Planning

All plans were carefully inspected and discussed before decisions were reached. 09/00967/HRN – Hedgerow removal notice for removal of 27 metres of hedge – land at NGR 313136 113327 Culmstock Road, Hemyock.

Mr.P.Steed declared an interest and left the room; following a discussion it was proposed by Mr.Hart seconded by Mr.Edwards that approval be recommended – all agreed.

09/00469/FULL – Use of land and buildings for the breeding of horses with ancillary livery and erection of stables/equestrian building – Sycamore Farm, Hemyock. Mr.Brooke declared an interest and left the room. After a further discussion of this application (it was revised from an earlier date) it was proposed by Mr.Steed, seconded by Mr.Edwards that approval be recommended, all agreed.

09/00994/FULL – Erection of extension to farmhouse with associated groundworks and extension to holiday let barn with internal alterations at Luggs, Culm Davy. It was proposed by Mr.Povah, seconded by Mr.Hart that approval be recommended – all agreed.

Risk Assessments

Each risk assessment was discussed and was amended as necessary. It was decided to get a sign for Millhayes Bridge saying "Danger deep Water". Mrs.Stallard to speak to Lesley Smith at DAPC to discuss statutory records.

Seats

Following a discussion about the state of the seat on the Byes Road it was decided to ask Robin Porch to give us a quote for repairing, as necessary, and treating all the seats around the parish.

Clerk to contact Mr. John Bendall to ask his permission to cut back the hedge around the seat on the Byes Road.
