There was concern that unless the area around the drains is cleared, the drains will silt up again - cars are parking on the grass area, churning up the ground, and the consequent mud is being washed into the drains. It was suggested that nothing is done until a permanent solution is found with regard to the surface around the containers, overflow car park and grass area. An alternative solution was put forward: to erect a temporary wooden post and rail fence around the grass area and down one side of the overflow car park preventing cars from parking on the grass and preventing cars from being able to drive around in circles in the overflow car park. Fencing would ensure only one way in and out of the overflow car park. The drains could then be cleared. A separate project may then be considered next year to resolve the problem permanently. Three quotations had been sought but only one was received. PROPOSAL: A temporary post and rail fence is erected to close off the grass area and fence along the east edge of overflow car park creating one way in and out. The drains to be cleared.
