that contribution and how MDDC can adapt to climate change and become more resilient. Councillor Bradshaw's presentation is available on the Parish Council website.

We were also addressed by some of the groups and organisations of the Parish, such as Hemyock Primary School PFTA, Hemyock Tennis Club, the Youth Football Club, Longmead Environmental Area and the Community Speedwatch Group.

The Violet Chapman Trust

The Violet Chapman Charity (Charity registration number 299996) was established in 1986 after Mrs Violet Chapman, who was a patient of the Blackdown Practice, gave a substantial gift to the doctors, which was intended to provide patients with services and help that were not available under the NHS.

The original Trustees were Dr Jonathan Meads, Mrs Chapman and Sir Christopher who, at that time, was senior partner with Ashfords Solicitors and one time president of the Law Society. The Trustees were, at this time, all volunteers not drawing any salary or expenses, and this remains the case to date.

The Trust has discretion to give grants for medical equipment and treatments as well as giving financial assistance to patients of the Blackdown Practice for numerous purposes.

All grants are given for the physical and mental wellbeing of the patients, and many will gain support by the help the Trust gives in supplying counselling where the NHS is unable to supply.

There are many examples that we could give of the patients we have helped recently and would cite one that required

their bathroom to be modernised to enable them to continue to live at home; another patient who needed a chair that would help them in getting in and out without assistance. Another example is a patient who had severe back pain and a grant was given for them to have remedial massage.

If you feel the Trust can help you we would suggest you talk to your GP or any person who gives you support and submit an Application form which can be found online or pick one up from any of the Blackdown Practice surgeries. The Trustees are only too happy to consider any applications. Alternatively for more details please contact the secretary, Mrs Judy Barton on 01823 680975 or j.h.barton@hotmail.com.

Reflections From Rosemary Lane Chapel

ave you ever had one of those days? The ones when you had hoped for so much and yet come the end of it all, you felt that tinge of disappointment. With a weekend of wonderful weather in store we had grand plans to enjoy some time together as a family, but as the temperatures crept ever higher, we decided to stay put. Our weekend promised so much, and yet all we were left with was a living room that looked like a stampede of wildebeest had made their way through. We love them immensely, but four kids will do that. No great trials filled the day, and yet, come the end of it all, 'singing to God' as the Bible invites us to do, felt a bit beyond us.

But then, as the day drew to a close I opened my Bible and read Psalm 68:4-6, it felt like that much longed for refreshing cool breeze at the end of a hot day. And it starts with this glorious invitation to sing to God:

"Sing to God, sing praises to His name; extol Him who rides on the clouds—His name is the Lord—and rejoice before Him."

What an image we are presented with! This will stir the heart and the soul! God rides on the clouds! It's not God stuck in a dusty church hall, or even just sitting patiently on a throne. This is God on the move, dynamic, majestic, untamed. I remember once, after a long and tiring drive up to Scotland in scorching temperatures, we reached the Kintyre Peninsular where the weather suddenly and dramatically changed. Thick dark clouds gathered quickly and rain soon belted down against the car windscreen. But then, just as suddenly as the clouds appeared, they parted and a great shaft of light shone through upon the mountains. Sky and scenery, in one moment, spoke in unison. It was awesome. And for a split second, I didn't just think about God's majesty, I felt it. A tiny, unbidden moment of praise escaped our lips, not because we were trying to be spiritual, but because something in us just knew that the God who painted that sky was utterly beyond our weariness.

Just when you're ready to bow down in wonder, Psalm 68 pivots, beautifully and tenderly and gives us a another captivating picture of God:

"A father to the fatherless, a defender of widows, is God in His holy dwelling."

This isn't just the God of cosmic power; this is the God who notices the unnoticed, who cares for the forgotten and the frustrated.

And then this, listen to these words of King David in Psalm 68:

"God sets the lonely in families, He leads out the prisoners with singing; but the rebellious live in a sun-scorched land."

This is the God of belonging. The God who knows that our deepest human need, after air and water, is community. We each know seasons of profound loneliness, even surrounded by people. It's a strange, aching kind of isolation. But it is God's deepest heart for us, in our loneliness and isolation, to "set us in families" - not just biological ones, but spiritual ones. Moving to the Blackdown Hills as a teenager felt like a move into loneliness, but then, first at Newhouse and then at Rosemary Lane Chapel, God set me in a family. His family. A place of belonging. Community.

Then, David tells us that this tender-hearted God who sets the lonely in families leads out the prisoners with singing. This isn't just about literal jail cells. This is about the prisons of addiction, despair, comparison, fear, failure. Many times over I have heard the testimony of people who were utterly bound, trapped in cycles of self-destruction, suddenly find freedom. And when they do, it's not a quiet, dignified exit. It's a burst of joy, a song, a celebration. The alternative, the "sun-scorched land" of rebellion, is just that - a dry, desolate place where self-reliance ultimately leaves you parched.

So, this Psalm that I read at the end of a day that had left me feeling weary and worn, is an invitation to remember that the God who rides on the clouds, the majestic, untamed Creator, is also the tender Father, the defender of the vulnerable, the one who longs to set you in a family and lead you out of whatever prison holds you captive. And for that, even on the wildebeest-stampede days, we can surely find a song.
